### Texico schools change eligibility requirements

The Texico School on Monday changed its academic eligibility requirements for students in grades 7 through 12.

These rules involve participating in extra-curricular activities.

Currently, students were allowed to participate in them if they had an "F" in one course.

Starting next fall, students in those grades must have at least a 2.0 grade point average with passing grades in all classes -- no "F's."

The board also approved a new general leave policy for staffers.

Currently, the policy contracts (such as teachers) received two leave policies -- sick leave and determination is done on 15. an hourly rate leading to a total of 9.25 days.

The new policy will simplify that into a "general leave" one. And the rate was rounded off at 2014 school calendar, 10 days.
