A beautiful tribute

All I can say about Sunday's dedication of the Parmer County Veterans' Memorial in Farwell City Park was that it was a beautiful tribute to the men who gave their lives in service to their nation during wartime.

I was really pleased to see the overflow crowd. To have more than 200 persons attend, including folks from as far away as Louisiana and other states, was most significant.

Something like this is highly important to families who lost loved ones due to war. It's an important way to remember men who had their lives cut short because their nation called them to war. It's important for our children, and some day their children, to always remember.

I served three years in the military during the late 1960s. My orders sent me to Germany for two years, then back to the United States for a final 8 months.

The point is I went where I was ordered. The same holds true for the men who died. They followed the orders given them by their nation. And they died for their nation - and for us.

Each one of the 34 men listed on the Parmer County Veterans' Memorial was a hero.

And for that, they need to be honored.

My feelings? Let's just hope that President Clinton grows in the office like his hair grows on his head.

I found out that a memorial was built in that town for the crew of that plane because of the number of lives they saved by their heroism.

We get a lot of news releases from government agencies, some of which we use and others we file. One came from Farwell's Farmers Home Administration office that I want to pass on.

It involves loaning funds to help members of social disadvantaged groups. Under the program, these groups include Hispanics, Native Americans, African Americans, Asians and Pacific Islanders.

All I can say is - this is a great opportunity for all Pacific Islanders who live in Parmer County!

Watch, there probably will be a run on the Farwell office Monday after all our county's Pacific Islanders read this column.

Why, there must be at least 10,000 Pacific Islanders living in Farwell itself - not to count the suburbs.

And think of all the Pacific Islanders who commute here from home each day!

Actually, I'm not sure if "Pacific Islanders" refers to a new major league baseball team or what. Maybe, it's a new mixed drink.

And the best part of writing this is that the Farwell FmHA's bosses in Austin want clips of these articles that appear in local papers sent to them.

Vets' memorial dedication held

A large crowd of more than 200 attended the ceremony Sunday afternoon dedicating the Parmer County Veterans Memorial at Farwell City Park.

The memorial contains the names of 34 Parmer County servicemen who died in the service to their nation.

The program was organized by Tom Shumate, Ralph Franse, Mike Ratke and Dutch Quicke.

All parts of Parmer County were represented including having the county commissioners and County Judge Bonnie Clayton present. Former Parmer County Judge Paul Fortenberry was master of ceremonies.

The list of those honored on the memorial were read by Webb Gober, Ralph Franse and John Duke.

An honor guard from the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post in Friona presented the colors.

Rev. Edward Greenthamer, pastor of St. John Lutheran Church in Lariat, gave the invocation.

A rifle salute was offered by airmen from Cannon Air Force Base. Taps was played by Alan Finney.

A reception followed, with refreshments provided by Beta Sigma Phi sorority.

Free copies of a State Line Tribune 4-page special section featuring background and photos of the servicemen who were honored were passed out. Three hundred copies of last week's issue were printed.

A guest book with the names of those attending has been placed in Parmer County Judge Bonnie Clayton's office. Persons who visit the monument may have their names added to it.

The monument was built by Wallace Monument Co., of Clarendon, Texas.

Boothby: State finance plan won't affect Farwell

Farwell School Supt. Richard Boothby said the new state school finance plan will have no effect on Farwell Schools.

The new legislation was approved by State District Court Judge Scott McCown Tuesday. However, its constitutionality will be tested in court.

Boothby said Farwell's funding will stay intact.

He said, basically, the new state plan takes funds away from richer districts and gives that money to the state for disbursement.

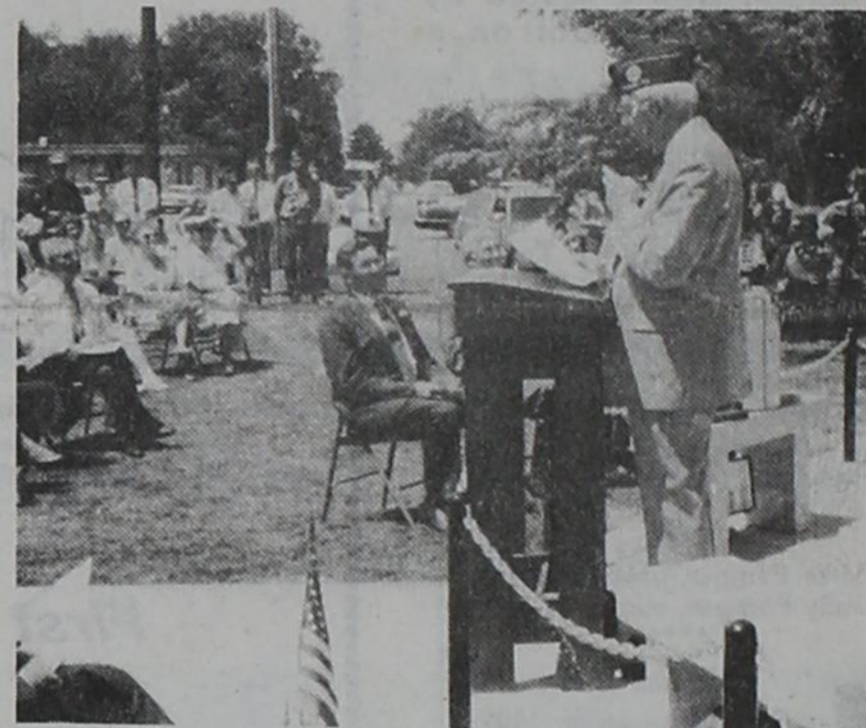
Also, Boothby clarified the record concerning the new Farwell School building project.

Last week, the Tribune reported the award to Monterrey Construction Co. was \$2.39 million. That total was their bid.

However, after changes were made in the construction, the actual cost is estimated between \$2.1 million and \$2.2 million, said Boothby.
