such as emergency room coverage. Also, money can be set aside for physician recruitment, which may be used to attract, start up and maintain a new physician's practice. These agreements are structured so that the physician has a definite obligation to the community to which he is committed to.

Heard Hamar noted that the city's five year contract with Waste Management to pick up the city's garbage ends this fall. He has been trying to contact Waste Management for about six months to discuss renewing it but had received no response. He will continue trying.

Heard Hamar note that the state has checked the

intersection of 60-70-84 and decided it deserves a traffic signal. It's been approved for the 5-year list.

After discussing Texas' possible eventual 4-laning of the Amarillo highway into Farwell, Snider said the New Mexico part will still be at 2 lanes.

The Amarillo highway portion between Friona and the Deaf Smith County line is being 4-laned now. Bids may be taken next year on the part between Bovina and Friona. No funds have been appropriated for the part between Bovina and Farwell.

Wilhite voted to ENMR board

ENMR Telephone Cooperative held its annual meeting Saturday in Clovis.

Four directors were re-elected: Frank Blackburn, whose exchange includes the Farwell and Pleasant Hill areas; Dee Perschbacher; Walt Eastland and Larry Wallin.

Hoyt Pattison, whose exchange also includes Farwell and Pleasant Hill, and who has served the past three years as board president, was defeated by Kenny Wilhite for re-election.

Eastland turned back a challenge by Fred Steig.

ENMR showed a strong income and expense statement. The operating margin excess of income over expenses for 1990 totalled \$2,817,738, up from \$1,366,812 the preceding year.

Four by-law changes were approved, all by acclamation.

Two clarified some language. One changed the number of days to receive a nominating petition from 5 days prior to the annual meeting to 20 days prior.

Also, the by-laws had stated that only loans could be gotten from the REA. Since the government's financing of

REA is in jeopardy, the by-laws were changed to allow loans from other sources.

Manager Robert Harris gave an update on ENMR's operations. Last year, Harris was honored by the national association of telephone cooperatives as the top executive of the year.

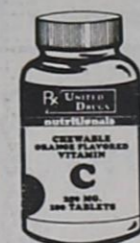

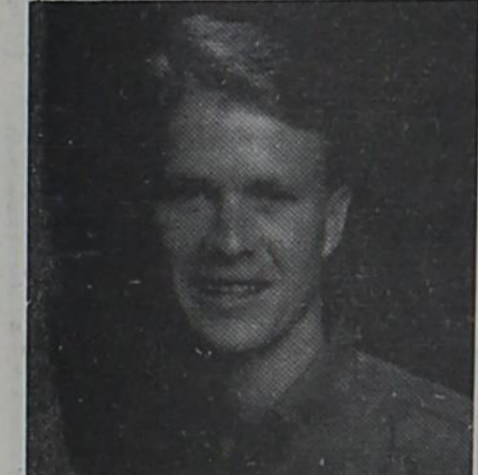

Farwell's Shawn Stewart won the triple jump event at the boys' Region 1-1A Track Meet at Levelland last weekend.

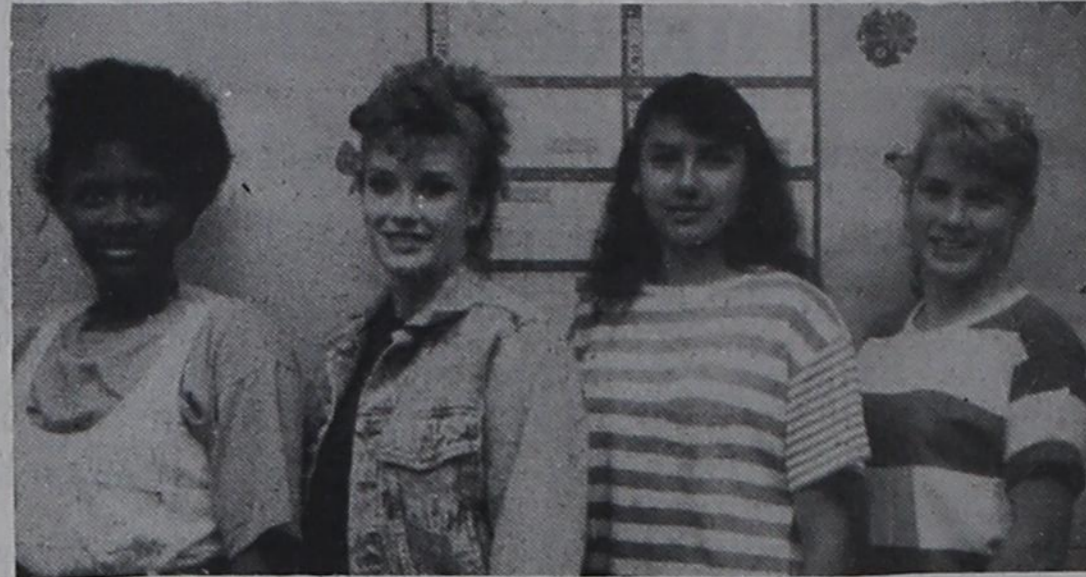
Stewart had a mark of 44-8 1/2. So Stewart will compete at the state contest next week.

