Tharp elected Texico mayor

The Texico City Council voted 3-0 to name councilman Nathan "Butch" Tharp as the city's new mayor. There was no discussion before the vote.

The council must now appoint a new councilman to fill that post vacated by Tharp.

The council also voted 3-0 to increase the mayor's salary from \$20 per council meeting to \$50 per council meeting. This raise doesn't go into effect until the next mayoral election next spring.

The council felt a raise was necessary due to the amount of time a mayor needs to spend working on city business.

In other business, the council:

- Allowed Dwayne Hill to remove about 15 feet of curbing at 508 Anderson for a driveway.

- Referred a request to move a 24'x28' steel structure from Clovis to 801 State St. to the building inspector.

- Appointed Tharp as the city's representative to the Eastern Plains Council of Government.

- Voted down a request from councilwoman Carolyn Burrows to record the city minutes.

- Heard cemetery board member Lewis Cooper report that the fence still hasn't been placed around the cemetery. The contractor was given a 30 day deadline.

- Plans to increase the fee for variance requests from \$40 to \$75 because a new publication form prepared by the council is now being used.

- Heard Tharp report on a highway department meeting he attended Tuesday. The project to 4-lane the Amarillo highway from its intersection in Texico with the Lubbock highway to the state line (where Texas is now 4-laning) is planned later this year.

- Will send specifications to the state for water lines that will connect present wells before Sept. 9 with the hope the state will give the city a grant for the work.

- Heard Mrs. Burrows report that the county will build an all-weather road to the cemetery and that it's included in the 1993-94 road plan, but some of that plan is running late.

Texico's enrollment down a bit

Texico's first day enrollment declined slightly from last year.

Total enrollment is 519 students, down about 6 students from last year. But it is 26 students above the 1991-92 school year.

Texico High School has 158 students, down from 165.

Texico Junior High enrolled 133, down from 136. were 136 in the junior high.

Texico Elementary enrolled 228, up from 224.

The first day enrollment figures include pre-school students who are only in school part of the school day.


Partain used a first team squad and a partial second team squad, and rotated the remainder of the players in as he could. Some of the players were asked to play 92 plays while others played very little.
