



Christmas remembered

A Christmas column from wife Judy:

When I was a child growing up, my parents barely made ends meet. There were five of us kids for them to care for. Christmas was a time when they went out of their way to see to it that each of us received new socks and underwear and pajamas and a few new toys.

Mom and Dad would wait until all of us were asleep before they would start being Santa's helpers. Often they would stay up until about 3 a.m., assembling the bikes and wagons and things that Santa brought so that Christmas surprises would be ready for us on Christmas morning.

They would often sleep all Christmas afternoon because they were so tired. Luckily, we had new toys to keep us busy. And many Christmas evenings, our family would sit around the kitchen table playing board games and nibbling Christmas goodies.

Each year we heard the above.
stories about how happy our parents were that they could provide more for us than be about their parents had provided for of trees.

According to Mom and Dad, Christmas in the 1920's and 1930's consisted of a stocking full of fruit, nuts and candy canes with a ball or marbles or something little added for fun.

My folks often mentioned that a special Christmas treat in Chicago was getting an orange in their stocking - citrus fruit was not ordinary fare in those days.

Katherine White (who grew up in South Texas years after my folks) recently told me that Christmas for her meant getting an apple in her stocking oranges were the regular fare in South Texas, but apples were a special holiday treat.


The monument will be built just to the south of the memorial plaque to John Aldridge. It will face 3rd Street and be about 10 yards from the street. It will stand amid a cluster








Proposed Texico Community Center








Christmas plays





Here's a look at area cotton production estimates

Production estimates for the High Plains have not been an easy thing to develop for the 1992 crop according to Lubbock-based Plains Cotton Growers (PCG).

Best estimates from area crop watchers now place the size of the High Plains crop between 1.35 and 1.37 million bales, nearly 150,000 bales below the December USDA estimate for crop reporting districts 1-N and 1-S. Harvested acreage is expected to be near the USDA estimate of 1.39 million for the area.

"The 1992 crop will definitely go down in the books as one of the strangest on record," notes PCG Executive Vice President Donald Johnson. "The fact that we lost over one and one-half million acres of cotton is noteworthy by itself, adding in the fact that 1992 will be one of the highest quality crops ever produced from a predominantly a late crop makes it that much more noteworthy."

Total crop losses for the area were approximately 52 percent of expected plantings and averaged as much as 60 percent when accounting for the fact that only 2.7 -2.8 million acres had actually been planted when the heavy rainfall and seedling disease problems that followed swept through the area.

Acreage figures provided by the State ASCS office in College Station indicate approximately 1.475 million cotton acres were certified as standing and slightly under 1.672 million acres reported failed in PCG's 25-county area. The report also indicates that total planted acres were expected to be over 3.1 million.

PCG calculations indicate that a crop of 1.37 million bales would produce average yields of

473 pounds per acre from 1.39 million harvested acres or 445 pounds per acre from 1.475 million acres. Each scenario is well below the 524 pound average yield estimated by USDA to acheive their 1.51 million bale estimate.



Texico begins taking action on its water rates

The difficult task of raising more revenue for the water department was faced by the Texico City Council Tuesday. But the council did take some action:

- Began assessing a \$20 fee for re-connecting water tapins.

- Delinquent notices will now be sent out for unpaid water bills after one month; currently it's been two months. Thus, a line can be disconnected 30 days earlier.

- Some residents give partial payments, which have always been accepted. The problem here is that the total owed gets larger and larger when just a partial payment is made each month. From now on, this won't be allowed indefinitely. If a partial payment is made, a schedule must be approved to eliminate the debt.

The council was told that when a person is very ill, or there's a small child in the house, then the city can't do anything when water bills aren't paid. This topic came up when it was noted that one resident, due to illness, owes \$647 on his water bill. "If we tried to do anything about this, we'd get sued," said City Clerk-Treasurer Marie Christian.

The council held a lengthy discussion on where to place the water rates at. Currently, the minimum monthly charge (under 4,000 gallons) is \$11 for city residents and \$15.30 for those outside the city.

One suggestion made was to keep the minimum rates where they are, because some of these users would be hardpressed to pay higher fees; but increase the higher rates.

Councilman Butch Tharp noted that the state looks at a city's minimum rates when grants are sought, like for new wells. In the past few years, the state has given Texico two large grants for new wells. But the city's average water billing is at \$16.84; the state wants an \$18 minimum. If the minimum isn't raised to the \$18 total, it was indicated Texico would be hard-pressed the next time it would seek a grant.

