Lack of adequate rainfall for the past 2 years coupled with lower than normal yields for the last year's cotton crop, may
mean South Plains cotton farmers already have enough of some nutrients stored in their soil for this year's crop, says a soil chemist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. "Considering the drought we have experienced over the
last 2 years, particularly last year with the reduced yields that we have over the entire area, residual soil nutrients must be considered," Dr. Michael Hickey, head of the Extension Service Soil Testing Laboratory here, caution cotton farmers.
