
The awards were presented at the Texico High School 1990 Honors Night Awards program on May 24 in the Education Complex.

Fillet of Beef with **Roquefort Sauce and Mixed Nuts**

Recipe of Week

1 center cut piece beef tenderloin (approximate weight 2 pounds) 1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. freshly ground pepper 1 tbs. vegetable oil 2 tsp. peanut oil for searing 1 tsp. clarified butter 1 tbs. minced shallots 3 tbs. dry Madeira wine 1/2 c. beef bouillon 2 oz. creamy Roquefort cheese 4 tbs. unsalted butter, softened 3 tbs. heavy cream, whipped until stiff 2 tbs. lightly toasted pine nuts 2 tbs. lightly toasted walnut pieces 2 tbs. toasted sliced blanched almonds 1 tbs. chopped fresh parsley

Salt and pepper meat, then rub vegetable oil over the surface. Keep meat refrigerated, loosely covered with plastic wrap. One hour before cooking, remove from refrigerator and bring to room temperature. In a large heavy - bottomed skillet, heat peanut oil and clarified butter until very hot. Sear meat on all sides (about 4 minutes). Transfer meat to a wire rack or grid: let rest a minimum of 20 minutes. Discard cooking fat. Add chopped shallots and Madeira to the skillet; reduce to a glaze. Add the beef bouillon and bring to a boil. Reduce to a syrupy consistency. Scrape into a smaller skillet, if desired. Set aside. Beat the Roquefort and butter in a small bowl until smooth and refrigerate. About 30 minutes before serving, preheat oven to 450 degrees. Pat beef dry with paper towels. Finish beef fillets on a rack in the oven; 18 minutes for rare; 19 minutes for medium- rare. Meanwhile, gently reheat the syrupy sauce in the skillet; swirl in cheese and butter mixture one spoonful at a time. Fold the whipped cream into the sauce, off the heat. Spoon sauce onto heated service platter. Slice meat and arrange overlapping. Garnish with nuts mixed with parsley. Serve at once.

PROWL CULTI-SPRAY

PROWL CULTI-SPRAY (postemergence incorporated) is a technique designed to control late-season weeds, and is particularly suited to areas of low rainfall or irrigated corn. It combines cultivation to destroy existing weeds and PROWL, or PROWL plus atrazine, to prevent future weed seed germination.

CULTI-SPRAY applications can be made from the 4-inch stage of corn growth as late as layby cultivation. Cultivate and destroy all emerged weeds prior to application with a sweep-type or rolling cultivator operated at sufficient speed to throw at least one inch of soil over the base of the corn plants. This will prevent direct contact of the zone of brace root formation by PROWL during application.



Apply PROWL, or PROWL plus atrazine tank mixture, with a ground sprayer, covering the soil uniformly. Incorporate PROWL treatments uniformly in the top one inch of soil with a sweep-type or rolling cultivator or by irrigation or rainfall within seven days of application.

These treatments effectively control late season weeds for cleaner fields and easier harvesting. The tank-mix treatment is particularly effective against shattercane, velvetleaf, Venice mallow and smartweed.




