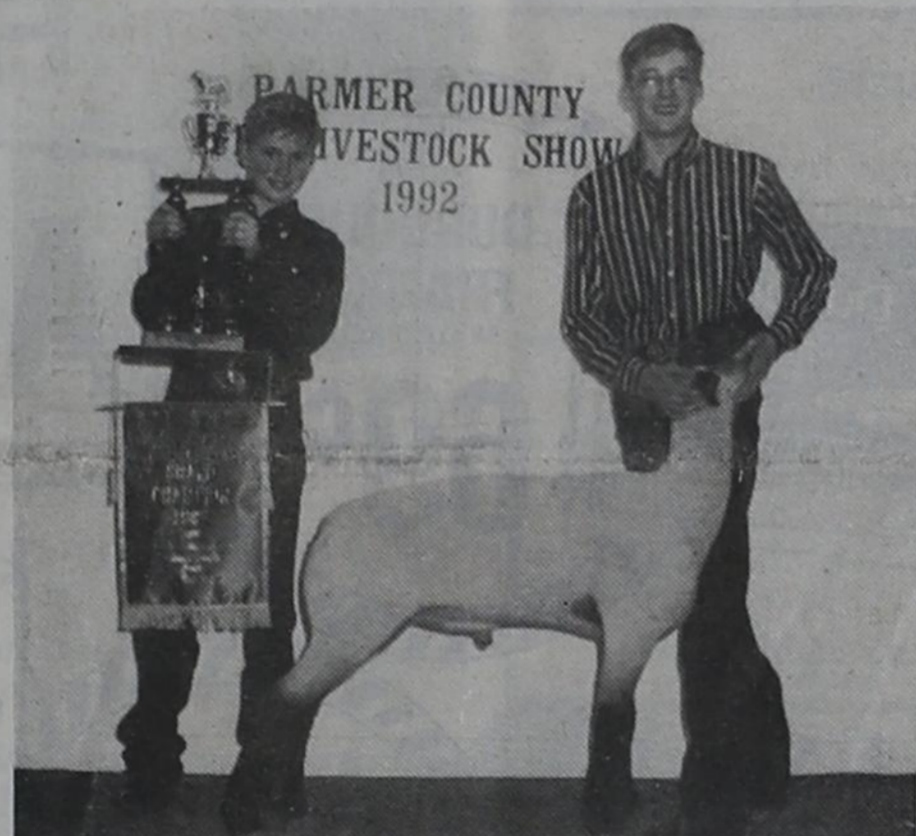

W. Shane Roberts of Farwell had the Grand Champion Barrow.



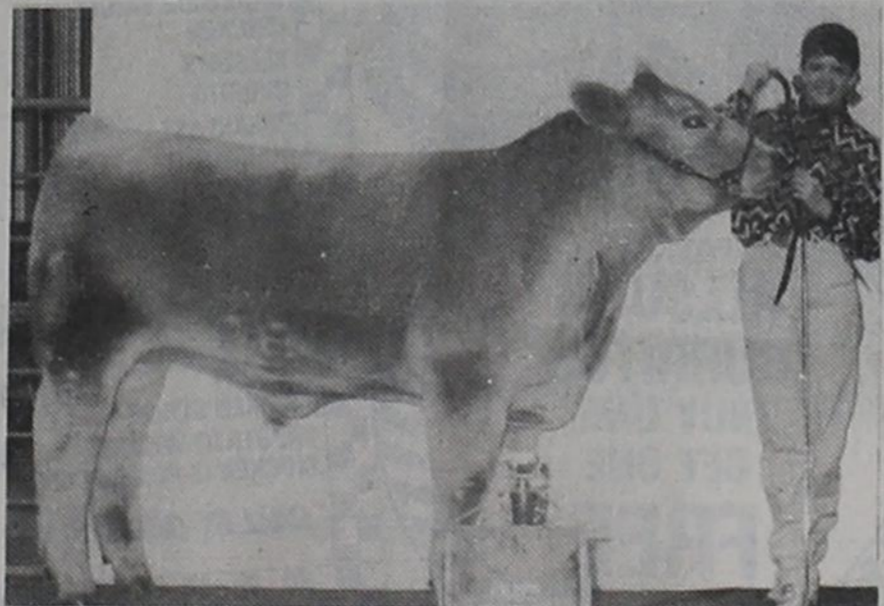

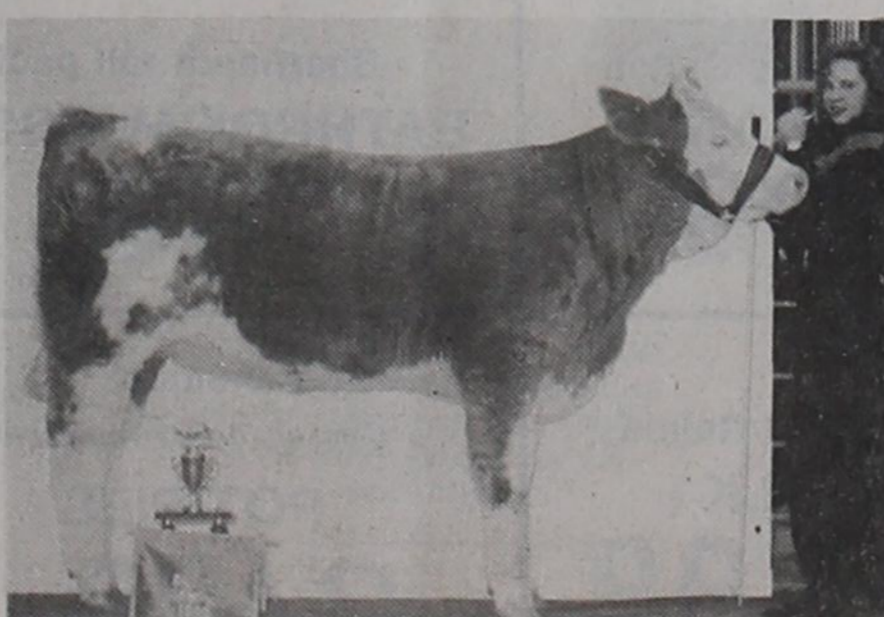

Courthouse renovated

The third floor of the Parmer County Courthouse has been renovated to make room for some needed office space.

Soon the Parmer County Commissioners will decide whether they want to continue the renovation project.

The construction of the elevator last year made it easier for people to get to the third floor. In the past, the third floor was inaccessible to people in wheelchairs or on crutches. The new elevator also made it easier to move building materials, desks, files, and books during the remodeling.

The third floor, which was previously used primarily as storage space, now houses the highway patrolman's office, the office of the Farwell justice of the peace, and the offices of the agricultural extension service agents.

Each of the offices on the third floor is now light and spacious. There is plenty of space for desks and bookcases and tables. Each is carpeted with light blue carpeting.

One thing was left just as it has been in the past - the original ceramic tile flooring was left intact in the hallways. Only the office area was changed.

JP Louise Hancock is especially happy to have more room. She was previously located in a tiny office on the first floor. Her office was so small that only one other person could stand in it at a time.

"If I had one person in my office, I'd have to ask them to step out into the hall if I wanted to get into my safe," she said.

The office that Mrs. Hancock vacated on the first floor was used as a janitor's closet at one time. Even though it is tiny, the Sheriff's Department personnel are happy get the additional space. It is just the right size to house the Intoxilizer 5000 machine and a desk.

Previously, they were unable to use the Intoxilizer 5000 as much as they wanted to use it because it works best if it is used where there isn't any smoke or dust or dirt. Having the machine in its own separate office makes it easier to keep it functioning at optimum levels.

In addition to Sheriff Rex Williams, highway patrolmen Trey Ellis and Craig Hunt and Friona police officer Steve Jones are currently certified to operate the machine. They each attended a 40 hour school to learn the proper

way to use the machine, and the laws covering drunk driving.

Williams hopes that a door can be cut so that the small office could be accessed through the sheriff's office instead of from the hallway.

If the county commissioners vote to continue the renovation of the courthouse, it is probable that the second floor may be the next stage of the project. The second floor currently houses the district courtroom, the district clerk, the adult probation officer, the court reporter, the law library and the jury room.

The first floor of the courthouse remains much as it has been in recent years. The county tax assessor's office, the county clerk, county judge, the county treasurer, county courtroom, and the sheriff's department are located on that floor.
