Recipe of Week

Cheesy Noodles

6 Tbs. butter
1- 3 oz. pkg. cream cheese
2 Tbs. snipped parsley
1/4 tsp. basil
3 oz. noodles
1/8 tsp. garlic, minced
1/2 c. Parmesan cheese
Dash of salt and pepper
Combine 2 Tbs. butter, cream cheese, salt and pepper and blend well. Stir in 1/3 c. boiling water and mix well.
Cook noodles according to

package directions and drain. Cook garlic in remaining butter until tender. Pour over noodles and toss to mix. Add half of cheese and toss again. Place noodles on serving platter and top with sauce. Sprinkle with remaining cheese.

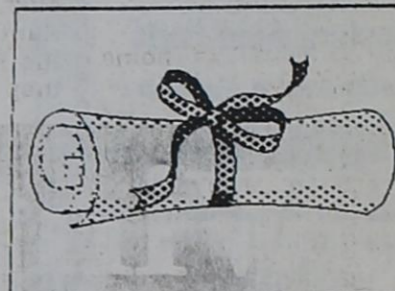
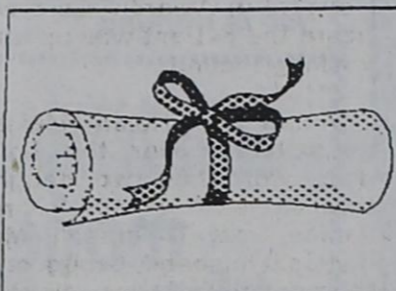
On Jan. 4, Jerry Ward, 38, Bovina, was arrested on a charge of assault. He was fined \$500, court costs and 10 days in jail.

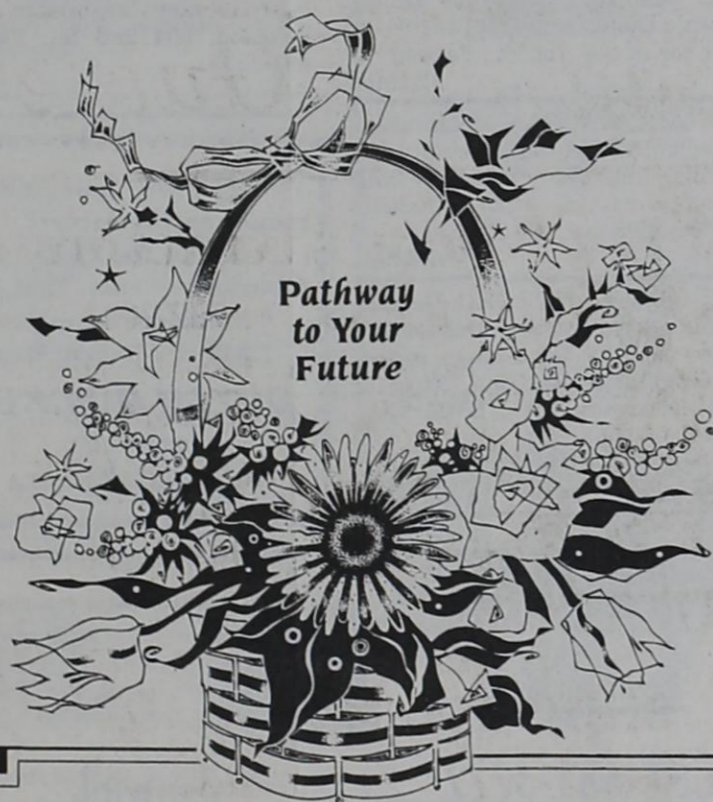

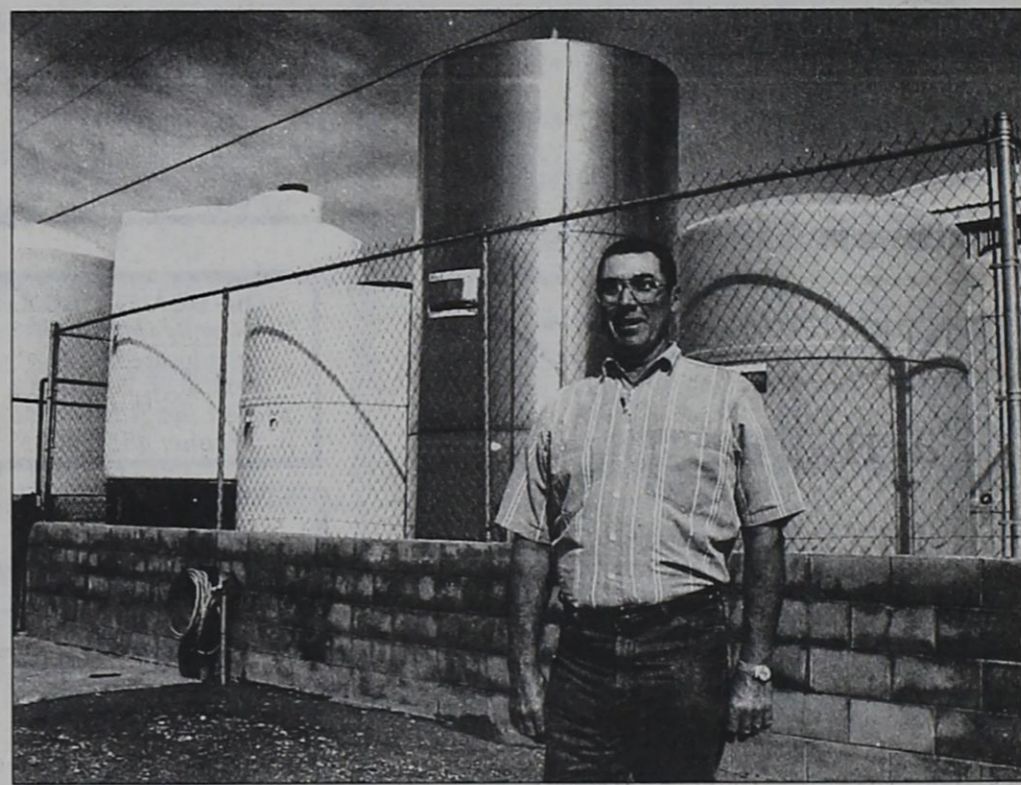

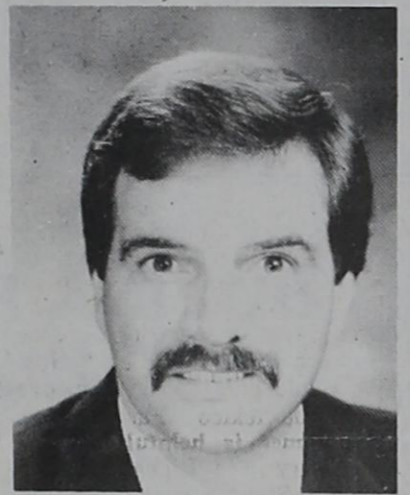
