## Farwell Schools

 decline to implement a baseball programAfter a detailed study, Farwell Schools will not be implementing a baseball School Supt. Larry Gregory.
"We put forth a good effort to consider baseball," he explained. "We hired an architect, looked at possible faciifities, and went over the funding.
The bottom line was the cost. If Farwell added a baseball program, that meant that under federal Title IX guidelines, it would also have to add a sports program for girls, such as olleyball.
Gregory said that in addition to the cost of con-
structing a baseball facilistructing a baseball faciilleyball and baseball would be at least $\$ 100,000$ a year (adding a coach, supplies, travel expenses, etc.).
Gregory said that if Farwell also offered baseball and volleyball, folks would expect them to be at a good level, just like basketball and football. Thus, considerably more money would be needed.
And the school has other needs for using its funds, explained Gregory. He noted having to stay current with technological changes, and inding a 3 d kindergarten class next year This year Far.
This year, Farwell added a 3rd first grade classbetter teacher-student ratio, and for more individualized instruction.
With 3 kindergarten classrooms, there would be 10 to 14 students in each room.

Also, Gregory would like to improve current extra curricular programs, like track, where he would like to see a new track built at the football stadium -something folks could use, too.

## Sittin' in the Corner

"Oh where, oh where,

## have the calories gone?"

For those of you who know about my cancer finally beginning to shrink, I thank you for your prayers (all of you out there, in fact.) I am still having to take treatment every three-out-of-four weeks, but I can tell that my health is beginning to return slowly.
the doctor has, however, told me to continue a caloric intake of about 1,800 calories each day. NO PROBLEM! Or so I thought. Each checkup, I continue to gain weight. become and be able to fight off the cancer at a faster pace (the human mind has a strange way of reasoning out things, doesn't it?) At my last appointment, I had gained another two pounds, which put me at eight pounds over what I weighed before I got sick (from the cancer, not mentally).
I finally decided to do the responsible thing and count the calories I take in each day. NO WONDER I WAS GAINING WEIGHT! Boy was I dumb. I was eating enough calories to feed an army. I don't think l'll have any problem in cutting down on the caloric intake if I use the right method.
The first thing I did was count the calories I was currently taking in, and had to decide on what to cut out. This is a typical human thinking pattern on this subject: "Let's see; no, I can't cut out the candy, 'Ill abandon the nutrition bars, they taste sweet, therefore they have to have too many calories.
many calories, but they sure are geo. Cola's have too many calo also a cool morning come to think of it Now for the meat. I think l'll continue to eat meat Vegetables? Give me a break. They're too expensive Fruit? Okay, one or two apples and oranges a month should do it."
Is it any wonder we have trouble staying on a healthy diet" D-I-E-T is a four letter word, but it is a good four letter word. If you count your calories, be honest and use a calculator. I tried using my brain against a calculator, and the calculator always counted too many calories. Therefore it couldn't be trusted.
I still think the calorie amount on the labels of various foods is incorrect (they were probably using the same brand of calculator that I was). I have considered contacting a Nutritionist, but when I found out what they charged ("YOU CHARGE HOW MUCH?"), I decided that couldn't save enough to pay them and eat fewer calories, so I chose to remain with my own method of calo-
rie counting. rie counting.
My wife has tried to help me with my calorie counting and intake, but she's too skimpy on the amount of food
she thinks I need to eat. She also uses a calculator to she thinks I need to eat. She also uses a calculator to
come up with her conclusions, but the key word is 'calculator,' therefore it shouldn't be trusted.
I keep conveniently forgetting to ask the doctor about a good diet plan, so l'll just have to improvise until I remember to ask him. I suppose when I get $30-40 \mathrm{lbs}$. overweight, 1 'lll start to pay closer attention to $m y$ weight situation. Until then, 'lll listen to any advice about weight, but don't take it personally if I don't follow it. It would help if you don't bring a calculator with you.
