City police costs explained

The Farwell City Council received a report from councilman John Carlson Tuesday on the expected costs for starting a city police department. Carlson said he expected the first year to cost about \$46,000, including insurances. It includes between \$15,000 and \$18,000 for salary; \$6,000 for insurances; \$15,000 to \$16,500 for a new car; \$2,000 for radar; \$1,400 for a TV monitor in the car. Other costs he broke down included \$80 for a raincoat; \$60 for a badge; \$260 for a vest; \$560 for a radio; \$300 for uniforms, etc.

He had spoken with Clovis police officials to get many of these cost estimates. Carlson noted that the city has \$163,000 in general fund Certificates of Deposit. He said it appears that all the city can afford is a 1-person police force. He noted that residents must understand the limitations of having just one officer.

Three months ago, the city voted to have a police department and use money from its CDs for the first year of operation. Carlson, who voted against the city's resolution, said the city must take a hard look at where funds will come from to keep a city police department operating after the first year.

Currently, the state allows municipalities to raise their tax rates a maximum of 7.9 percent a year. Anything higher permits citizens to seek a rollback. The 7.9 percent currently generates about \$4,000 more a year.

Mayor Chris Gikas pointed out that some funds could be generated through fines levied by the police officer. And another person said that some funds could be switched within the general fund into the police department budget. But a decision on how to keep the department going wouldn't have to be made for another 12 months.

Gikas thanked Carlson for his report. Carlson and councilmen Royce Bethel and Pat Howard had been appointed to a police search committee. Also attending Tuesday's meeting were Mike and Donna Ratke, and Jerry and Colleen Stover. Gikas asked these folks to serve on the police search committee, also.

So far, Farwell has received 17 applications for the position. Up to 10 more may be received. Mrs. Stover asked if state funds were available to help finance a city police department. Gikas has checked into this and hasn't been able to find any. In other business, the council:

- Agreed to seek bids on liability insurance.
- Voted to seek a bank depository for 1993.

- Approved a building application from Terry Lusk to build a home at 905 7th St.
- Denied a building application from Leo Gonzales to add a bedroom on the south side of his home in the 100 block of 3rd Street. It would have been too close to the property line and adjoining building, according to city statutes.
- Approved Christmas holidays and bonuses for city employees.

Texico loses water for two hours

Texico was without water for about 2 hours around lunchtime Tuesday.

Telephone workers struck a water main behind Texico Schools while they were erecting a new telephone pole to connect the school's new telephone system to the new property that the school purchased this year.

"Our new phone system is on US West, but we purchased the equipment from ETSC," said Texico's Cheryl Whitener.

According to Jeff Moore of ENMR Telephone Cooperative, the accident occurred when personnel from ETSC struck a waterline while using ENMR's equipment. Texico city personnel had

shown the telephone company where the city waterlines were located.

But, as Moore understood it, the line struck belonged to the school system, not to the city. The line was a 6" line to serve the school buildings and the football field.

When the accident occurred, the water main was shut off, interrupting service to the entire city until the problem could be solved.

"We had about a million calls about this," said Judge George Herington. "Everybody called and said, 'I thought I paid my water bill.'"

Farwell city personnel brought over their backhoe to help locate the water lines.

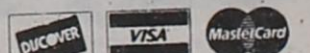

Recipe of Week

Onion Flat Bread

- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1 c. chopped onions
- 2 pkg. (6.5 oz. each) Martha White Pizza Crust Mix
- 1 c. hot tap water
- 1 Tbs. olive oil
- 1 tsp. dried parsley
- salt and pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 450 degrees F. Grease a large baking sheet. Saute onions in butter until tender and translucent but not brown. Combine pizza crust mix, about half the onions and water; stir vigorously about 20 strokes to form a soft dough. Rub vegetable oil on hands, form dough into smooth ball. Place on prepared baking sheet and press into a 10 x 13 - inch rectangle. Spread with olive oil, remaining onions, parsley, salt and pepper. Let rest in a warm place 30 minutes (dough will rise only slightly). Bake 17 to 20 minutes or until golden brown. Makes one loaf.
