CORN: Corn prices have continued to trade aroun the top end of their three month trading range wit extends from $\$ 3.79$ to $\$ 4.25$ basis the March contract Higher energy prices have been the key support for cor prices over the last few weeks. The U.S. Dollar ha cally ignored the Dollar and seems to be more closel inked to the price of crude.
SOYBEANS: Prices continue to drop at a fairly rapi rate. News that China may slow or halt imports really hi the market hard last week. There is some suppor around $\$ 10.08$ level basis the March contract, but towards lower support levels. The South American cro seems to be moving along with ideal growing conditions Short term trends are pointing lower.
WHEAT: Prices have also held up strong while trad ing in the upper end of their channel. Some of the sup port has been linked to the severe cold winter weathe
which moved across just about all the major winte wheat growing areas. Prices may be testing some impor tant resistance levels around the $\$ 5.60$ level basis th March KC contract. Short term trends remain higher his time.
COTTON: Prices have been hit fairly hard from sig nals that China may slow imports. This market is proba
bly the most fundamentally strong market on the board Although the market did trade back down through som fairly strong support levels, a quick rebound woul make this market look strong. Expect to see at least strong bounce back to the upside over the near term \$76.50 is still strong resistance.
