Clovis scored on a 2 -yard run and closed the gap o 21-14
On offense, Pinnell burst up the middle for 15 , hen for 9 more. As the final period opened, Rucker drive ended at the Clovis 25.
Matt Odegaard had a big tackle but Clovis moved the ball well, scoring on a 15 -yard pass to tie the ame
Texico lost a fumble at midfield. Clovis hit a long pass and got 1 st and goal. Pinnell intercepted in the end zone, and returned it to the Texico 44 before regulation time ran out.
In overtime, Texico rode Pinnell's rushes to a TD, rom 3 yards out.
