imit. Higher cash fed cattle trade also helped to suppor Live Cattle prices and this also spilled over into the Feeder pit as well. Same as above, two days off the botom does not make a bottom, but for those looking fo higher prices, this was a very good start. This wee
hould tell more about the strength in this market. hould tell more about the strength in this market. Soybean prices collapsed with the rest of the grain
complex on Friday. It wasn't the acres report which hocked the grains, but the ending stocks which wer raised across the board. The grains basically all fed on the negative stocks numbers and the whole comple basically fell apart. Technically, soybeans remain locke n a six month trading range and prices are still far
Corn prices closed down their 40 cent limit on th nearby contracts on Friday. The USDA Planting Intention's report shocked most traders when the USD raised ending stocks on all the grain. Acres came in righ in line with pre report expectations at 97.3 million acres The shift in ending stocks shocked all the grains and be any long term impact. Prices are expected to fall fur ther, but corn usually drops each year after this repor Not too unexpected.
Wheat prices also dropped about 40 cents on Friday also due to a surprising increase in the ending stocks. didn't seem to matter which part of the grain secto
traders had been focused on as ending stocks saw a sub stantial increase across the board. It may take a fe more days to digest and probably a few more days to really give the market direction. For now, both short an long term trends remain lower.
Cotton prices initially tried to rally before comin under a little pressure. This market has already hit major resistance level around the $\$ 88.80$ area basis th
December contract. This market will need to breakou above this level if prices are going to move higher. I really makes no difference whether prices breakout thi week or next month. This level is has seen strong sellins pressure.
