













# Texico Track Teams Compete At EPAC

The entire Texico track force, senior and junior high divisions, were at Melrose last Thursday competing in the EPAC track meet, with three of the teams placing third, and one team, the junior high girls, placing second.

The Wolverines had a total of 45 points, ranking them third behind Logan with 47, and several points behind Tatum who won it with 128 total points. Placing for the Wolverines included Tommy Boarman, first in shot put with 46'11", and first in discus at 134'10", and Jeff Holland third in shot at 41'8 1/2" and second in discus with 118'10".

Charles Sharbutt was fourth in the shot with 40'9 1/2", and Doug Thornton was third in javelin at 130'9".

Danny Powell placed third in the 110 meter high hurdles with a time of 18.89, and Stanley Cross placed fourth in the same event at 19.20.

Billy Bibbs was fifth in the 100 meter dash at 12.51, and Rusty McCormack was second in the 165 meter hurdles at 22.56. Mark Meeks took fourth in the 440 dash at 57.33, and David Loera placed fifth in the mile run at 5:20.70.

In the relay division, the mile medley relay team of McCormack, Cross, Eric Harding, and Thornton placed fifth with a time of 4:25.23. In the mile relay, Kyle Snipes, Ronnie Galvan, Meeks, and Charlie Bibbs took third at 3:47.53. The 400 meter relay team of C. Bibbs, Snipes, Billy Bibbs, and McCormack placed fourth at 48.01.

The Lady Wolverines also placed third at the meet with a total of 42 points. Tatum was first with 98 points, and Melrose second with 62.

Placing for the Lady Wolverines included Kelly Lynn, second in the 100 meter dash with a time of 13.07, and sixth in the 220 dash at 30.00.

Loretta Gonzales placed third in the mile run with 6:32.70, and Helen Jo Boarman was third in the 300 meter hurdles at 51.16, and fourth in the 100 meter dash at 13.49.

Cheryl Scott took top honors in the shot put and discus events again with throws of 33'3 1/2" and 103'1", respectively. Kelly Lynn placed second in the discus with 92'. Karen Snodgrass was fourth

in the high jump at 4'9", and Boarman was fourth in the long jump at 14'8 1/2".

The 440 relay team, the 880 relay team, and the 880 medley relay team all placed fourth. Running the 440 relay at 60.34 were Angie Liggins, Michelle Lebow, Cheryl Scott, and Loretta Gonzales. Running the 880 relay team at 2:08.74 were Liggins, Scott, Coy Jo Burk, and Lotta Liljedahl. Running the 880 medley relay at 2:05.64 were Liggins, Lebow, Boarman, and Lynn.

The mile relay team of Scott, Boarman, Lynn, and Lebow placed third with a time of 4:48.02.

The junior high boys took the third place win for the day with a total of 53 points.

Placing for the junior high team included Tex Looney, fifth in the 220 dash with a time of 30.1, third in the discus at 120'2", and fifth in the shot put with 38'11".

Dean Reid placed third in the long jump at 15'7 1/2", and second in the 110 meter low hurdles with a time of 16.77. Bret Taylor took fourth in the long jump at 15'7", followed by Mike Williams who placed fifth with 14'3". Taylor was fifth in the 440 dash at 65.36, and Williams was first in the 660 dash at 1:43.71. Aaron Scott won the mile run with 5:39.14, and also placed fifth in the 880 yard run at 2:32.36.

Urban Orozco placed fourth in the 440 with 64.49, and Terry Allen was fifth in the 660 dash at 1:56.00.

The 440 relay team and the 880 relay team each placed fourth, with Keith Harrison, Buck Autrey, Williams, and Orozco running a 54.79 time for the 440 relay. Cory McDaniel, Autrey, Tim Lassiter, and Williams ran the 880 relay at 1:58.64.

The 880 medley relay consisting of McDaniel, Taylor, Autrey, and Reid placed third at 1:58.79, while Orozco, Taylor, McDaniel, and Harrison placed fifth in the mile relay with a time of 4:36.13.

The junior high girls broke the third place winning streak by taking second place in their division with 77 points, behind Tatum with 84 points.

Dena McDaniel placed fourth in the 660 run at 12:15.55, and Paige Reid was sixth in that

event at 2:18.60. Robin Pierce placed fourth and Teresa Thomas placed fifth in the 880 run with 3:04.46 and 3:05.24, respectively.

Sylvia Estrada took second place in the mile run at 7:10.56, and Judith Gonzales was fifth at 7:18.07. Tracey McDonald placed second in the 100 meter dash at 18.68 with Codie Burch sixth at 20.59.

McDonald also placed first in the 300 meter hurdles at 54.61, and Leslie Steward third at 56.75, and Codie Burch fourth at 59.62.

Twilla Longo was first in the shot put with 30'1 1/4", and Pattie Cavallero placed sixth with 21'6". Mary Griffin placed third in the discus and Robin Pierce was fifth, with throws of 63'7" and 58'10", respectively.

Geneva Garcia placed sixth in the high jump at 4'0". Kristi Lovelace was second in the long jump at 12'1", with Tracey McDonald fourth at 11'8 1/4".

The 880 relay and 880 medley relay teams placed first, with Steward, Robinson, Longo, and Attaway running the 880 relay at 2:07.95. The medley relay team of Longo, Robinson, Steward, and McDonald ran that relay in 2:12.

The 440 relay team of Lovelace, Robinson, Thomas, and Attaway placed second at 60.89, and the mile relay team of Attaway, Burch, Longo and Garcia was second with 5:14.85.

The junior high teams have concluded their track season, but the high school teams will be at Tatum next Saturday, April 28, for the district meet.
