vor of the budget. In favor were commissioners Robert White and Tom Ware plus county judge Bonnie Clayton

were commissioners Ernest Anthony and Raymond McGehee. Anth
Anthony and McGehee said they voted against the bud-
get because it included pay aises for the county commissioners plus higher travel allowances. They didn't want to accept two raises.
