Six months ago, I wrote that our national legislators had finally gotten something right.

My story was new program that allows anyone in America to check their credit scores.

This is about as important as it gets. There are three main reporting agencies in America -- Equifax, Experian and TransUnion. Their information controls many different things in your life, starting with your credit score.

Some of the things that they keep track of at these places include how much debt you normally carry, how many days in between payments. and accounts you have open in your name.

For example, did you apply for a Sears card in 1985? It might still be open on your account.

But more importantly, there are two other reasons to check it out. First, did someone open an account in your name, or second, was there a mistake made that put something on your credit.

Don't forget, when you apply for most things, you write out your information and it is transferred by someone else into a computer. It doesn't take too much to make a mess of things.

If your social security number is typed in slightly wrong, or your drivers license, you can suddenly be someone new.

How many times has this happened? The better question is how many times has this happened today?

Every day, mistakes like this happen, and good suddenly people are accountable for other people's bad judgment.

The biggest problem is that the only time the average person looks at their credit reports is when they really need it. When you are looking to buy a car and they tell you 'no', you have a lot of work in front of you before you can clear your name.

Back in December. **Americans west of Texas** got the opportunity to check their credit scores one time per year for free. And if the government aives you something for free, then its best to take advantage of it.

Well, as of June 1st, Texans can take advantage of the program, too.

There are two ways you can get in touch with them, and like I said, this is a government program, they aren't going to sell you anything, and there are no