The council also has been urged by its water department to

Parmer County gets \$59,000

The Parmer County Commissioners Tuesday received word from the state on the amount of extra money the county would get under the Members of Hamlin Memostate's new program of leaving more prisoners housed in county jails.

Last year, Parmer County got \$69,000. For the coming year it will be \$59,000.

signed its annual agreement with the state for funds to help pay utility bills for those in need. The county provides funds for this, too.

Ernest Anthony, who ends his tenure as a county commissioner this month after 16 years in the position, wasn't at the meeting. His wife took ill and was transported to the ICU unit at High Plains Baptist Hospital in Amarillo.

The commissioners also held an executive session on legal matters, called by County Judge Bonnie Clay-

replace the sewer line under the highway through town. This would entail a large rate hike. One suggestion was to raise rates \$7 or \$8 per user per month to take care of everything, including this project and new federally-mandated drinking water rules that includes new testing by city workers.

Currently, the city bills an average of \$6,355 per month for water usage, but collects only \$6,265.

It was pointed out that merely raising rates doesn't ensure that more funds will be collected. Some folks would cut back on their usage, for example,

Mayor Doyal LaRue asked city water department employees Billy Hammit and Matt Meeks to recommend water rate hikes at the next council meeting.

The mayor also said the city should wait on buying equipment and raising rates to cover the new federal safedrinking mandates until the city is forced to do something, since often federal mandates and deadlines are changed.

In other business the council:

- Received a recommendation from Mrs. Christian advising against raising the sewer rates. She noted that sewer bill collections are excellent.

She did note that in a few years the sludge will need to be cleaned from the lagoons at the plant. It's estimated this will cost about \$7,500. So the council earmarked \$250 a month from its current collections to be put into a fund for buying the cleaning equipment that will be needed down the road for this task.

- Approved the annual audit by De'Aun Willoughby, CPA. The only negative was a \$19,400 operating loss in the solid waste budget. This was forecast when rates were set several years ago. At that time, it was pointed out that a surplus would be in the budget for a few years, followed by a deficit. This account will probably be looked at next year by the council to put "in the black" again.

- Heard Texico Marshal Fry Urioste suggest that a charge be added for persons who are stopped on DWI suspicion but who refuse to take a breathylizer test. Currently, if a person refuses, he can have his license taken away.

What Urioste wants is to add a charge, with a stiff fine, on top of the fine for DWI - if the person refuses the test. Urioste said three motorists in the past two months refused


The topic was tabled until Tharp can check with the families involved, who are still having trouble with their sewer.

Scottish Oat Raisin Scones

1 egg About 1/2 c. buttermilk

2 Tbs. butter or margarine, melted and cooled

1 tsp. vanilla

1 c. quick - cooking oats, divided

3 c. Recip- Ease All Purpose Baking Mix

1/2 c. firmly packed brown sugar

1/2 c. raisins

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease a large baking sheet. Lightly beat egg in measuring cup; add enough buttermilk to make 2/3 c. In small bowl combine egg mixture, butter, vanilla and 3/4 c. oats; stir. Set aside for 5 minutes. In large mixing bowl, stir together Recip- Ease, brown sugar and raisins. Pour oat mixture over dry ingredients. Stir gently with fork until blended. Mixture may seem crumbly. Turn out onto surface dusted with baking mix. Press together to form a ball. Knead gently 8 to 10 times. Divide dough in half. Place both halves on prepared baking sheet and pat into 6 inch circles. Cut each circle into 8 wedges using a floured sharp knife or pizza cutter. Separate wedges slightly, leaving about 1/2" between each. Brush with buttermilk and sprinkle with remaining 1/4 c. oats. Bake 16 to 18 minutes or until golden brown. Makes 16 scones.

Country Soda Bread

3 c. Martha White All - Purpose Flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1 c. Martha White Self- Rising Cornmeal Mix

1 1/2 c. buttermilk

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Grease a baking sheet. Sift flour and soda together into mixing bowl. Stir in cornmeal; blend thoroughly. Stir in buttermilk with a fork just until a soft dough forms. Add small amounts of flour or buttermilk if dough seems too soft or too dry. Place dough onto lightly floured board or pastry cloth and knead gently until smooth, about 10 times. Form into a flat round loaf about 8 inches in diameter. Place on prepared baking sheet. Slash a cross into the top of the loaf with a sharp knife. Bake 30 to 35 minutes or until golden brown. Makes one loaf.

