



The burn ban is off until June 24, at which time the commissioners will meet again and discuss whether to reinstate it or not.



Memorial Services were held at First Baptist Church of Farwell, on June 10, 2013, with Rev. Russ Ponder officiate ing. Cremation followed.



The dancers in her lights were turned off for Dara's particular dance. That meant you could see the illuminated costumes, but not the faces, arms or legs of the dancers.


And that meant we had absolutely no idea which dancer Dara was. The dance started and finished in that fashion --





Live Cattle prices have been in a flat and sideways trade for the last three weeks with very little direction. Prices have trade around the \$119.60 every day for about 16 days in a row basis the August contract. On Monday the market broke down out of this tight range, but overall market remains sideways. With cash beef prices and cash cattle prices moving lower now, it could add some pressure to futures prices. It will take a move back above \$121 in the August to push the market any higher.

Feeder prices have seen a similar trading range with basically no direction. The market has been down here for almost a month and has yet to take out support or resistance. The August contract will either need to take out the lows at \$142.25 or the highs at \$147.40 to move the market. Most of the focus remains on the Live Cattle price and to a small degree the corn price.

Soybean prices tried and failed to take out the highs posted just a couple of weeks ago. This market technically ooks like either a major price correction is due or a major top has just been posted. Fundamentally, there are few reasons to hold the market at these levels. For now, look for a possible test of the \$14.80 level basis the July con-

Corn prices have all test their \$6.70 and \$5.70 highs basis the July and December contract respectively. Both have failed around these levels and this could signal the end of this rally which began several weeks ago. The seasonal tendency is lower and the weather seems to be in good shape along with planting's which are in line with the 5 year averages. A close below \$5.35 basis the December vould most likely signal a long term top in place.

Wheat prices tried to breakout on the upside early last week, but failed. This may be due to the rest of the grain complex also failing to take out some major resistance levels. In any case, the July KC wheat is now trading below their \$7.33 support level and look like another test of the contract lows is coming. Those levels are \$7.10 made in early April.

Cotton prices exploded back to the upside early last week and then just faded away into Friday's close. There is a good case to be made that prices are in a sideways trading range, but since the early March high was made, prices have continued to see lower highs and lower lows which is technically negative. The market has held the one-third price support around the \$82.25 level basis the December which is positive.




