## Lady Wolverines win state title

The Texico Lady Wolverines utterly dominated the Navajo Pine Warriors to win the state championship game on March 9 at Albuquerque, 71-38.

The two teams have faced each other several times in the last dozen years in the title game. Last year, Navajo Pine won; the year before, Texico won.

Navajo Pine finished with a 21-9 mark, while Texico was 25-6 for the campaign.

Scoring were Jordyn Cooper, 31; Jaylyn Cooper, 18; Shaylee Anderson, 15; Rae Lynn Prather, 3; Klynn Thomas, 2; and McKenzi Mayfield, 2.

Texico had 28 rebounds to Navajo Pine's 24. Texico had 13 assists, Navajo Pine 9. Jo. Cooper had a pair of 3-pointers.

The Lady Wolverines have now won 8 state championships and the second in the last three years.

Texico's strong man-to-man defense, plus their domination on the boards made the game one-sided from the onset.

Three Texico starters have signed to play college ball -- Anderson is heading to the University of New Mexico, while the Cooper twins will play at Eastern New Mexico University.

To show how well Texico played, Navajo Pine had 10 turnovers just in the first quarter.

The game opened with a 7-0 Texico run, on a 3-pointer by Jo. Cooper and a couple of buckets by Ja. Cooper.

After Navajo Pine scored, Anderson put in 3 free throws to up the lead.

## Reyna leads Wolverines past top-ranked Hawks

The No. 9 ranked Texico Wolverines gave the top-ranked and heretofore unbeaten Laguna Acoma Hawks an early exit from the State playoffs on March 7 with a 77-76 win in the State quarter-finals.

Laguna-Acoma finished its season at 24-1, while the Wolverines climbed to 19-11.

Texico kept the lead in the fast and furious game thanks to grabbing twice the rebounds the Hawks could, plus Miguel Reyna's shooting, and an important early timeout in the 3rd quarter.

Scoring for Texico were Sergio Posada, 6; Jesus Rivera, 14; Rallin Harris, 8; Reyna, 30; Wayne Skabelund, 10; John Myers, 2; Donovan Johnson, 1; and Gentry Doolittle, 6.

Texico ended the game shooting 32 of 67 from the field and 3 of 8 from the 3-point line.

Texico took the early lead as Rivera grabbed the rebound and found Reyna for a quick layup. The Hawks pressed Texico throughout the game, but Texico repeatedly beat the press to get points. Skabelund, Harris, Rivera, Johnson and Myers all scored early as Texico spread out the points.

Reyna, Harris and Posada hit close shots as the Wolverines built a 7-point lead.

The 2nd quarter opened with another Texico barrage as Harris, Reyna and Skabelund gave Texico a 13-point lead.

# Center hosts 2 different groups of seniors



Dinner, games and special guest speakers are the attractions at Thursday night meetings of the Texico/Farwell Senior Citizens Club.

For example, Jackie Lara, community relations coordinator for Wheatfield's Senior Living Community in Clovis, presented the group with information about their facility and services at a recent meeting at the Texico Community Center.

Afterward, Aileen Teel, Loma Hendricks and Raymond Robertson won certificates for a shampoo/cut/style at Bella's Salon in Clovis.

The Center hosts two different groups of seniors. Besides the Texico/Farwell club, there is a Hispanic Senior Citizens Club which meets Tuesday evenings.

Both groups encourage anyone over 50 to check out their meetings. They both offer meals with every get-together and play games such as bingo, cards, puzzles and dominoes.

Ann Cooper, a long-time Texico member, says the group has been at its location on Griffin Street since 1996. Her parents served as club directors and helped secure funding for the facility. Any senior from the surrounding area is welcome to join and the membership fee is only \$10 per year.

It was stated that as a member, "you can pay an extra \$5 a month for a cleaning lady to clean your home two times per month and another \$5 each time for someone to cut your grass. It is just one of the little perks of our fun club."

The club hosts an annual community picnic and sponsors a bake sale during the Texico Easter egg hunt.

Bingo nights are held the 2nd Friday of each month. And the group has a book lending library.

Another major activity for the Center is 42 domino games. Jerry Whitney organizes the games and frequent 42 tournaments throughout our area.

He explains, "It is only \$3 to play in a tournament and you receive bragging rights and a framed certificate if you win." He invites everyone to come play and enjoy the game as well as some great social time.

Whitney added, "Our Senior Citizens Clubs are really a lot of fun. We invite everyone over the age of 50 to give it a try."



In 1945, the population of Parmer County was just under 5,000 and the idea of establishing a hospital took hold.

The first "hospital" (really a clinic type setting) was in the upstairs of a bank at Main and 5th streets in Friona.

