At a minimum, an electric shock can be painful In extreme cases, a shock can kill." NBC

NBC emphasized that the stunt was designed and monitored by professionals and that the general public should not attempt stunts using electricity, but particitrying it either. "This isn't right," said one contestant. After completing the maze, another said, "I'm still shaking. I can feel that pulse inside my body."
