The Southwest Farm Press reports that the 2006 wheat crop will be the smallest in 35 years due to fewer harvestable acres and lower projected yields. Production is estimated to be 63 perc below the 2005 crop. elevator in Lazbuddie said "Harvest is way down this year due to the dry weather and drought that were in."
In fact, the farmers that have been coming in are
getting an average of 11 bushels/acre dryland. One Friona irrigated land farmer said he was getting about 30 bushels per acre.