Savory Black Bean and Sausage Soup

1 lb. Tennessee Pride Country Sausage (mild or hot)

2 c. chopped onions

4 cloves garlic, minced

1 pound dried black beans, cooked including liquid*

2 Tbs. lemon juice

chopped fresh parsley (optional) Yogurt or sour cream (optional)

Assorted toppings such as salsa, chopped green onion, lemon wedges, chopped hard - cooked egg (optional)

Saute sausage, onions and garlic in a 6-quart soup pot or Dutch oven over medium heat until sausage is brown and onions are tender. Puree about 3 cups beans with 1/2 c. liquid in blender or food processor. Add sausage mixture with remaining beans and liquid; stir well. Bring to a boil; cover, reduce heat and simmer 20 to 30 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in lemon juice. Garnish each serving with parsley and a dollop of yogurt or sour cream or assorted toppings as desired. Makes 8 to 10 servings.

* Soak beans according to package directions beans according to package directions; drain. Add 7 c. fresh water and 1 1/2 tsp. salt. Cover and simmer about 2 hours or until tender. Add additional hot water as needed during cooking.

Chicken Stew with Sausage Dumplings

2 Tbs. butter or margarine

1 large onions, chopped 4 carrots, cut into 1 - inch pieces

5 ribs celery, cut into 1 - inch pieces 8 1/2 c. chicken broth, divided

in sausage. Add 1/2 c. broth and stir with a fork just until dough leaves sides of bowl. Slowly drop dough by heaping teaspoonfuls into boiling broth. Here are some quick holiday snack ideas

Here are some quick holiday snack ideas:

* Dip pretzels into melted almond bark or chocolate. It only takes a minute or two to melt the candy in a microwave.

Melt chocolate or almond bark in the microwave. Mix in peanuts or your favorite nuts or raisins. Drop spoonfuls of the mixture onto waxed paper.

* Put peanut butter on the open end of a Bugles Corn chip. Dip that end into melted chocolate or almond bark.

Spread peanut butter onto Ritz Crackers. Place a second cracker on top to make a sandwich. Dip each cracker sandwich into melted chocolate.

* For quick Santa cookies: Dip both ends of a Nutter Butter peanut butter sandwich cookie into thin white frosting leaving the middle part of the cookie unfrosted. Dip one of the ends part way into red decorating sugar to form the cap leaving a fringe of white frosting showing. Squeeze two chocolate frosting eyes (or use tiny chocolate chips) and a red frosting nose (or use a little red cinnamon candy) onto each cookie.

* If you don't have time to bake, purchase ready - made plain cookies. Decorate with homemade or store bought icings and decorations. Personalize each with the names of guests or family members; use as place cards.

 Decorate bear shaped graham cracker snacks with red and white icing to look like little Santas.

* Cut flour tortillas into 6 - 8 wedges each. Fry in deep oil until they are slightly puffed and golden brown. Drain. Shake in a bag with 1/4 c. sugar and 1/2 tsp. cinnamon. Serve warm.

Combine 1 envelope ranch - style salad dressing mix; 3/4 c. oil; 1 tsp. lemon pepper; 1/4 tsp. garlic powder; 1/4 tsp onion powder; 2 12 oz. pkgs. of oyster crackers. Mix well to coat the crackers. Pour onto a 9x 13" baking pan. Bake at 200 degrees for 1 hour, stirring every 15 minutes. Cool.

* Roll unbaked cornbread bread sticks in melted butter and then in crushed potato chips. Bake as directed on the bread stick package.

* Spoon hot pepper jelly over cream cheese. Serve with crackers.

* Make a cheese ball by mixing the following ingredients in a food processor: 8 oz. cream cheese softened, dash of Tabasco sauce, 3 Tbs. steak sauce, 1 clove garlic. Roll in finely chopped pecans. Serve with crackers.

Coat wedges of dill pickles with cream cheese. Roll in a slice of ham or corned beef. Slice each roll into bite size slices. Serve with party sized rye bread.

* Wrap scallops in bacon. Roll in teryaki sauce. Broil for 3-4 minutes each or until bacon is crisp.

* Saute cocktail franks or mini smoked sausages until they

are heated through and browned a bit. Serve with toothpicks. * Saute together 1 chopped onion, 1 lb. hot sausage, 1 lb. ground beef. Drain. Stir in 2 lbs. Velveeta cheese, 1 can Rotel tomatoes, 4 oz. mild green chilies, 1 can of mushroom soup, undiluted. Heat until the cheese melts. Serve with corn chips.

Purchase ready- made breadsticks. Wrap each one with a thin slice of cheese and a thin slice of corned beef. Microwave until cheese is melted.

Cut up raw vegetables and serve on a platter along with you favorite salad dressing or with a dip.

