## Taxes to increase home buyers' costs

The Texas Association
of Realtors reports that the
State Legislature has re-
cently passed a tax on pro-
fessional services which
would increase the costs
to home buyers. They have
also proposed a transfer tax
which would also make home
ownership less affordable
than it currently is.
Transfer taxes would ap-
ply to the application fee,
appraisal, credit report, sur-
vey, title examination, attor-
ney fees, points charge, and
PMI premium. The transfer
tax would require an extra
$\$ 500-\$ 1000$ cash payment
at closing. The new tax would
increase closing costs of the
seller.
The Texas Association of
Realtors suggests that the
new taxes would cause hous-
ing in Texas to become less
affordable to more people. As
