These increases are less than the $\$ 90.2$ million, or 12 percent, revenue increase Xcel Energy originally sought in a November 2012 proposal
Under the settlement rates filed Tuesday, the typical 1,000 kilowatt-hour residential bill will rise on May 1 by approximately 4.8 percent, or $\$ 4.36$ per month.
