Farwell Elementary School held its annual track meet on May 12. It was really something to see!

Physical education teacher Judy Howard taught everyone a terrific lesson about the benefits of working together in an organized fashion. She did a terrific job of organizing before the big day, and it really paid off.

She asked the assistance of the high school coaching staff and varsity athletes in organizing the events and measuring out the distances ahead of time. Items such as softballs, batons for relay races, and potato sacks were rounded up ahead of time.

Athletic Director Rex Cumpton and varsity athletes were recruited to start races, record results, and hand out ribbons. Teachers were recruited to line up their students.

Everything went smoothly as long as Cumpton was armed with his starter's pistol!

As a teacher who knows her students well, Mrs. Howard had divided each class into groups for various events so that students would have a chance at winning. She also made sure that there were several ribbons for everyone, so that no one went home feeling like a total loser.

Each teacher received a list of events and times of events that the students would participate in. These lists also showed the order in which each student would line up so that both the teachers and the students knew just where to go and what to do.

The school secretaries made copies of all the lists and stapled them together, and had everything laid out in advance. On the day of the track meet, they also worked in the concession stand to make the day more pleasant for the children.

Time was planned between events for students to play or rest or snack, but when the time came for an event to start each student knew just what to do.

Someone remembered to bring boxes of safety pins so that little ones could pin their ribbons to their shirts, and not loose their hard earned badges of honor.

Someone also remembered to give each teacher a trash bag so that candy wrappers and soft drink cups did not fly all over the track. The children were reminded to pick up after themselves.

Parents were notified in advance of the event so that they could come watch. It's always fun to show off in front of an appreciative audience.

The Kindergarten students from Mrs. Bennett's and Mrs. Dyer's classes had decorated matching T-shirts early in the school year that they wore to the track meet. The shirts had the kids' names written on them so that the winners' names could be recorded. More important, the shirts also helped the little ones locate their classmates easily in a large crowd. These shirts were also used for the Circus show they were in and also for their field trips.

When it was all over, the results were compiled so that we could report them to you. When you see how long the lists are, it becomes apparent what a big undertaking this little track meet really was.

BTD planning in full swing

Welcome to July: And July means ... the 27th annual Border Town Days!

Planning is well under way for the popular annual Twin City event, this year on July 31.

Last year, an estimated 4,000 persons attended the Twin City's big celebration. Here's a rundown of BTD as the countdown begins:

