And as He entered a certain village, ten leprous men who stood at a distance met Him; and they raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us"] And whon, He saw them, He said to them, "Go and

And it came about that as they were going, they were cleansed. Now one of them, when he saw that he had been healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice. And he fell on his face at His feet, giving thanks to Him. And he was a Samaritan.
And Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine - where are they? Was no one found who turned back to give glory to God, except this foreigner?" and He said to him, "Rise, and go your way; your faith has made you well."
Man is quick to express his needs to the Lord, but very slow to give thanks. Think for a moment and ask yourself this question: "How often do I thank the Lord?" Then think of how often you ask the Lord in prayer to help you, to meet your needs, and to be with you.
