So the next BTM meeting will be Monday, June 11, at 8 p.m. at the Spur Restaurant, which is due to re-open that day.

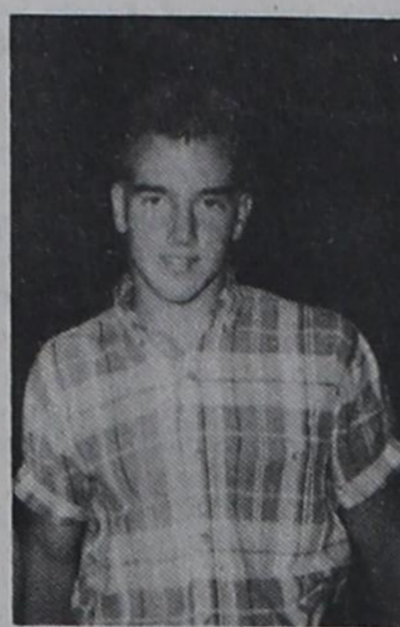

## 'Brainstorming' session upcoming

A "brainstorming session" to begin plans for a major cleanup in Texico is scheduled at 6:30 p.m. mdt Monday in classroom No. 5 at Texico High School.

The public is invited. Texico councilman Ronnie Warmuth is spearheading a

campaign. What the cleanup exactly will entail will be determined by the suggestions made at the Monday session - and the support of the community, its churches and organizations.

Warmuth reported that the Texico-Farwell Rotary Club will be sending a representative to the session - Richard Hadley.

Also, the Texico United Pentecostal Church will participate.

And Warmuth said that Mae Stone said to "put her on the list" to help out.

The idea behind the brainstorming session is to get as many ideas as possible. This will be followed up with more specific sessions to coordinate the work.

The cleanup is tentatively scheduled to begin in September. It may take a day, a week, a month, or years.

Early ideas range from picking up trash to removing large pieces of rusted junk to planting flowers and shrubs.

## Curry County election nears

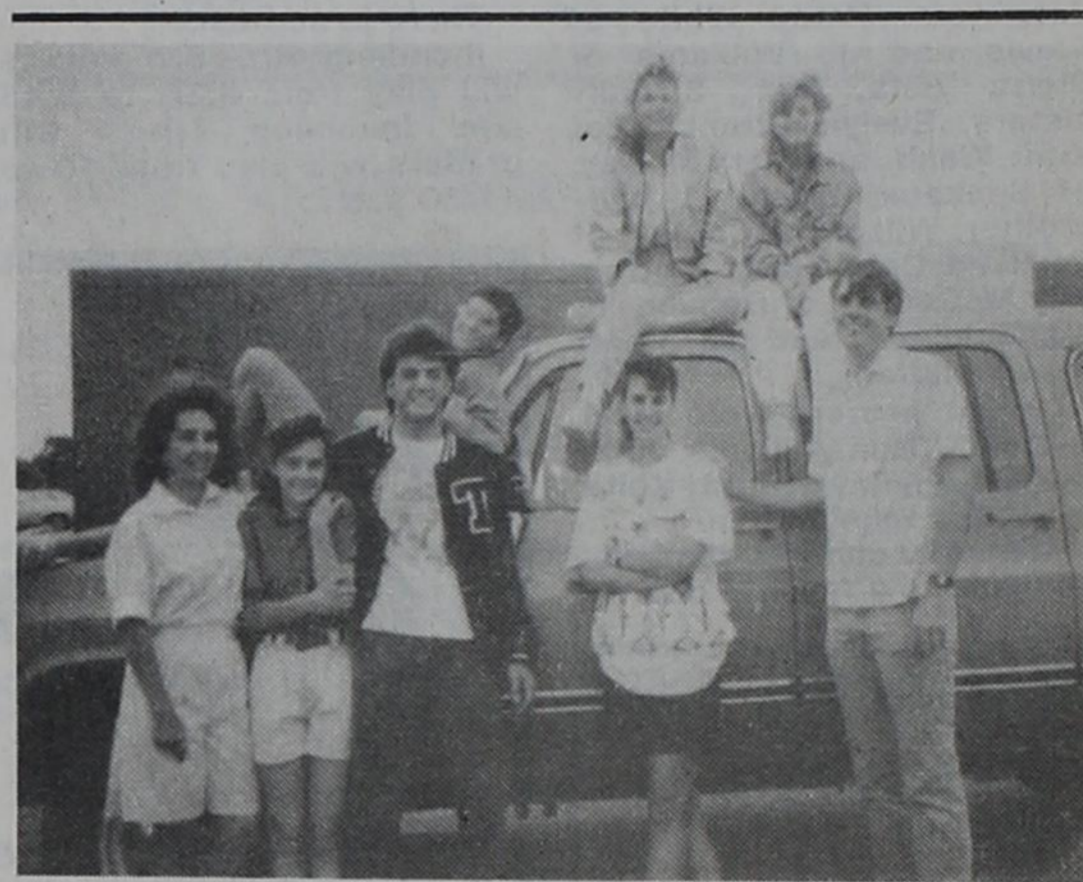
Curry County voters go to the polls Tuesday for the primary elections.