Giveaways

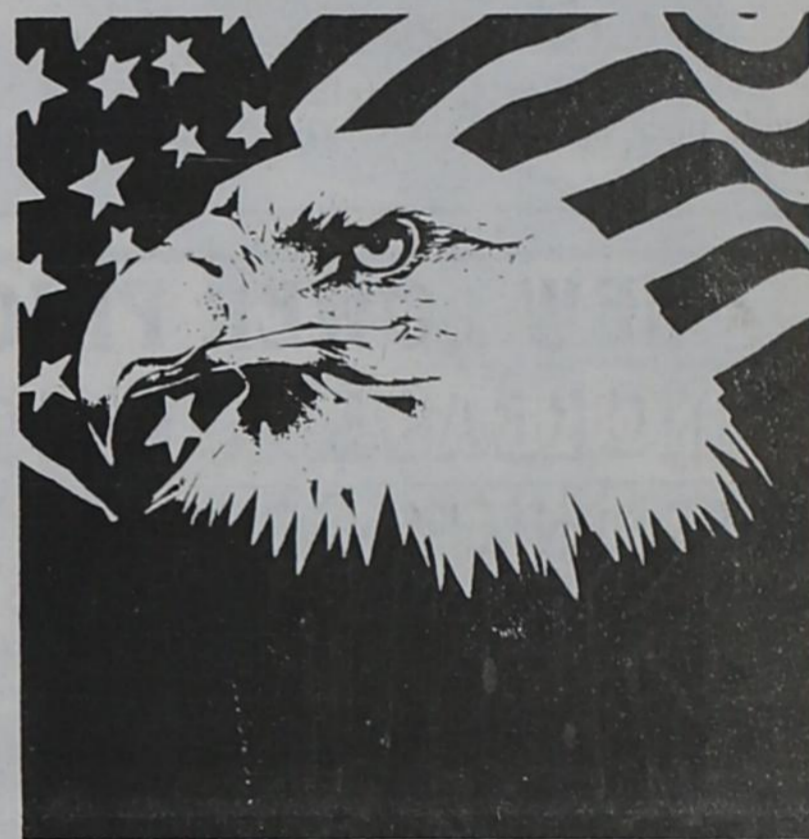

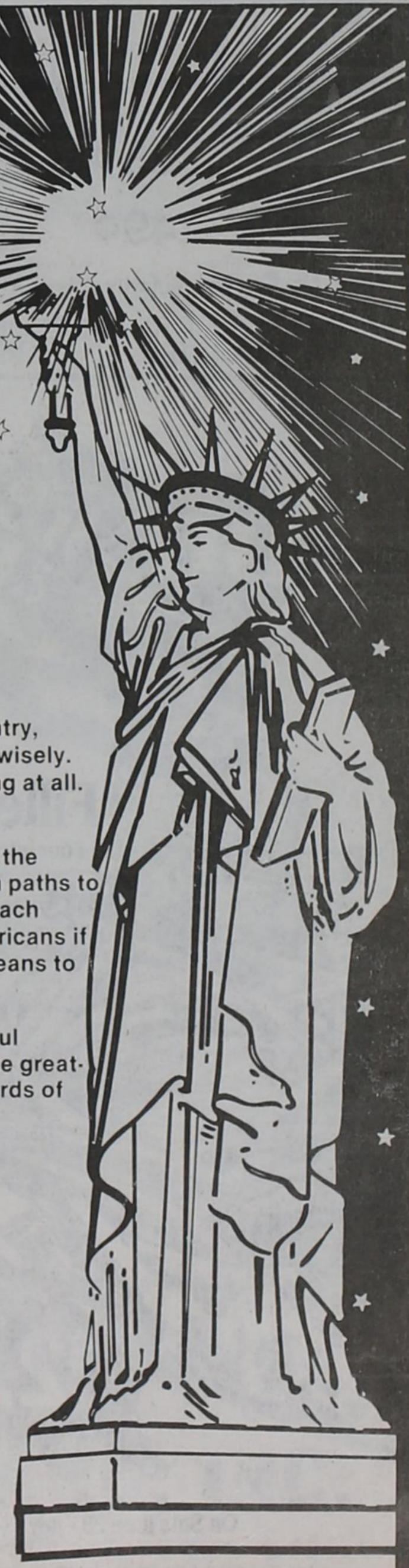

Friona presents fire stats

The Parmer County Commissioners Monday received statistics involving the Friona Fire Department.

The stats were mailed to County Judge Bonnie Clayton by Friona city officials.

Friona officials have been pushing for extra money from the county or folks in the county for county calls made by the city fire department. Friona has stressed that a large number of their calls is being made by county residents.

Here's a look at Friona's calls:

- 1989/90 - Total calls 63 - city 21 (33%), county 42 (67%).
- 1990/91 - Total calls 59 - city 19 (32%), county 40 (68%).
- 1991/92 - Total calls 73 - city 21 (29%), county 52 (71%).

1992/93 (October through April) - Total calls 36 - city 7 (17%), county 29 (83%).

Here's a look at Farwell's calls, according to the information from Friona:

- 1991 - Total calls 39 - city 24 (62%), county 15 (38%).
- 1992 - Total calls 19 - city 9 (47%), county 10 (53%).
- 1993 (through May) - Total calls 14 - city 10 (75%), county 4 (25%).

The commissioners discussed the material but no decisions were made, since Friona made no proposals concerning extra subsidies.

In other business, the commissioners agreed to pay \$500 for two Bovina firemen to attend a hazardous materials training workshop at Texas A & M.

Bids for health insurance were opened. The commissioners stayed with Blue Cross, which had no rate increase. Other bidders were Ted Knox, of Tulia, and Andy Hurst, of Friona.

