PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT Senate Joint Resolution 42 proposes a constitutional amendment hat would authorize the newly created county education districts to of the market value of the residence homestead of a married or unmarried adult. The percentage exempted could not exceed $20 \%$ of such market value, and the amount exempted could not be less than $\$ 5,000$. PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 5 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the legislature to pass general laws authorizing Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board or its successor to issue and sell up to $\$ 300$ million of general obligation bonds to finance educational loans to students. The maximum net effective interest rate to
be borne by the bonds would be set by law. The amendment would be borne by the bonds would be set by law. The amendment would
also authorize the legislature to poovde for the investment of bond proceeds and to establish an interest and sinking fund to pay the ponds and provide for the investment of such fund. Bonds authorized under this amendment would be paid from the first money coming into the treasury in each fiscal year that is not otherwise appropriated by the constitution, less any amount in an interest and sinking fund
established at the end of the preceding year that is pledged to the established at the end of the prec