Driving on the Karakoram Highway

Anderson began his journey toward China from Islamabad, the capital of Pakistan. But he was stopped by an avalanche near Karimabad, not far from the Chinese border.

Farwell graduate Will Anderson sent this story back to the Tribune so that he could share his experiences with his family and friends there. Will is a U.S. naval officer stationed with the U.S. Embassy staff in Pakistan. He is the son of Bob and Carrie Anderson of Farwell.

Islamabad sits on the southern fringe of the greatest mountain ranges in the world. Driving north from this city, you almost immediately begin to climb, and you can transit the area where three mountain rangers collide, the Himalayas, the Karakorams, and the Pamirs. These ranges began to form 55 million years ago with the collision of the Indian subcontinent with Asia, and they are the highest mountains in the world. The continental drift of the land masses continues, and the mountains continue to get taller at the rate of approximately a quarter - inch a year.

I took the chance to drive north through these mountains before the winter snows block the passes until next spring. I was traveling with my boss, Colonel Art Nagel, U.S. Army, and our interpreter, Mr. Yousef, a Pakistani Christian. We loaded our truck with provisions and camping gear and set off to travel across the roof of the world in an attempt to enter China by the back door. Our six day trek was to take us almost 1,200 miles, despite the fact that an avalanche stopped us less than 70 miles from the Chinese border.

The route we took is actually the ancient Silk Route. For thousands of years, the treasures of China and the Orient were packed through these tortuous passes for trade with the civilizations of the Middle East and the Mediterranean. As we drove the narrow winding road, on hundreds of cliffs and rocks we could see the history of this route chiselled into the stone. Caravan masters, soldiers, Buddhist pilgrims, and other travelers going back to at least 3,000 B. C. would carve their names into the rock to mark their passage.

We drove continually uphill and upriver beside the Indus River, then the Gilgit River, then the Hunza River. Our goal was to reach the Khunjerab Pass into China, at almost 16000 feet, the highest international crossing point with a paved

road in the world.

Pakistan and China began a partnership in 1958 trying to build a road over the ancient Silk Route. When it was finally completed in 1978, it was one of the wonders of modern

civilization, a narrow path cut into the sides of cliffs for almost 800 miles through some of the most treacherous terrain in the world.

The whole route is through jagged rock, savage temperatures, and glaciers. The frequent avalanches are caused by the constant movement of the land masses, with a tremor about every three minutes. Almost 900 Pakistanis and Chinese were killed in its construction. Today, the Pakistan Army maintains Army Construction Battalions in posts along the road to clear rock slides and rebuild bridges which are carried away.

The extremely heavy rains and flooding that Pakistan endured this summer destroyed long streches of the road which are still being repaired. Contamination from the floodwaters has also brought diseases such as typhoid, so we had to carry all the food and water we were going to need. So, armed with our maps, a couple of shotguns, and the rest of our gear, we began our attempt to follow in the path of Marco Polo to China.

Our first day of travel skirted the ceasefire line between the Indian - held portion of Kashmir and the Pakistani - held portion of Kashmir. When the British left this part of the world in 1947, it was divided between two countries, the predominantly Hindu India, and the predominantly Muslim Pakistan

Kashmir's Hindu maharaja took his province into India despite the fact that about 80 percent of the Kashmiris are Muslim, and this has been the source of all of the bloodshed between these countries since 1947. Today, artillery duels and reprisals across the ceasefire line are so common that they are no longer reported unless there are particularly large numbers of casualties.


Our first night we camped on a hillside above the Indus north of Besham, and we had our first contact with the people of these mountains. They are fiercely independent and often violent, and it is foolish to go to the more isolated valleys. But along the KKH, we only encountered hospitality to visitors, and these villagers came to offer us some of their supper and to give us firewood.

The second night we made it to Gilgit, and the third day the cliff face collapsed ahead of us, carrying the road completely away less than 70 miles from China. We camped that night by the Hunza River, and the next morning diverted our journeys into the Swat Valley for two more days of travel.

Every village we passed through had schools for its children, unlike anything I had seen in the rest of Pakistan. Most of these schools were not built by the government. They were build by benefactors such as the Agha Khan or the families of the former mirs (kings). This part of Asia was once several small and independent kingdoms - Swat, Hunza, Skardu, and many others - and remained that way until they were incorporated into Pakistan in the 1970's.

We tried to offer the children chocolates, but every time, all they wanted was writing material such as paper, pencils, and pens. So today, there are dozens of children in villages of the Himalaya mountains that are learning to write with pens that say, "Security State Bank, Farwell, Texas" on them.


