## Farwell slates registration

Feb. 16 is the day to register children for next year's Farwell kindergarten and pre-kindergarten classes. Registration will take place in the Elementary Library from 1-4 p.m.

All children who will be four and five years of age by Sept. 1 and live in the Farwell School District need to register for next year's classes.

To register, a child must have immunization records and a birth certificate. Only official copies of birth certificates are accepted and must be obtained from the state offices.

Sarah Owen, school nurse, will be available to review immunization records during registration.

To be eligible for pre-kindergarten, a child must be 4 years old prior to Sept. 1, unable to speak or comprehend the English language, or from a family whose income, according to standards set by the State Board of Education, is at or below subsistence level (eligible for free or reduced price lunches), and is a resident of the Farwell School District.

Services for Robert Perez, 51, of Muleshoe, were held Tuesday at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church with Rev. Pat Maher officiating.

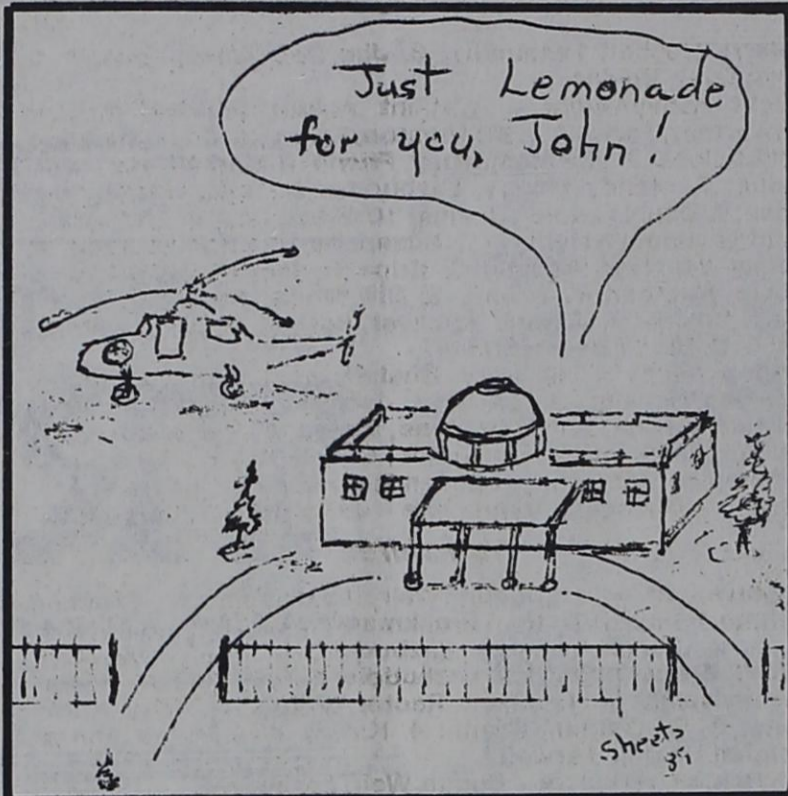
Burial was held at Bailey County Memorial Park under the direction of Ellis Funeral Home.

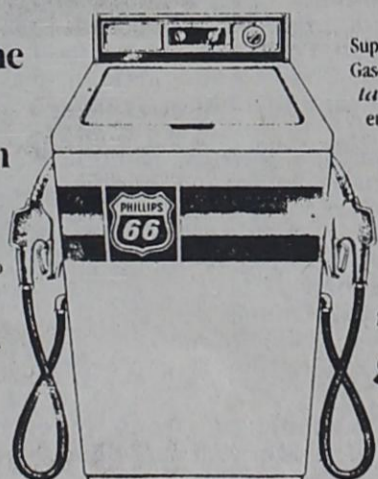

On Tuesday they will deliver cookies and balloons, and they will have Red and White

