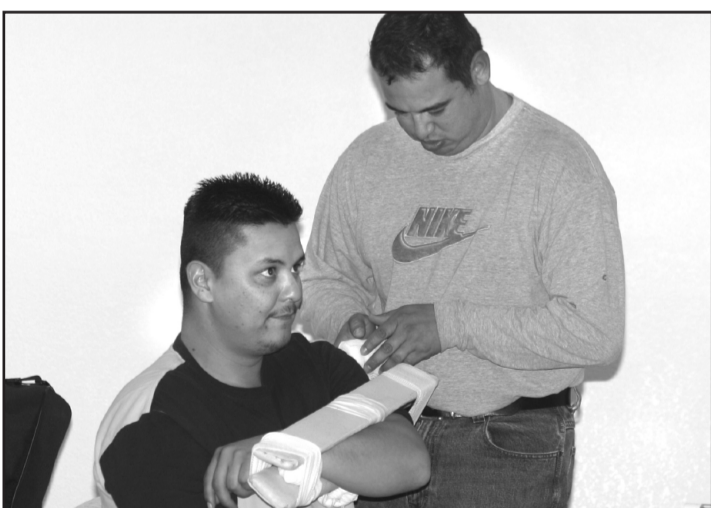

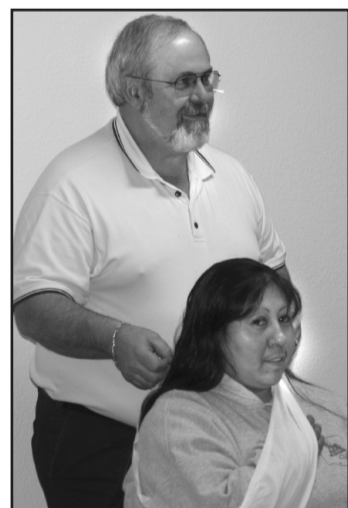

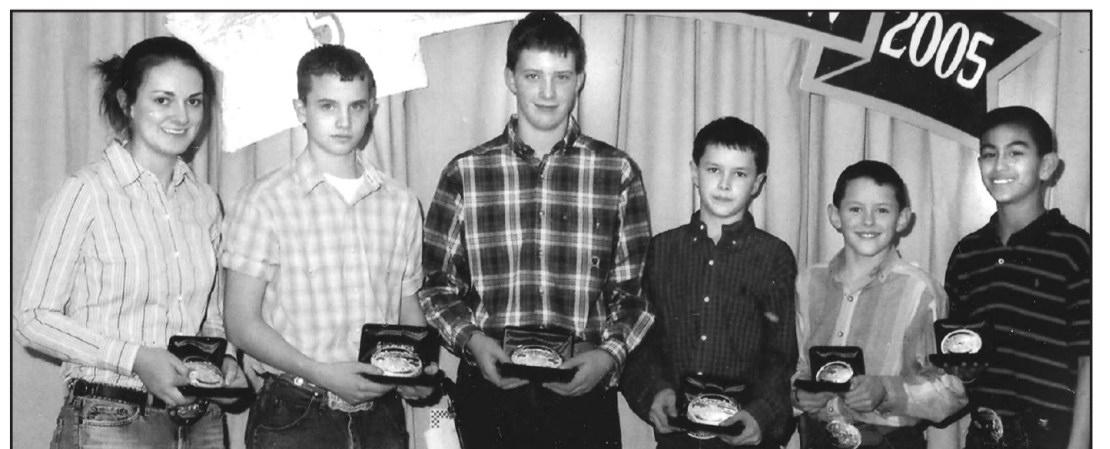

Scioli appointed to Texico council

The Texico City Council on Tuesday appointed Doug Scioli, a former city councilman, to the council.

He will be on the next city election ballot, in March 2005.

He replaces Sharon Askew, who has resigned.

Councilman Oran Jay Autrey said three persons applied for the post - Kirk Roberts, Rick Queener and Scioli.

In other business, the council:

-- Asked city attorney Marion Ty Rutter to make sure it's legal for Lewis Foster, who isn't a city employee, to receive the city's general liability insurance coverage for mowing work at the cemetery. If so, Foster will be contracted by the cemetery association to do this work.