The awards were presented along with a program of music which showed the accomplishments of the students during the year. The band is directed by Mr. Robert Simmons, Jr.

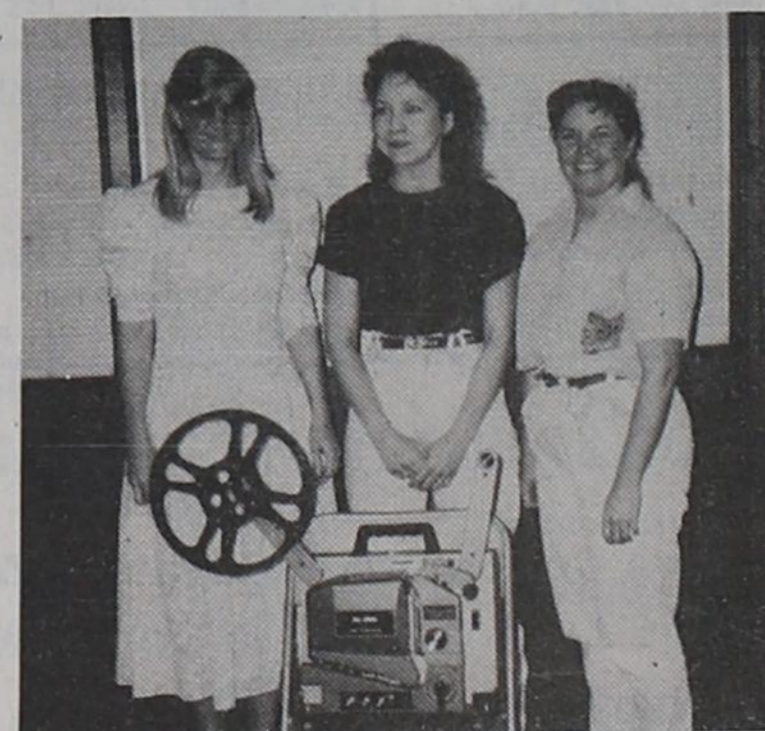

**Recipe of Week**

**Fillet of Beef with Roquefort Sauce and Mixed Nuts**

- 1 center cut piece beef tenderloin (approximate weight 2 pounds)
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. freshly ground pepper
- 1 tbs. vegetable oil
- 2 tsp. peanut oil for searing
- 1 tsp. clarified butter
- 1 tbs. minced shallots
- 3 tbs. dry Madeira wine
- 1/2 c. beef bouillon
- 2 oz. creamy Roquefort cheese
- 4 tbs. unsalted butter, softened
- 3 tbs. heavy cream, whipped until stiff
- 2 tbs. lightly toasted pine nuts
- 2 tbs. lightly toasted walnut pieces
- 2 tbs. toasted sliced blanched almonds
- 1 tbs. chopped fresh parsley

Salt and pepper meat, then rub vegetable oil over the surface. Keep meat refrigerated, loosely covered with plastic wrap. One hour before cooking, remove from refrigerator and bring to room temperature. In a large heavy-bottomed skillet, heat peanut oil and clarified butter until very hot. Sear meat on all sides (about 4 minutes). Transfer meat to a wire rack or grid; let rest a minimum of 20 minutes. Discard cooking fat. Add chopped shallots and Madeira to the skillet; reduce to a glaze. Add the beef bouillon and bring to a boil. Reduce to a syrupy consistency. Scrape into a smaller skillet, if desired. Set aside. Beat the Roquefort and butter in a small bowl until smooth and refrigerate. About 30 minutes before serving, preheat oven to 450 degrees. Pat beef dry with paper towels. Finish beef fillets on a rack in the oven; 18 minutes for rare; 19 minutes for medium-rare. Meanwhile, gently reheat the syrupy sauce in the skillet; swirl in cheese and butter mixture one spoonful at a time. Fold the whipped cream into the sauce, off the heat. Spoon sauce onto heated service platter. Slice meat and arrange overlapping. Garnish with nuts mixed with parsley. Serve at once.

This recipe was a finalist in the Texas Beef Cook-Off sponsored by the Texas Cattle Women.