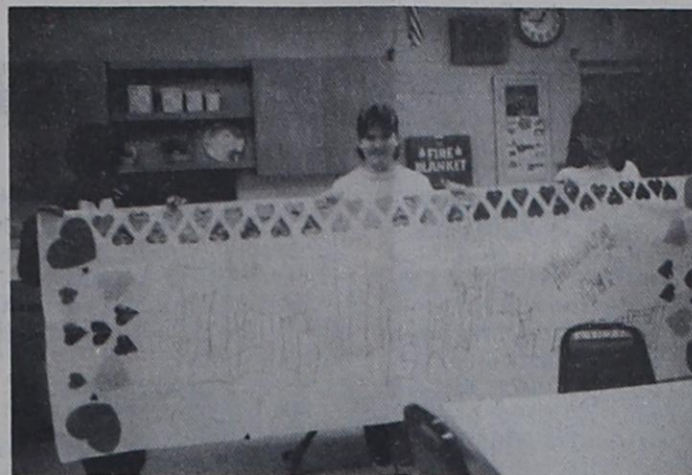
day for Valentines' Day.

## Recipe of Week

### Chocolate Pound Cake

1 c. (2 sticks) softened butter or margarine  
 1/2 c. vegetable margarine  
 3 c. sugar  
 5 eggs  
 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla  
 3 c. flour  
 1/2 c. cocoa  
 1/2 tsp. baking powder  
 1/2 tsp. salt  
 1 c. milk  
 Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease and flour a 10 inch tube pan or 12 c. bundt pan.

Cream butter, shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Blend in vanilla. Sift together flour cocoa, baking powder and salt. Alternate additions of milk and dry ingredients, beginning and ending with dry ingredients.

Spoon into prepared pan. Bake 1 hour 30 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pan 10 minutes. Turn out onto wire rack.

## 5 Area re-elects Seales, Layman

Don Seales of Lariat and L.G. Layman of Lazbuddie were re-elected to the board of directors of the Five Area Telephone Cooperative at the annual meeting on Feb. 4.

The group heard General Manager Hubert Kidd say 1988 couldn't have been better.

"It was our best year ever in Five Area Telephone Cooperative history," he told the group of 113 members and their guests.

In his report he told the group that a federally mandated accounting system change netted a few extra dollars to the cooperative that they had not previously been getting.

He reported that Five Area is returning capital investments to the group as fast as they can while still building a good system for the subscribers. He told the group that Five Area paid capital credits of \$5,622,348 in 1988. These are the capital credits for 1980. The money is returned to subscribers in the form of decreased telephone bills.

Five Area is now 7 years behind in its capital disbursements. The Rural Electrification Administration (REA) recommends a 10-20 year lag, but Five Area directors believe that they are doing well enough to stay well ahead of schedule.

The board has already approved a dispersal of the 1981 capital credits for later this year.

"We have had no borrowing since 1978," said Kidd. But Five Area has managed to install a complete digital system which they constantly upgrade.

"We also installed interface units on every home so people can test their own lines and find out if the problem is in the phone or the system before they call the company," said Kidd. This saves people the cost of a service call if the problem is in the discount store telephone or in the wires that subscribers installed by themselves.

Five Area has also maintained and upgraded its buildings this year. They also installed a new computer and new programming software.

"We are going to have to look at replacing computers and software as an on going deal," said Kidd. He noted that computer hardware and software are constantly changing. "We used to put in telephone poles that would last 25 years, now we must change as the industry changes," Kidd said.

Kidd looked to the future. He told the group that Five Area subscribers will soon be able to hook their home computers up to all sorts of services including home security systems, and a myriad of information services. He noted that this will go into effect as soon as the last of the copper wiring has been replaced by fiber optic cable.

He also said they have 911 emergency service on board. He noted that the cost increase of 50 cents per month was mandated by the state. He discussed some of the problems with the 911 service.

He noted that since Oct. 5, the rural telephone companies has been licensed to sell cellular telephone service, but he does not foresee many purchases of the service until the price comes down. Several phone companies have filed for this license and only one of them will get it. They will work out a partnership agreement so that several small companies will be able to offer this service to its subscribers.

