subdivision or mobile home park approved in accordance with applicable ordinances and regulations.
Section 3. Regulations of Mobile Home.
A. No mobile home shall be occupied, located or used for residential purposes in any zoning district in which single-family, site-built housing
s not an allowable use or on any lot in which single-family, site-built housing is not allowed as of right.
B. In addition, no mobile home shall be occupied, located, or used
for residential purposes unless an Aesthetic Review Permit has been for residential purposes unless an Aesthetic Review Permit has bee
obtained pursuant to the provisions of Section 4 of this ordinance obtained pursuant to the provisions of S
Section 4. Aesthetic Review Permit.
A. the purpose of the Aesthetic Review Permit is to preserve the property's values of residential neighborhoods and protest the public's general welfare by assuring that certain minimum aesthetic standards are
met before mobile homes are occupied, located, or used for residential purposes.
