A "rendition" is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the
taxable property you owned or controlled on January 1st of
Who must file a rendition? You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal
property that is used to produce income-such as the property that is used to produce income-such as the
inventory and equipment used by a business. If you ren-
der late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendi-
tion, a $10 \%$ to $50 \%$ penalty may be imposed
Are there any advantages to you?
The advantages of filing a rendition are:
You give your opinion of your property's value. The
appraisal district must notify you in writitg of any value appraisal district must notify you in writing of any value
change and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.
You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will
go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong
address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments. You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify
the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 2004. The district will look at
your property before assigning a value in 2005 .

What's the deadline? The last day for filing 2005 renditions is April 15. You can
