The Texas Public Utility Commission's Rules require ENMR Telephone Cooperative to implement certain changes which affect your telephone service. Beginning September 1, 1987, ENMR Telephone Cooperative, Inc. is required to offer you, the customer the option of buying the telephone equipment you currently lease from us. The Commission's Rules permit the Cooperative to continue leasing telephones and other equipment.
You, the customer, have the following options:

1. You may purchase the telephone sets you are currently leasing at the prices shown below.

For prices of other telephone instruments, please call your local ENMR business office 2. You may continue leasing at the new monthly rates

3. You may request a service representative to pick up the leased instrument presently in your home or business that you do not wish to purchase or continue leasing.
Now, let's look at the results of these options. If you purchase your telephone, whether from the Cooperative or from another source, it becomes your responsibility to maintain it. Many of the telephones on the market today may not be designed for use on the long rural lines in our area. If a trouble call is reported to us and the trouble is a result of your own instrument, then you would have to pay a service fee to compensate the Cooperative for the service representative's time. Our service representative cannot repair the instruments you have purchased from another vendor. The telephones you buy from the Cooperative will carry a 90 -day limited warranty, excluding telephone housing and cords, and may be billed on your next regular bill.
If you continue leasing your telephone from the Cooperative, any necessary repairs are included in the monthly rental fee. You would not have to worry about purchasing a new telephone or trying to find someone to repair it if it should give you trouble. The Cooperative's telephones are quality instruments designed to provide you the best possible service in your area.
Please consider these options carefully before making your decision. The new lease rates will go into effect on January 1, 1988. If you choose to purchase your instruments, the deadline is December 31, 1987. According to the Public Utility Commission's Rules, "a customer's failure to respond to the question will be treated as a decision to continue leasing."
The Cooperative would like to continue to be your full-service telephone provider. If you have any questions about your telephone equipment, please call the ENMR business office in your area. Thanks for your cooperation in this matter.
