QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q—I realize I'm entitled to only one change of course under the Korean GI Bill. But what if I want to change schools without changing course? Is there any limit on the number of changes of this nature?

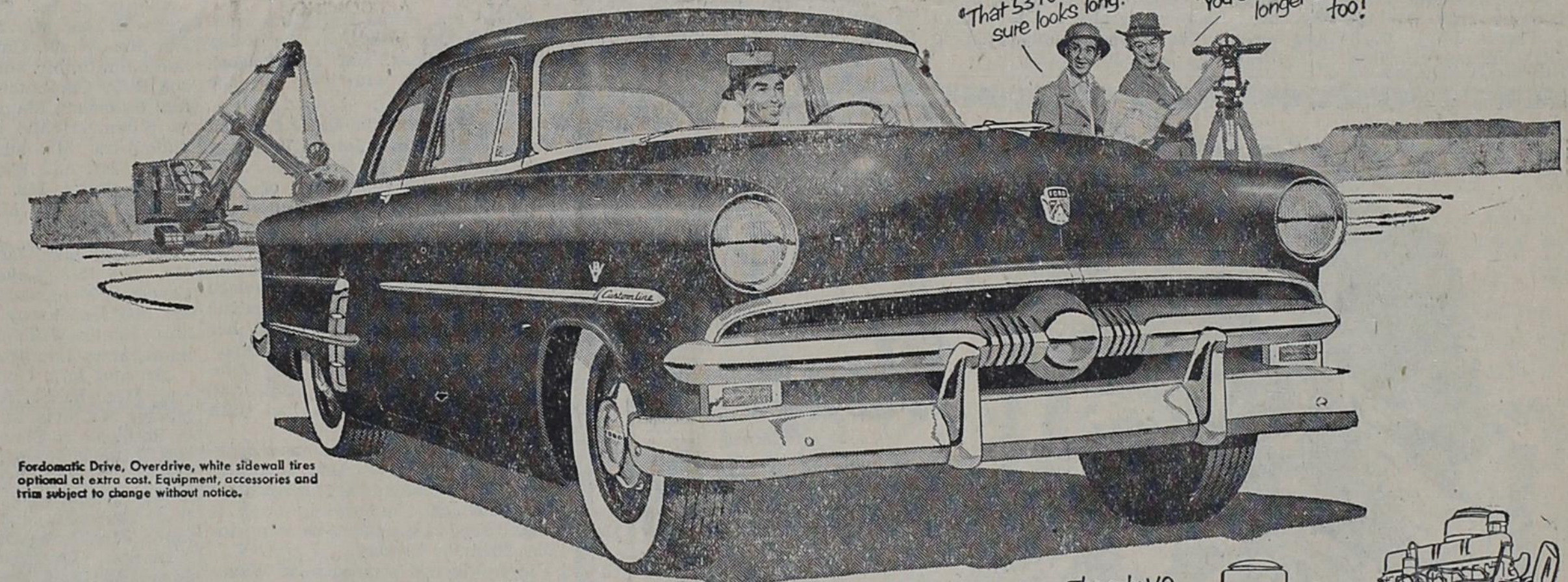
A—The law imposes no restrictions on changing schools, so long as no course changes are involved. Before making your move, however you must apply to VA for approval. If everything is in order, VA will issue a supplemental certificate authorizing you to go ahead with GI training in your new school.
