

De Vinci Code is made up

It was back in the early 1980s, if memory serves me correctly, that I read a novel (and I emphasize "novel") called "Holy Blood, Holy Grail."

This book has served as the basis for the Da Vinci Code hullabaloo.

When I read the book, what struck me was the obvious. Many of the premises were based on "legend" or "myth" or "it seemed." In other words, the basis for all the facts was just a pile of sand.

Better make that "quicksand" for the way it has drawn some people into.







Cotton producers making good progress

From Plains Cotton Growers Incorporated: Even though rain showers have been a regular visitor to the area lately they have generally been a hit or miss proposition for High Plains cotton producers in 2006.

Despite the challenges posed by generally dry soil conditions cotton producers have made good progress in planting the crop. The area's usual pattern of planting irrigated crops first and dryland acreage second is holding true to form as producers wait as long as possible for a planting rain to get their dryland crops off to the best possible start.

Unfortunately, planting rains haven't fallen yet in many dryland areas. Since the Memorial Day weekend failed to provide the necessary rainfall, dryland growers will begin dry planting their acres and hope that moisture to germinate the crop arrives soon thereafter.

Since the majority of the High Plains non-irrigated acres exist in counties with federal crop insurance final planting dates of June 5 or 10, Memorial Day is often the date many producers will start dry planting cotton in order to meet federal crop insurance planting deadlines.

Heading into Memorial Day the High Plains is estimated to be around 55-60 percent planted. The majority of the unplanted acres are non-irrigated and located south of Lubbock.

Planted crops appear to be faring well and warm daytime temperatures that have taken hold across the area are helping keep things headed in the right direction.

Lightning causes fires
