

# **Notice of Public Hearing on Tax Increase**

The City of Farwell will hold two public hearings on a proposal to increase total tax revenues from properties on the tax roll in the preceding tax year by 8.951079 percent (percentage by which proposed tax rate exceeds lower of rollback tax rate or effective tax calculated under Chapter 26, Tax Code). Your individual taxes may increase at a greater or lesser rate, or even decrease, depending on the change in the taxable value of your property in relation to the change in taxable value of all other property and the tax rate that is adopted.

The first public hearing will be held on September 6, 2011 at 5:30 PM at Farwell City Hall.

The second public hearing will be held on September 20, 2011 at 5:30 PM at Farwell City Hall.

The members of the governing body voted on the proposal to consider the tax increase as follows:

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in City of Farwell last year was \$61,216. Based on last year's tax rate of \$0.510000 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed last year on the average home was \$312.20.


The average taxable value of a residence homestead in City of Farwell this year is \$63,913. If the governing body adopts the effective tax rate for this year of \$0.468100 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$299.18.

If the governing body adopts the proposed tax rate of \$0.510000 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$325.96.

## Steer Stampede successful


Farwell School nurse LuAnn Fillpot reports a great turnout for the Fall Stampede revival on Aug. 18.

Mrs. Fillpot indicated she will plan it again next year.









Here is the weekly report from Parmer County Sheriff Randy Geries.

On Aug. 20, Rigoberto Cruz, 28, of Friona, was arrested by Friona police on a charge of DWI, pending in county court.





(E.N.M.R. or the Cooperative) that the Cooperative plans to bundle its Access Line Service (business and residence) with Tone Dialing Service in the Texas Exchanges, Bell View, East Glen Rio, Farwell, and Pleasant Hill (Texas Exchanges), effective September 1, 2011. The Cooperative's Tone Dialing Service formerly \$1.50 per month will be waived for all residential and business customers and you will notice on your bill that you are no longer charged a separate rate for this service. Your local exchange access line rate will not be increased due to this change in the rate reduction for tone dialing service. In addition, E.N.M.R. will no longer offer the obsolete Rotary Key/Trunk Service and is removing the service from its Local Exchange Tariff. ## Newspapering was in their blood

John and Joann Getz began their publication of the Tribune with the first issue of September 1965.

They took over the operations of the Tribune from former owner and publisher W.H. Graham Jr., who had purchased a daily paper in Lovington, N.M., and had moved his offset printing press from Friona

Joann had worked for the Graham family from the early 1950s and John began working at the Tribune in the late 1950s.

This was the extent of their knowledge of the newspaper business. But newspapering was in their blood and they decided to make it their career.

They accepted the Tribune on a lease basis from

Graham. In February 1969, they were able to outright purchase the property and continue the weekly The Tribune was then composed by a punch tape

operation with Dolph Moten, of Bovina, who published the Bovina Blade. The Tribune was taken to Hereford for printing. The Getzes learned of a new offset computerized system of setting type that would be available for

small weekly papers. They purchased it in April 1972 and produced the first issue by this method on May The Tribune had the first of these offset machines in the state of Texas and set a trend that soon swept

ciations for general excellence, column writing, news writing and advertising composition.

John was further honored by being elected president of the Panhandle Press Association in 1971 and the West Texas Press Association in 1981.

Due to the advancement of time, the Getzes sold the Tribune in September 1984 to Mike and Judy Pomper. The Getzes then retired.

Farwell Coach Mike Prokop said it went well for the Steers but he wants them to be sharper. The younger kids did a good job moving the ball.

Prokop said Bretton Stancell, a linebacker who was used as a lineman in the scrimmage, stepped up and did some good work.

And Prokop reported no injuries.



The 1940 review of important events included the death of District Judge Reese Tatum, after more than 20 years on the bench; the building and opening of the underpass to connect Hwy. 86 and Hwy. 60 in Bovina; the initial tenant purchase program for Parmer County; the election; and the draft registration and first call.

The REA program was granted an extension of some 200 miles; a serious ice freeze in late November laid waste to REA, telephone and telegraph wires, as well as the majority of trees, particularly in northern Parmer County; one of the worst train wrecks in the history of our area occurred near Muleshoe; and a bonded warehouse was built in Bovina for wheat stor-

The proposed bond election for road work was refused by the voters; the City Cleaners establishment was burned; the defense program got into operation in the Farwell School and was slated for Texico; Sanford James Storms was the first draftee in the national lottery; and Verna Miller won the subscription campaign held by The Tribune.

Rev. A.M. Dupree, of Lubbock, was struck by a car driven by W.C. Payne and instantly killed; W.C. Rabon was shot and killed by Ray Tittle, who was later sentenced to the New Mexico penitentiary and just last week Wanda Lee Martin was shot by an unknown

T.D. Evans, of Friona, won a 4-H medal in national meat work; the first city park was started in Texico; the Phillips petroleum wholesale business was robbed three times; and new buildings housing the State Line Grocery, the City Cleaners, Gus and Mabel's Cafe, and Billington's Barber and Beauty Shop were built while B.M. Graham improved the home of his insurance agency.

Gilbert Watkins, of Oklahoma Lane, was named state Gold Star Boy for 1939; the Farwell FFA and FHT groups held their first project shot; the annual livestock show was staged in Friona, with around 2,500 attending; some 3,000 students went through the local Port of Entry on school tours; Leo Forrest resigned as Farwell superintendent, and J.T. Carter was elected.

W.J. Matthews was re-elected mayor of Texico; Security State Bank deposits hit a record high in April; storage capacity for the Henderson Elevator was doubled; a co-op dairy association was formed, embracing Parmer, Curry and Roosevelt counties; Chas. Jones Jr., of Bovina, was awarded damages from the West Texas Utilities Co. for the loss of his leg in an accident.

The E.H. Young children near Farwell had a bunch of skunks as pets; the State Line Road north of Texico was hard-surfaced; new track was laid between Texico and Clovis, and also north of here; the home demonstration groups and AAA sponsored a mattress-making program from surplus cotton.

The Texas Utilities office located here was moved

to Muleshoe; the county gained 1 resident per year for the past 10 years as shown by the official census; a sanitation program was launched in Parmer for WPA workers; Sam A. Young, of Oklahoma Lane, was a national 4-H winner in farm and home accounting; and Gilbert Watkins, of Oklahoma Lane, was a state winner in the same contest.

The wheat harvest was small due to dry weather; Mr. and Mrs. S.C. Hunter were in a serious car wreck while on vacation; the Texas 4-H boys were tops in both county and state, and Preston Martin, Texico FFA member was named New Mexico State Farmer

Mrs. W.J. Matthews was succeeded by Mrs. Lucy Brown as Texico postmaster; the Red Cross Pharmacy was enlarged; the FSA medical co-op paid out in full for its first year; the Red Cross roll call hit a new high with about 400 memberships sold; Miss Ruth Boyd resigned as county demonstrator and Miss Elsie Cunningham was named; the home demo ladies held a quilt bedspread and table linen show in Friona as a new project.

In sports, the Texico basketball and track teams with the former 2nd in district and attending the state meet for the first time in history, while the latter won 1st in county and district and 4th in state. Frank Thompson, athletic star, was high in both county and district track and tied for high at state.

Farwell track boys took the Parmer meet while the Lazbuddie girls captured the district volleyball crown. Bovina took both county interscholastic league cups. For the first time in years, the Bovina Chiefs walloped the Farwell Steers in grid games. Texico held its first Homecoming banquet.