-- Heard Autrey say the city needs to look at what it's charging for cemetery plots. He said a lot of Clovis folks re buying plots in Texico because it's

a lot cheaper than Clovis.

Farwell charges \$500 for a plot. Texico charges \$300.

-- Received one bid, from Stephens Construction, of Clovis, to bring in fly ash for \$12.50 a ton. It was accepted, with Autrey, the firm's owner, abstaining.

-- Will seek a \$75,000 grant from the state's Department of Transportation for chip sealing streets. If it's approved, then combined with other grant funds on hand, all the city's streets can be chip sealed.

-- Gave Fire Chief Lewis Cooper approval to have an EMT basic class here.

The cost is \$3,000. He said about 6 or 7 members of his department want to

take it.

The class will be open to others, also. The Tribune will report later on whether Texas residents can take it and become certified; Cooper will look into this.

There will be a cost to folks taking the course, yet to be determined.

-- Heard assistant city clerk Carolyn Johnson note that the city's water and garbage rate hikes will be included in the bills going out this week.

-- Will check with Rutter on the legal work needed to move a road on Orlando Ortiz' property which runs to the city dump.

-- Heard Autrey say that he will try to set up a community meeting for folks to learn about the proposed Ute Lake water project.

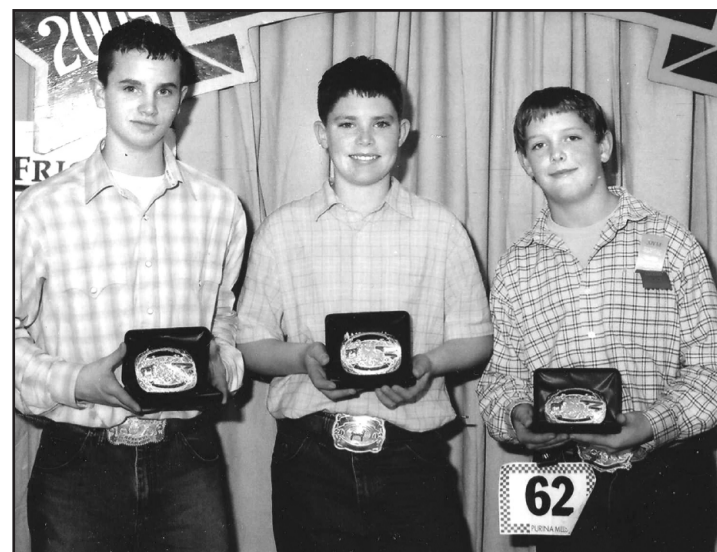

What is Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)?
AYP represents the annual academic performance targets in reading and math that the state, school districts and schools must reach to be considered on track for 100% proficiency by school year 2013-14. AYP is part of state and federal statute. Federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB), 2001. Sec. 1111 (b)(F) says that each state shall establish a timeline for adequate yearly progress. The timeline shall ensure that no later than 12 years after the 2001-2002 school year all students in each group described in subparagraph (C)(v) will meet or exceed the state's proficient level of academic achievement on the state's assessments. New Mexico Statute Article 2C Assessment and Accountability Sec. 22-2C-8 NMSA 1978, Adequate Yearly Progress says "The state shall institute an 'adequate yearly progress program' that measures public schools' improvements..."

What do schools have to do in order to make AYP?

- Schools need to:
- a) Achieve a 95% participation rate on state assessments.
 - b) Reach targets for proficiency or reduce non-proficiency
 - c) Reach targets for the attendance rate for elementary and middle schools and the graduation rate for high schools.

Who has to make AYP?

The state, school districts, schools, and subgroups of 25 or more students within schools. The subgroups include Ethnicity/Race: Caucasian, African American, Asian/Pacific, Hispanic, Native American; as well as Economically Disadvantaged (FRLP), Students with Disabilities (Special Ed), and English Language Learners (ELL).

