## Above-average precipitation aids

Even though the amount of participation received on the
Southern High Plains of Texas during the latter portion of Southern High Plains of Texas during the latter portion of approximately 17 percent above the average received in the area up to 1980.
The benefits of the above-average precipitation and an increased conservation effort were reflected in the reduced rate of water depletion in the Ogallala Aquifer that occurred
during the 1980 s . The Ogallala Aquifer in the 36,000 square