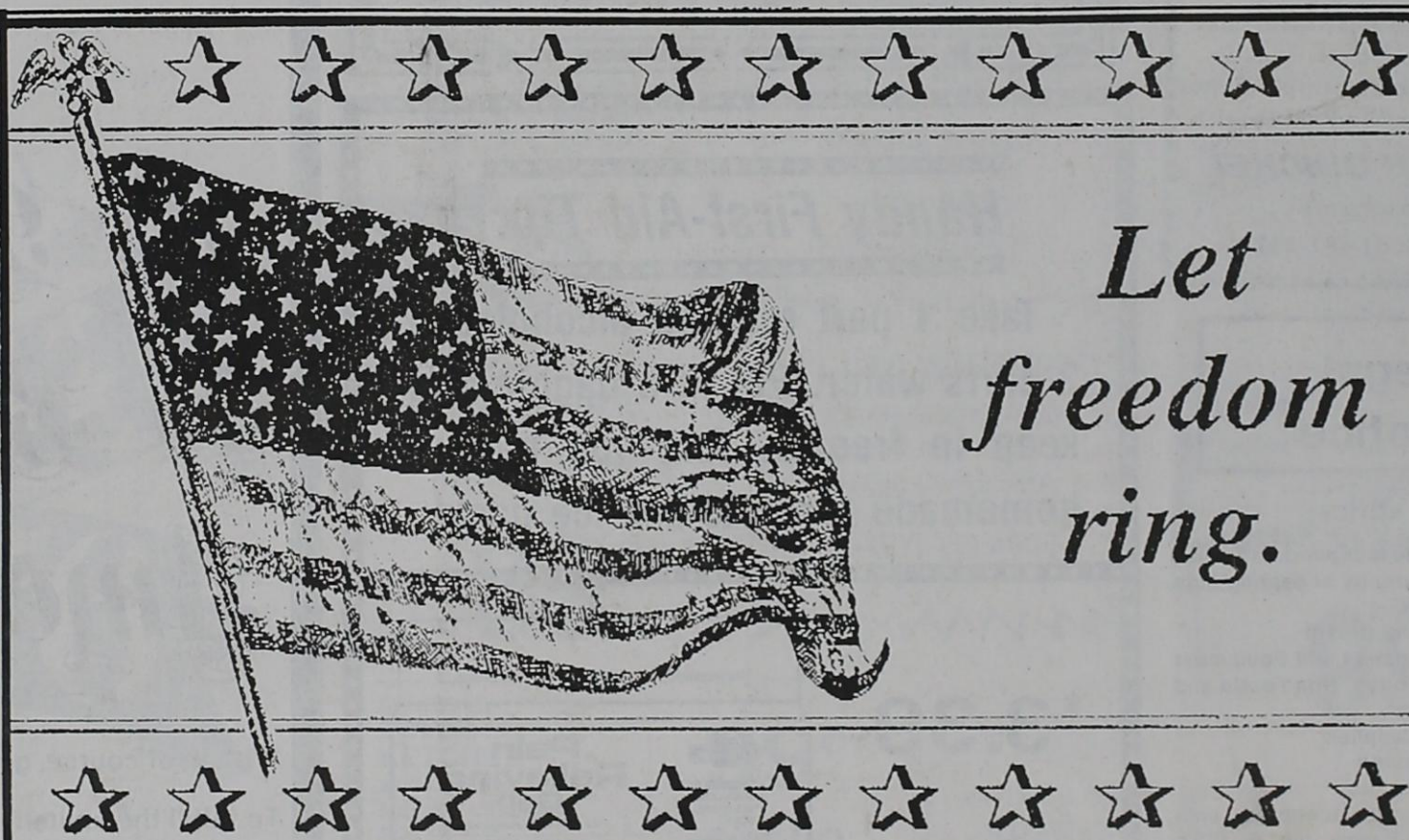

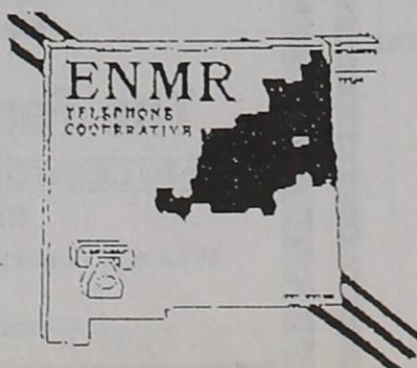

The maximum number of shots per hole will be 5. Here's a "hole by hole" breakdown:

No. 1 - "Straight and Narrow" at KKR Park. It's 100 yards long.

No. 2 - "Triple Threat" at KKR Park. The 70-yard hole features hitting the ball over 3 trees in a row.

No. 3 - "The Pond" at KKR Park. You drive over the pond - and must be careful of the ditch! It's 80 yards long.

No. 4 - "Putter's Paradise" at Lions Park. You can chip or putt within a 40-foot circle.

No. 5 - "The Sand Storm" at the sand volleyball court at First Baptist Church. For an extra \$1, you can get a 1-shot deduction but hitting within 5 feet of the circle.

No. 6 - "Plumber's Nightmare" means hitting over the old barracks (which is being demolished) next to the First Baptist Church. A toilet tank has been laid on its side and you must putt into it. If you hit into the toilet bowl, you get a 2-shot deduction.

No. 7 - "Bullseye" at the school football field. You chip into an old tire near the shot put area. There's a 7-shot maximum on this hole.

No. 8 - "Field Goal" at the school football field. The 110-yard hold means hitting within a small circle. And if you hit over the goal post, it's a 2 stroke deduction.

No. 9 - "Extra Point" at the school football field. Like Hole No. 5, for an extra \$1 you get a 1-shot deduction if you hit within a 5-foot circle. You get five tries to hit over the uprights. Women will have a shorter hole, and the flag pole won't be in their way.

Declaration of Independence

IN CONGRESS, JULY 4, 1776.

The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America.

When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation. We therefore the Representatives of the united States of America, in General Congress, assembled, solemnly publish this Declaration, that all to whom these Letters shall come, may know that we have severed our connection with Great Britain, and that we are now free, independent States, absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connections between us and that Kingdom, are hereby totally dissolved; that we are and ought to be free and independent States, that we have and lawfully ought to have full power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, enter into Commercials, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, we have signed our names, and have caused this Declaration to be signed by the Representatives of the thirteen united States of America, in Testimony whereof, we have hereunto set our hands and seals, the day and date above written.
