Shamir, the right-wing Israeli Shamir, the right-wing Israeli
leader, prime minister of that nation. I believe the more liberal party would be more receptive to peace overture and offer a chance at negotiation. But I don't see Shamir
as a negotiator. At least not as a negotiator. At least not
according to his past history. The U.S. is in a good position to help move the peace process along. We re-
ally came through in the ally came through in the
clutch when Saudi Arabia was threatened by Iraq. Egypt has gone the extra mile the
past few years at extendpast few years at extend-
ing the olive branch (although the more militant Palestinian groups have not).
So I see the Arab states as being more amenable than they ever have been before
toward seeking peace in that fragile part of the world. So the onus lies with Israel. Will they trade land for peace? I don't think a Shamir government will.

with this peace conferen lasting a bit longer than usual. If progress isn't made quickly, and it appears that Israel is intransigent, then the next
Israeli election may put the more liberal party into power. Meanwhile, all the powers involved must ignore the threats and tactics by the militant Palestinian groups. Don't be surprised by an as-
sassination. Or a bomb killing innocent civilians. They will do anything to derail the peace process. Such sick
tactics have worked in the lactics have worked in the
past, but the world is more past, but the world is more
intelligent about how to deal with them. You can't allow a with them. You cantics to decide policies for nations and groups of nations. What needs to be done is to break down the "big picture" into smaller units, then work
on those problems. You need on thole problems. You need
to solve them one by one. Eventually, you will get to the nitty gritty - land for
the Palestinians. I just hope the nations involved are bi