Recipe of Week

Snickerdoodles

3/4 c. (1 1/2 sticks) butter or margarine
1 1/2 c. sugar
2 eggs
1 tsp. vanilla
2 3/4 c. sifted Martha White All - Purpose Flour
2 tsp. cream of tartar
1 tsp. baking soda
1/2 tsp. salt
2 tsp. cinnamon
2 Tbs. sugar
Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease a large baking sheet. Cream butter and 1 1/2 c. sugar together in mixing bowl until light and fluffy. Add eggs and vanilla; beat well. Sift flour, cream of tartar, soda and salt together; blend into creamed mixture. (For easier handling, chill dough 1 hour before shaping into balls). Combine cinnamon and 2 Tbs. sugar in a small bowl. Shape dough into 1-inch balls; roll in cinnamon-sugar mixture. Place balls of dough 2 inches apart on prepared baking sheet. Bake 8-10 minutes or until light golden brown. Cool on wire racks. Make about 48 cookies.

Farwell graduate singled out for bravery in war

Editor's note: This article was written by Gary Mitchell, a staff writer with the Clovis News-Journal. It is being reprinted with the permission of the News-Journal. Beal, the subject of the article, graduated from Farwell High School in 1982 and is a nephew of Delbert Lingnau, of Farwell.

A Clovis area seaman has been singled out for his bravery and cool level-headedness in operations apart from the Persian Gulf War.

Lenny Beal, son of Tom Beal, of Clovis, and Evelyn Martin, of New York, was promoted to petty officer second class in December. Previously, he was part of a detachment assigned to provide armed air cover for the first maritime interception mission in which the first U.S. warning shots were fired at an Iraqi vessel during Operation Desert Shield.

Beal was awarded the Air Medal for the rescue of 13 shipwrecked survivors in the northwest Pacific in October 1989. In addition, he received the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Coast Guard Special Operations Ribbon and Sea Service Ribbon.

A 1982 graduate of Farwell High School, Beal attended Eastern New Mexico for 1 1/2 years and worked as an electrician in Clovis for four years before entering the U.S. Navy in 1988.

"I've enjoyed the Navy quite a bit," Beal said. "It's been good to me. I've done some exciting things." One of those exciting things included the air-sea rescue in the Pacific Ocean between Alaska and the Soviet Union.

"It was during a previous cruise in the fall of 1989," Beal said. "We were in the North Pacific, off the Aleutian Islands. In fact, we were close to Attu Island, the last island in the chain."

A Korean freighter had broken up and was taking on water when his ship, the U.S.S. Mahlon S. Tisdale, arrived at the scene, Beal said.

"We were basically tasked to rescue the crew from the freighter" he said. "It was all a helicopter operation. They lowered me down to the deck of the freighter, and I prepped the survivors of the ship to be hoisted on our ship."

It took a total of three flights, taking five survivors at a time on the first two trips and three on the last. Beal stayed on the deck of the sinking freighter 40 to 45 minutes until the rescue was completed.

Another close call came when he was stationed in the Persian Gulf from May to October 1990. As an air crew member of the Helicopter Anti-Submarine Warfare Squadron (Light) 33, Beal's helicopter crew experienced an in-flight emergency.

"We had a temporary hydraulic failure in the helicopter,"

Beal said. "We provided some emergency corrective measures and we landed safely."

Beal made it sound simple, but it actually wasn't, said Ensign Jeff Harter, the public affairs officer for the squadron.

"To attempt a recovery landing of a helicopter aboard a small-decked ship without hydraulics is very difficult," said Harter. "It takes a lot of coordination among the crew members to carry it out efficiently. Without assistance from the air crew, recovery would have been impossible."

For his efforts, Beal was nominated for the Commander Anti-Submarine Warfare Wing (Pacific Fleet) "Pro of the Week" Award.

Before the hostilities broke out in the Persian Gulf area, Beal was part of an historic maritime interception operation.

"While in the Persian Gulf, we were attached to the U.S.S. Reid," said Beal. "I was a sensor operator. We did everything from ship's surveillance (giving the ship a look at what's over the horizon beyond the sensor) to serving as a door gunner. Our mission was to intercept any suspected vessels in violation of the blockade."

They did intercept a vessel in the middle of September, said Beal.

"We fired the first U.S. warning shots directed at ships carrying contraband," he said. "It was an Iraqi-flagged tanker. We trailed the ship a number of hours. We fired the warning shots to board it. We never boarded it, but we trailed them to the Gulf of Oman. Then we handed them off to another ship."

While in the Persian Gulf, Beal made a port call into Kuwait City in May.

"We spent some time in the embassy," he said. "I'd like to go back sometime and compare it now to what it was before the war happened. A number of families hosted dinners for members of the ship and gave us a tour of the city. It was very enjoyable."

Beal said he was elated about the news of the war's end and the homecoming of troops. "I was glad to see it happen. It will be good to see the guys coming back home."

Beal is married to the former Jill Jameson, of Clovis. They have two children - Mark, 3, and Jillian, 17 months.