The people of this part of the world live in isolated valleys and until only very recently supplemented their farming and grazing with smuggling and slave trading. They are intensely tribal, with different varieties of the Muslim faith, Sunni and




This is one of the suspension bridges, crossing the valley. It is shared with hundreds of people, carts, and animals.

Shia and Ismaili, existing in one valley or on opposite sides of the river. The people of the Chitral valley are not even Muslim but worship a variety of gods taken from myth and nature. This is the part of the land which inspired Rudyard Kipling to write his story, "The Man Who Would Be King."

The valleys locked away in the Himalaya Mountains are only now getting some type of dependable contact with the rest of the world. Bridges and jeep tracks are being built into the scattered villages from the KKH. The isolated valleys whose streams flow into the Hunza River are carefully terraced with fruit orchards and flocks of sheep and tidy villages protected by walls and forts. The stories of the people of these villages living 120 years or more cannot be verified because no one knows what year they were born. It was these myths of a heaven on earth that served as the basis of the story of Shangri- La in James Hilton's "Lost Horizon".

Many of the people of these northern valleys are light skinned and have blue or green eyes, suggesting that there is some truth that their ancestors included soldiers from the army of Alexander the Great. These valleys have always been a place of violence with wars between neighboring villages, and successive waves of invaders, the Chinese, the Huns, the Persians, the Moghuls, to name but a few...

It was a century ago in these valleys that British and Russian agents fought an undeclared war in what was called "The Great Game". The Russian Czar was determined to expand his empire down into the Indian subcontinent, and the British were determined to stop it. After decades of exploring and bloodshed, it was determined that there was no route through the mountains through which the Russians could have moved an army anyway.

Today, Pakistan looks north to the turmoil in the Central Asian Republics of the former Soviet Union, east to the continuing bloodshed in Indian - held Kashmir, and west tot he growing civil war in Afghanistan. The peace of these beautiful valleys remains in peril, as it always has.

But for now they remain beautiful and relatively peaceful. The winter snows will return these valleys to isolation, but the spring will open the roads again. And in the spring, we will make one more attempt to take the highest road in the world all the way into China.







"He is fascinated by the cheap prices on things like electronics," said Gia. "At home he likes to do things like talking on a microphone and being a disc jockey."


Pedro says that he likes "normale" Spanish music, "It's the same music they play here, but in Spanish," he explained.

Mary's Holiday Punch

1 can of frozen strawberries

1 small can frozen lemonade, reconstituted

1 pint of ice cream 1 quart 7-Up

Mix the strawberries, lemonade, water and 7-Up together in a punch bowl. Spoon ice cream over the top.

Granola and Pumpkin Cookies

2 c. all - purpose flour

1 c. old fashioned oats

1 c. shredded coconut

1/4 c. wheat germ

2 tsp. ground cinnamon

2 tsp. ground all spice

1 tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. baking soda 1/2 tsp. salt

1 c. butter or margarine

1 c. light brown sugar

1 c. granulated sugar

1 c. Libby's Solid Pack Pumpkin

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1 c. raisins

1 c. nuts, chopped

In medium bowl, combine flour, oats, coconut, wheat germ, cinnamon, allspice, baking soda and salt; set aside. In large mixer bowl, cream margarine, brown sugar and granulated sugar. Beat in egg, pumpkin and vanilla. Beat in flour mixture. Stir in raisins and nuts. Drop dough by round tablespoonfuls onto greased baking sheets. Bate in preheated 350 degree oven for 15 to 20 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool on wire racks.

1 onion chopped and sauteed in 1 stick oleo add 1/2 c. flour

1 can chicken broth

1 big jar of Coffeemate or 1 pint half and half

eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Reserve

1 cup of mixture. Add pumpkin, remaining sugar, and spices to the large

portion of cream cheese. Mix well. Pour pumpkin mixture into crust. Swirl in reserved cup of cream cheese mixture to make a marbled effect. Bake at 350 degrees for 55 minutes. Loosen cake from rim of pan. Cool before removing rim of pan. Chill. Makes 10-12 servings.

Veggie Pizza by Ashlee Hunt

1 pkg. crescent dinner rolls 8 oz. cream cheese (whipped)

1 pkg. vegetable soup mix

3/4 c. each finely chopped vegetables: broccoli, cauliflower, green onions, bell peppers, and cherry tomatoes

1 c. grated mozzarella and cheddar cheese

Press crescent rolls to form a single layer on a cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, then set aside. Soften cream cheese and add dressing mix. Spread desired amount on rolls. Top this with assorted chopped vegetables, and then sprinkle with grated cheese. Chill well and cut in to squares before serving. Serves 8-10.