Kidd told the group that Five Area is studying the cellular telephone service very carefully because it will cost a million dollars for the license. "There is no room for mistakes," he noted.

Kidd noted Five Area is looking toward expansion in the future. They would like to increase their service area if an area becomes available. Currently, Five Area's 2,500 subscribers are almost 1 mile apart. It would be advantageous for the company to expand its services to more subscribers, especially if those subscribers are closer together. But, Kidd explained that the REA will not loan money to a telephone cooperative to increase its service area.

He also told the group that the co-op is looking at the possibility of subscribing to operator services from ENMR Telephone Cooperative because the Clovis based operators are more familiar with the local geography than AT&T operators who might be based in Atlanta or California.

Five Area is already in partnership with ENMR Telephone Cooperative for one long distance service.

"We have not raised the basic rates since 1978," Kidd told the group. "We are already where other services should have been five years ago. They need to increase the basic rates to get where Five Area is now."

Because of this, Five Area already offers call waiting, call forwarding, wake up calls, and other services that many local companies do not offer their subscribers.

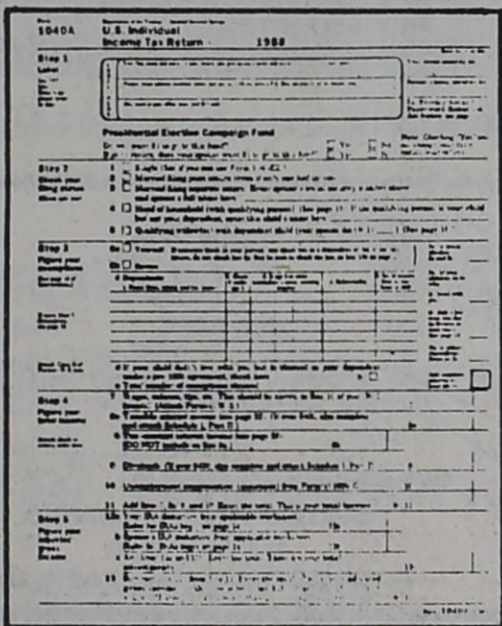

## Merger proposed for FEC, SWEC

An annual membership meeting of the Farmers' Electric Cooperative, Inc. (FEC), of New Mexico has been set for April 15 at the Fort Sumner high school gym.

One issue that members will vote yes or no on is the question of merging the cooperative with Southwestern Electric Cooperative (SWEC), located in Clayton, into FEC.

SWEC members will vote on the same question Feb. 28 in Clayton. A series of informational meetings will be set up in communities served by FEC in March.

The idea of a merger has been discussed by their respective boards for some time. Last October, a study group made up of members of both boards was set up which hammered out a proposed pact. It contains a January 1991 time limit stipulating if all aspects of the merger are not met by then, members of both co-ops will

have to vote on whether to continue the process.

A negative vote by either group will halt the merger.

The advantage of a merger to SWEC is a reduction in electric rates to the FEC level. Although eventual rate hikes will be faced by FEC, the hikes will not be as large or as soon if the merger is okayed. Rate stability is one of the big advantages being touted to members of both co-ops.

Also, 15 regulatory agencies in Oklahoma, Texas and New Mexico have to okay the merger. If all goes well, the merger still cannot take place before Jan. 1, 1990.

Among the provisions in the conditions of merger is a written statement from each co-op's power suppliers that the merger will not affect or impair the respective power supply contracts.

The proposed pact calls for 12 trustees, 5 from the territory now served by SWEC and 7 from FEC areas. In the second year of merger, though, the board will be reduced to 7 trustee districts from the combined co-op - 2 will be designated to serve the current SWEC area.

SWEC members will automatically become members of FEC upon merger. FEC

will return capital credits to SWEC members for both the period of time prior to the merger and after the merger in the same manner as capital credits are returned to FEC members.

No employees of either co-op would lose their jobs as a result of the merger.
