"One thing the Iraqi women are really excited about is learning to drive! They see us (women) driving our military vehicles and they get all excited about driving like the Americans!"
Women are definitely making an impact on the changes taking place in Iraq. They are mobilizing their efforts and taking part in the processes that they can, in accordance with the Muslim faith and traditions.