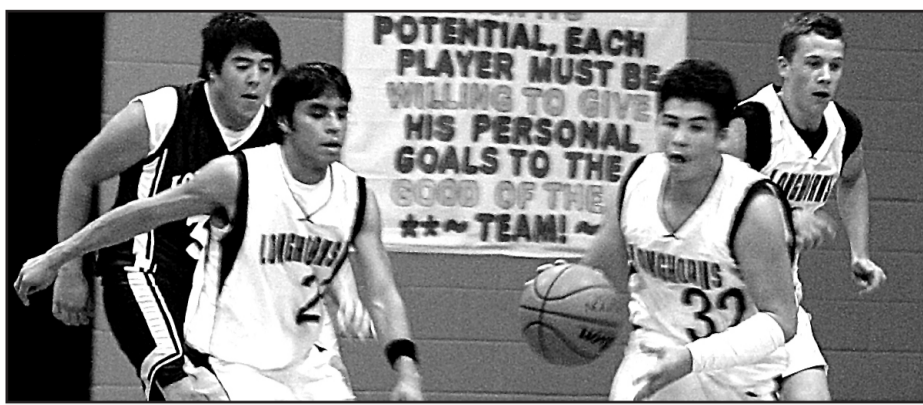

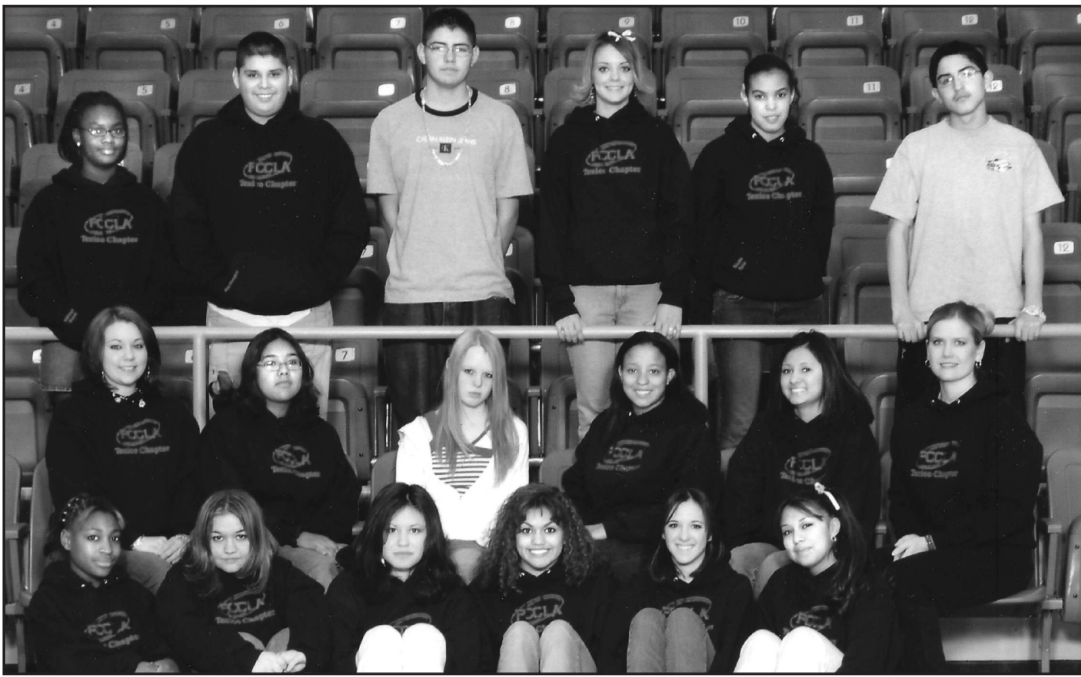

Post Office sorting changed

There's been a major change in how mail is handled that comes to the Farwell Post Office.

What is now happening is that when folks drop off mail in Farwell for a Farwell postal box, the mail is sent to Lubbock for sorting first.

That's right -- it goes from Farwell to Lubbock and back to Farwell the next morning.

How come, you ask?

Well, because Lubbock has new sorting machines that puts mail into numerical order. Thus, when the mail comes back to Farwell it's in order by box numbers.

And this saves a whole lot of time, explained Farwell Postmaster Lynne Mahaney.

For example, Farwell receives each morning 1,400 to 16,00 pieces of mail. They re getting all this mail in trails -- pre-sorted.

Thus, they can put up the mail in record time. No sorting is needed.

And this sorting also is being done for Farwell's

rural routes.

Mrs. Mahaney asked that folks, when they send a letter to someone in Farwell, use the correct box number, and not the street address.

If only a street address

is used, the Lubbock machine can't sort it correctly, so just puts those letters on a separate tray that must be sorted after it arrives back in Farwell.