A small number of progressive individuals raised \$45,000 in one year and purchased barracks which were army surplus medical units from the POW camp at Hereford. These were put at the corner of Hwy, 60 and Cleveland Ave. It was remodeled and opened in 1947 as Parmer County Community Hospital.

The first physician to practice there was Dr. Cecil Simmons. The first nurse was Gladys Wilson. David Crow was the first hospital manager.

The first baby born was Janine Wiley and the physician didn't make it in time to deliver her; Ms. Gladys Wilson "caught" the baby.

By 1954, the population of Parmer County had almost doubled. Hospital business was booming -- 824 patients were hospitalized, 159 babies born and 15,000 outpatient visits took place.

It became apparent a new hospital was needed. The building was crowded and not fireproof. There was no separate space designated for emergency services. Patients who needed immediate or emergency care were treated in either the surgery room or the doctor's office.

In 1956, a small group gathered to discuss building a new facility -- Pete Buske, Frank Spring, Jim Shaffer, Joe Poindexter and Sloan Osborn.

The new structure was reported to have cost \$75,000 to build and \$57,000 of this was paid for through the purchase of certificates. These purchasers were known as "members" and received a discount for services rendered to them or their families.

2006 saw more growth and change. Parmer County held a bond election to build a replacement hospital facility; the issue passed by an overwhelming majority and construction of the new facility, to be called Parmer Medical Center, began in 2007 with completion targeted for late summer 2009.

- In 1988, the first patient was transported by helicopter.
  - In 1990, Dr. Paul Spring retired having first come here in 1951.
  - In 2003, hospital administrator Lance Gatlin, who grew up in Friona, began working here, until taking a post in Amarillo recently.

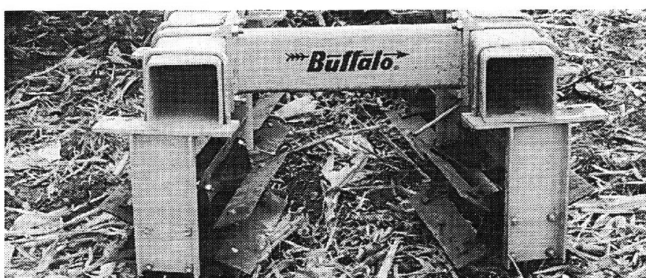

You should have seen the grin on his face as I cussed over my stupidity. Oh well, we are all human.

What I -- and so many others -- appreciated about Lee is that when emergencies occurred, he was johnny on the spot. In cold weather,

when a furnace went out, you didn't want to hear an electrician say "I'll be there in a couple of days"; you wanted his help now.

And Lee was there.

Lee cared about his community. He was heavily involved for many, many years in making Farwell a better place to live. So many owe him so much. I am glad that a plaque honoring his greatness was placed on the wall at the Farwell Community Center this month so he will never be forgotten.

I was fortunate to call Lee my friend.

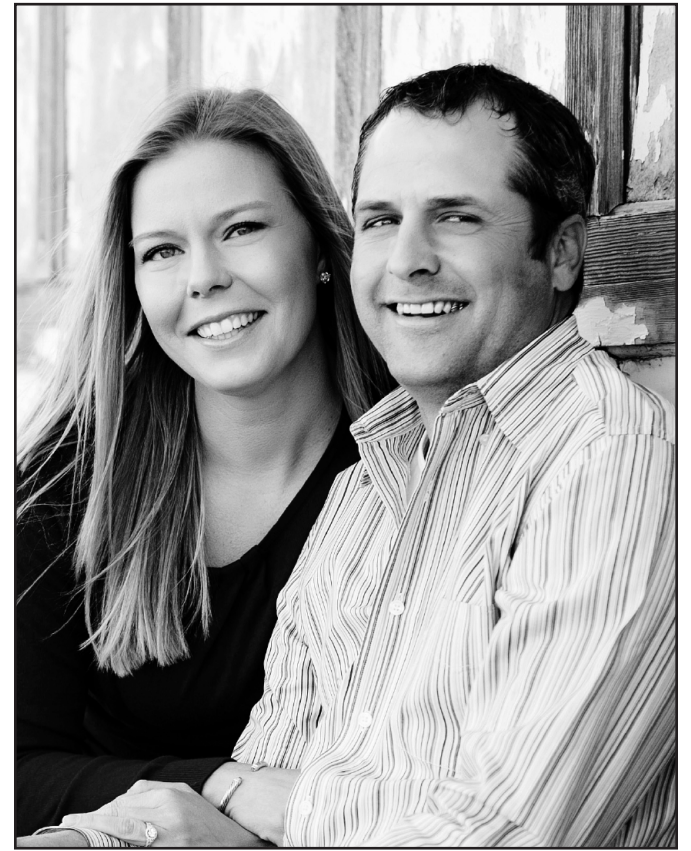
And I miss him.
