tinue to rise in the Southern High Plains of Texas. ter levels in the 5.2 million acre service area of the ter Conservation District during 1987 was a rise of nine tenths of a foot. Depth to wa ter measurements were mad 960 observation wells during January and February 1988 by District personnel. These measurements compared to measurements of wells during the same months in 1987 revealed the rise in water lev
This procedure is repeated each year to determine the
annual change in the quantity of water in storage in the Ogallala Aquifer. The nine-
tenths of a foot rise indicates an increase of 702,000 acre-
feet of water in storage in the aquifer during the past year in the Water District service area. During the past three years, the changes in aquifer years, have reversed from a long-
term, continuous decline to term, continuous decline to a leveling or zero change in

Above average precipita not only has reduced irrigation water demand, but also provided an above average water supply source aquifer. Ninety-seven percent of the precipitation runoff which occurs on the High Plains is collected in playa
basins. The construction of pits and sumps in the bottom of 65 percent or more of the 17,000 playa basins in
the High Plains has increase the opportunity for natural recharge to the aquifer. These modifications are carved through the almost
