## Land-lease pacts to be offered

Southwest LLC, of Bovina, is a partner with Havgul Clean Energy from Norway and Alpha Wind Energy from Denmark, seeking to build wind energy farms in this area. Jim Bob Swafford, CEO of Scandia Wind Southwest, is the local partner and the driving force

here. Scandia Wind Southwest has received approval to proceed with the second phase study for interconnection for 1,000 megawatts on the ERCOT (Electrical Reliability Council of Texas) CREZ power grid, said Swafford.

# Steers shock Yellowjackets

The Farwell Steers had a great Homecoming as they stunned the Clayton Yellowjackets last Friday, 24-13.

The win boosts the Steers' record to 2-3 as district approaches.

Clayton, ranked as the No. 1 team in New Mexico Class 1A, is now 4-1.

It was a short-handed Farwell squad with four players injured. Two might have played, but Coach Mark Anglin held them out for this weekend's district opener against Springlake-Earth.

Farwell started at its 27. Landry Actkinson ran for 7, and Colby Read gained 17 on three rushes. A pass to Kolten Morris was good for 12. Caleb Christian ran for 10, then Actkinson for 11. The long drive culminated in a 1-yard plunge by Read for a TD at 8:02. The kick was wide.

Collin Christian tackled the kick returner at the Clayton 29. Lincoln Devault had a good tackle, then Zac Stancell had a tackle for a 5-yard loss so Clayton punted.

Actkinson hit Morris for 24 yards, then Caleb Christian ran for 8 and Read for 7. Passes to Devault and Morris gained 21 more yards but a 22-yard field goal try failed as the 1st quarter ended.

On the first play of the 2nd quarter, Clayton lined up to punt but a bad snap allowed Devault to tackle the punter in the end zone for a safety and an 8-0 Farwell lead.

Farwell started at its 40. Actkinson hit a 19-yard pass to Colton Christian. Kyler Steinbock then took a short pass and ran for 20 more yards, but the drive stalled in Clayton territory.

Mason Coburn recovered a fumble at the Clayton 23. Read ran for 22, and Actkinson scored from the 1 at 7:49. A run for extra points failed and it was 14-0.

Clayton had 4th and 4 at its 40 and went for it. But the run was stopped short by Stancell.

The Steers then faced a 4th and 4 situation but Actkinson hit Caleb Christian with a pass for 16 yards. Farwell fumbled, but Matt Martin recovered it. Farwell was held and punted to the Clayton 20.

Morris had a great tackle for an 8-yard loss. But Clayton hit a long pass to the Farwell 29. Martin had a tackle for a 4-yard loss as the 2nd quarter ended.

Clayton started at its 20 to open the 3rd quarter. Read had a QB sack for minus 15 yards so Clayton punted to midfield.

A pass to Hunter Black gained 10. Then a pitch to Read resulted in a 39-yard TD at 8:47. The Devault kick made it 21-0.

Stancell tackled the kick returner at the Clayton 40. Devault had a TD-saving tackle at the Farwell 10 after a 50-yard run. Clayton scored from the 3 at 7:37 and it was 21-7.

Farwell started at its 27 and Morris caught a 12-yard pass. But Clayton intercepted at its 25.

On defense, Collin Christian had a big tackle. Aaron Warren recovered a fumble at the Farwell 25. Read ran for 14 but Clayton intercepted at its 33 as the 3rd quarter ended.

Clayton scored on a 28-yard run at 8:03 and closed the margin to 21-14.

Farwell started at its 25. Read busted tackles for a 14-yard gain. Actkinson hit Morris with a pass good for 27. Caleb Christian had runs of 7 and 12. At 3:24,

The "Mariah Project" goals are to develop 5,000-megawatt wind farms in the Texas Panhandle. Currently 200,000 acres are being developed in Parmer County with a capacity for 3,000 megawatts. The other 2,000 megawatts will be developed on a 260,000-acre site in Sherman and Dallam counties.

Scandia Wind Southwest is working to resolve the grid issues with independent local and national grid companies. They will have other grid options coming online within the next few years.

Thus, Scandia Wind Southwest continues moving forward in the development stage of the Mariah project. The land lease agreements to be offered later in October to Parmer County landowners will allow them to be partners in the Mariah project.

**LIVE CATTLE:** Prices took a hard hit this week for no apparent reason? Analysts continue to look for higher prices, but a market without buyers cannot support higher prices. It seems as though everyone wants to see higher prices to sell into, but nobody wants to buy this market? A lack of any buying interest for most of this year has had the market playing defense almost all the time? Heavy selling on Thursday and Friday could trap some shorts if prices begin to rally early next week, but this may be the only buying out there to support prices over the near term. Packers have had the upper hand and may continue to do so.

**FEEDER CATTLE:** Feeder prices followed the Live Cattle down late this week. Price supports have been penetrated and now it seems to be a flip of the coin as to what level will hold if any. The Cash Feeder Index continues to trade at a premium to the board. Short covering could lead to a \$2-3 rally next week, but market remains weak.

**CORN:** Corn prices continue to be influenced by weather as reports are changing on a daily basis. The strongest level of resistance remains around the \$3.50 level basis the December contract. Support below remains around the \$3.20 level. Market may bounce around these levels until harvest really picks up?

**SOYBEANS:** Soybean prices traded back down to retest their July lows this week and held. Expect to see a bump back higher next week. Not much influence from weather, but prices are technically oversold at these levels. Overhead resistance is up around the \$9.40 level basis the November contract.

**WHEAT:** Wheat prices have been flat for several weeks with support coming in around the \$4.58-4.60 level and resistance around \$4.88-4.90 basis the December KC contract. No news to speak of and very little demand as world stocks continue to grow. Demand is coming hand to mouth with no interest in increasing inventories.

**COTTON:** Cotton prices retested their old highs around the 65 cent level basis the December contract just a couple of weeks ago. Now the market has begun to sell off and is currently trading around the mid range of a long term sideways market. Look for support around 61 with stronger support around the 57-58 levels.
