Morgan displays woodworking skills

J.D. "Jim" Morgan of Texico knew that he had his work cut out for him when he looked at pictures of an intricately wooden clock. "I thought it would take me a year or better to make it," he said.

Forty dollars worth of saw blades and 30 days later,
Morgan had completed the project which now stands
nearly as tall as he does.

For each intricate cut a pilot hole was drilled, and the saw blade was inserted at exactly the right angle. Then it

was guided along a circuitous path.

Morgan chose cedar, oak, walnut and white maple to make his creation. He added clockworks complete with a chime that plays the "Westminster Chimes," and finished

the project with a fine finish.

"He thought he'd be old and gray headed when he finished this," said Mrs. Morgan. Luckily, he finished it in about 6 weeks' time.

"I had time to kill - I don't go to the coffee shop or the pool hall," said Morgan. Later he added, "I'd rather do something like this (he pointed to the clock) so I've got something to look at when I get through." He spends a lot of his time puttering around the house, and visiting with Mrs. Morgan.

Normally, Morgan does wood projects with much simpler designs. The yard of the Morgan home is filled with two dimensional Western designs. There are cowboys and Indians, gunfighters and maidens in distress scattered about the yard. There is even a cow - wearing polka dot undies.

Inside their home Morgan has many, many projects that he has made in his shop - there are peacock - shaped candle holders, a coffee table made from a slice of a Cyprus log, and a lamp made from pieces of a fence post from Howard Whitener's farm.

"I was a carpenter almost all my life," said Morgan. When he retired from carpentry, Morgan did some custom farm work, but he also did some woodworking for the fun of it. "I just like foolin' with wood," he said.

Morgan makes a variety of items including several types of baskets made from one plank of wood, which can collapse and fold down flat. Mrs. Morgan uses one of those baskets to organize her medications. There are indentations in the bottom of the basket just the right size for each prescription bottle.

Morgan has also made a picture puzzle which doubles as a wall decoration, and several interesting bird houses. There is even a Noah's Ark on the television set that he made

Morgan doesn't sell his wooden projects in stores or at craft shows. Often he gives them to members of his family as gifts.

Notice of application for waste disposal permit amendment.

AZTX Cattle Company dba Farwell Feedyards, Inc., P.O. Box 390, Hereford, Texas 79045, has applied to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (Commission) for an amendment to Permit No. 01665 to authorize an increase in the number of cattle at the feedlot from a maximum of 15,000 head to a maximum of 29,500 head. The proposed amendment will also in incorporate improvements constructed after the permit was originally approved. Stormwater will be retained in one (1) storage pond. Wastewater from the pond is to be disposed of by irrigation on 111 acres of agricultural land. Manure and/or solids are to be removed from the site by a commercial compost contractor. No discharge of pollutants into the waters of the State is authorized by this permit.

The cattle feedlot is approximately 1.5 miles south of Farwell on State Line Road in Parmer County, Texas. This location is in the drainage area of the Black Water Draw in Segment No. 1241 of the Brazos River Basin.

The Executive Director of the Commission has prepared a draft permit based on the application submitted by the applicant and other information presently available.

Legal Authority: Section 26.028 of the "Texas Water Code" and 30 TAC Chapter 305 of the "Rules of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission."

This application is subject to a Commission resolution adopted August 18, 1993, which directs the Commission's Executive Director to act on behalf of the Commission and issue final approval of certain permit matters, the Executive Director will issue this permit unless one or more persons file written protests and/or a request for a hearing within 30 days after publication of this notice.

If you wish to request a public hearing, you must submit your request in writing. You must state (1) your name, mailing address and daytime phone number; (2) the permit number of other recognizable reference to this application; (3) the statement "I/we request a public hearing"; (4) a brief description of how you, or the persons you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application; (5) a description of the location of your property relative to the applicant's operations; and (6) your proposed adjustment to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for hearing. If one or more protests and/or requests for hearing are filed, the Executive Director will not issue the permit and will forward the application to the Office of Hearings Examiners where a hearing may be held. Commission public hearings are evidentiary legal proceedings similar to civil court non-jury trials. Although general comments from the public may be submitted either in writing prior to the hearing, or orally at the start of the hearing, the law requires that the Commission's decision about whether to approve or deny the application be based on evidence and testimony submitted during the public hearing, presented under oath and subject to cross-examination by the other parties. Public comments are not evidence and cannot be the basis for the Commission's ultimate decision. In the event a hearing is held, the Office of Hearings Examiners will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision.

If no protests or requests for hearing are filed, the Executive Director will sign the permit 30 days after the publication of this notice or thereafter. If you wish to appeal a permit issued by the Executive Director, you may do so by filing a written Motion for Reconsideration with the Chief Clerk of the Commission no later than 20 days after the date the Executive Director signs the permit.

You are hereby notified that Caprock Industries, Inc. has applied for Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) Air Quality Permit No. 24683. This permit, if approved, will authorize expansion of a Cattle Feedlot and a Feedmill in Bovina, Parmer County, Texas. The location of the existing facility is four miles southwest of Bovina, Texas on U.S. Highway 60. This facility will emit the following air contaminants: odors, particulate matter, and products of combustion from the burning of natural gas (nitrogen oxides, sulphur dioxide, unburned hydrocarbons, and carbon monoxide).

A copy of all materials in the public file is available for inspection and reproduction at the TNRCC Amarillo Regional Office, Air Program, located at 3918 Canyon Drive, Amarillo, Texas 79109-4996, telephone (806) 353-9251, and at the TNRCC Central Office, 12124 Park 35 Circle, Austin, Texas 78753, telephone (512) 2391000. You may submit written comments concerning the permit application to the Office of Air Quality, New Source Review Program in Austin. All written comments received within 30 days after the second publication of this notice shall be considered by the Executive Director in determining whether to issue or not issue the permit. All written comments will be made available for public inspection at the TNRCC Central Office in Austin. This notice is to be published on June 3 and June 10, 1994

Any person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the proposed facility may request the Commission to hold an informal public meeting and/or contested case hearing on the permit application pursuant to Section 382.056(d) of the Texas Health and Safety Code. The Commission is not required to hold a contested case hearing if the basis of a request is determined to be unreasonable. All requests for a contested case hearing must be received in writing within the 30-day comment period regardless of whether an informal public meeting has been held or scheduled on this matter. If you wish to request a public hearing, you must submit your request in writing. You must state (1) your name, mailing address and daytime phone number; (2) the permit number or other recognizable reference to this application; (3) the statement "I/we request a public hearing"; (4) a brief description of how you, or the persons you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application; (5) a description


