Sgt. Rudy Sanchez answered questions from his
daughter Andrea's classmates about a multitud of Sgt. Sanchez is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Rudolph Sanchez Sr. of Farwell. His son Benjamin is in 3rd grade here, and his daughter Andrea is in 2nd.
The Sanchez family also has two other children Alexandria, 2, and Cregory, 5 mis first time on May 25
Sanchez is assigned with the HHC 4th of the 70th Army 1st Armored Division. He was stationed in Germany when the conflict in the Middle East began to heat up. He was sent to Saudi Arabia on Dec. 31 and left there on May 2. with his family.
