




# Roof repair scheduled for Texico elementary gym

Live Cattle pulled back into support around the \$119.70 evel this week basis the February contract and held. Prices vill need to move higher early in the week in order to turn short term trends back higher. Prices have moved lower after the last couple of weeks and will normally make an attempt to trade higher after such a drop? Overall, the martet is trading around mid range of last years April high and the December low. A strong rally could push prices back into the December highs around the \$124 area?

Feeder prices saw new contract highs last week and pulled back down into lower levels. As a rule of thumb each time new contract highs have been made, feeders have had a strong tendency to trade down. This also took place back in September, October and November. Prices failed to make a contract high in December. The market has already moved about \$3 off last weeks highs. There is strong support around last weeks low made at the \$149.50 level basis the March contract.

Soybean prices pulled back for a short lived price correction followed by a strong rally early this week. Prices had pulled back to some fairly strong support levels and held. The market is technically poised to retest last weeks highs. New highs could propel the market even higher.

Corn prices also cooled off for a couple of days last week before moving back higher early this week. The market tested last weeks highs around the \$6.64 level before back ing off. There will be a final USDA Crop Production summary out this week which could possibly push the market up into the October/November highs to test that level? Bottom line is that trends are up and have remained

Wheat prices took a much deeper price correction last week, but have been able to recover early this week. Much of the longer term direction will most likely be tied to the rest of the grain complex to some degree. Overall, price trends remain higher for the time being. Much of what takes place over the coming weeks may depend heavily on how the USDA Crop Production report comes out this

Cotton prices were able to hold most of their gains seen over the Holidays with another push higher early this week. Both short and long term trends have turned up at this time and higher prices should continue unless the USDA Crop Production has a negative surprise later this week? The report is not expected to have any surprises, but the market will move depending on the reaction to the

February 1, 2012, is the deadline to pay all personal and property taxes in **Parmer County.** 

Checks must be postmarked by February 1, 2012, or penalty and interest will occur.

If you turned 65 years old as of January 1, 2012, then you need to sign up for the "65 and older" Homestead Exemption. This is a permanent exemption so if you already have signed up for it, you don't have to re-apply.

If you have purchased a home since you signed up for the Homestead Exemption, you need to re-apply for this exemption.

Agricultural use exemptions are available for all who have purchased agricultural property. If you purchased ag property during the past year, you need to apply for this exemption.

# J.W. Crim: The Lazbuddie weather prophet

From 1951:

J.W. Crim, a Lazbuddie resident, is Parmer County's weather prophet.

Once a year, he takes an inclusive look at the weather and makes a sweeping statement about how it will turn out.

A longtime farmer, so the weather means just one thing to him: whether he will or won't make a crop.

Crim doesn't pull any punches. This year's crop outlook is not very optimistic. He just reads the signs and reports accordingly.

There is an old Indian legend to the effect that a fire burning at sunrise on March 22 will give signals through its smoke indicating whether the year will be a good one or not for crops.

Crim goes on say that if the smoke from the fire at this time is carried west or southwest there will be a bumper crop.

If the wind is from the west, south or southwest, that indicates a bad year and the southeast wind indicates a very poor crop is coming.

With all this information at hand, Crim and his three sons got up early last March 22 and lit their fire about 15 minutes before sunrise. His boys take an active part in the ceremony and are given appropriate names.

Chief Big Drink, Dancing Red Eye and the Squaw Man are typically titles assigned to these junior medicine men.

We found the wind to be from the south to the southwest, indicating a bad crop this year, Chief Longhorns beat back Crim said. He reported that all the readings are taken Amherst, 53-26, on Jan. exactly at sunrise in order to be accurate.l

It doesn't matter if you can see the sun or not, he

Crim has been building these tell-all bonfires for 26 years in Parmer County and finds his calculations Shyann Rainey and to be quite accurate, generally speaking.

He admits he has missed a few times but then so Josie have some people who take much greater pains for Maysun Hester and forecasting.

A lot of people have laughed at me, Crim smiled, but I notice that next year they are always coming back to ask me how the crop is going to come out.

The Lazbuddie prophet points out that the forecast deals more with the row crop than the wheat Townsend, 4; Rainey, 5;

Last year, when we had a virtual washout in wheat, the row crop turned in pretty well. And the sunrise Mason and Galaviz, 2 fire predicted the outcome of the row crop, too.

You see, when the Indians used this means of 14. foretelling the weather for crops, they were most interested in the plants that matured later in the year, Crim said. The forecast may call for a bad crop year and the wheat to turn out well, or vice aversa.

How was the legend handed down? As far back as Crim can track, it's in his memory the practice of the times, 16-14. late J.J. Wilborn, of Post, Texas, in 1906.

Crim is sure that the story has been in the family Scott, for many generations more, however. The legend Fernandez, 2; was given Crim by his father.



# McCallum publishes a best-seller

Have you ever met a New York Times best-seller who told you not to buy his book?

Well, Bovina's Mike McCallum might just be the first.

Mike, who goes by M.D. McCallum in professional circles, is an internationally award-winning commercial graphics artist, 3D animator, project director and webmaster with a freelance career that spans over 20 years and includes over 100 individual and team-

based awards. Last year, he wrote a book to acquaint first-time animators in using the iClone software. The book is also aimed at getting experienced animators up to speed quickly.

Mike wrote from March to September, and even if it sounds like a lot of work, he says it was easy. "I've been doing video tutorials for a long time. I just had to put it on paper."

He got some help from his publishers. They sent him a chapter format to use that would help him keep his notes and chapters in order.

Unfortunately, they sent it to him after the first chapter had been written, forcing him to start over.

Mike said he aimed to write three pages a day, and it took around 4 months for the first half of the book, and 3 months to finish up.

The writing process did have some bumps along the way. The hard part was figuring out what to cut out of the book. His video tutorials allowed him to fit in as much as he wanted. The book format had to be the New York Times best-sellers list. more precise.


