The Iron Horse Truck Wash is now open for business in Texico. Jamie and Suzanne Cooper are the owners of this unique service.

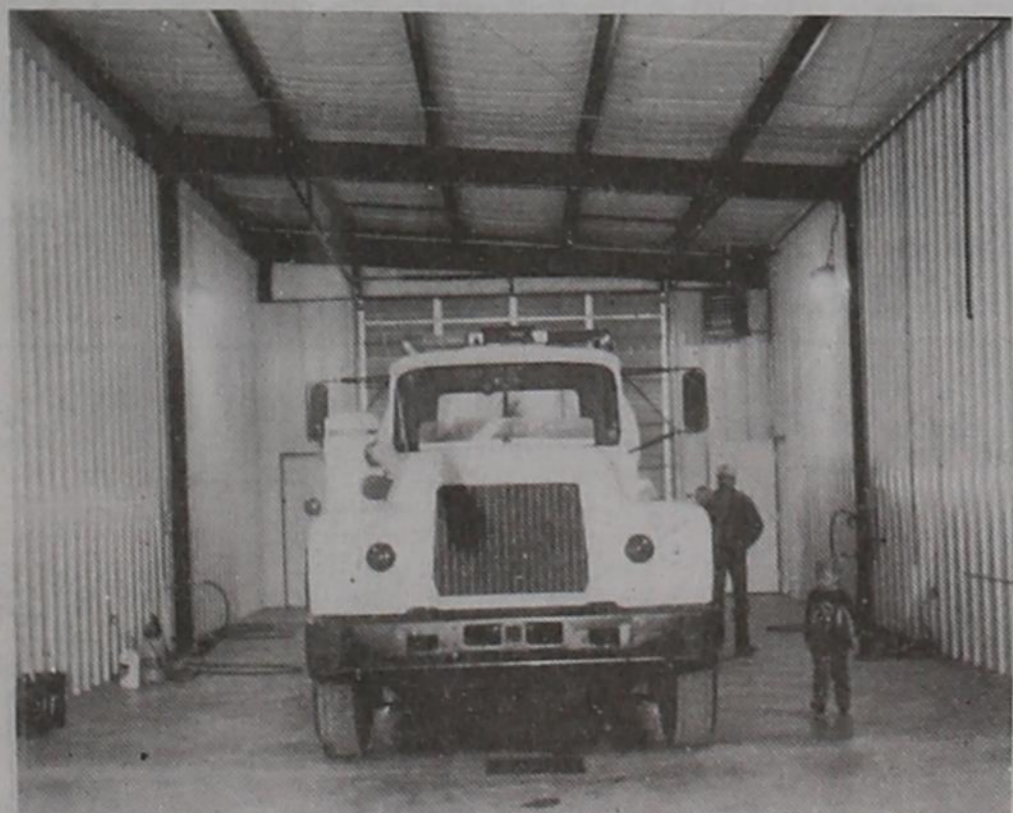
"This is the type of service that the truckers were needing in this area," Jamie said. "This stretch of highway carries almost as many big trucks as I-40 and sometimes more on any given day and they needed a place to wash their trucks and trailers."

Texico moves ahead on cleanup

Texico's cleanup is moving ahead.

At Tuesday's City Council meeting, Fire Chief Lewis Cooper reported that two vacant buildings are being torn down and will be carted to the dump.

City marshal Gil Holguin said that four persons cited in January for trash or junked vehicles had until March 1 to comply. As of Tuesday, they hadn't, and Holguin expects to haul them back into municipal court. The first time these folks were there, Judge George Herington had given them five weeks to comply.

And city councilman Oran Jay Autrey reported on a problem involving two brothers. One, he said, put junk on the other's property. Both have been cited. Autrey said two other brothers also may be involved.

In other business, the council:

- Agreed to hire Texico 4-H'ers to do maintenance work at the cemetery, such as mowing, painting and moving dirt.

- Heard that power was turned off in town Sunday after a valve at the Tower water well went bad. Currently, KKR well is the only water well functioning.

- Heard Holguin report that a traffic assessment will be done in Texico.

- Had a lengthy discussion, which ended with the council going into executive session for further talks, about a Texico marshal's badge.

Holguin said that Gordon Travis, Spur Restaurant owner, bought the specially-made badge, from the early 1990s, at a gun show. Holguin confiscated the badge from Travis because he felt it was stolen property which eventually turned up at the gun show. The city is the badge's owner, said Holguin.

In the early 1990s, several items from the marshal's office were reported missing. This also was the time when one marshal's house burned down.

Holguin said Travis felt this was unfair and wants the badge back. Holguin said the city should keep it, noting "How can we control the future of how the badge is used?"

For the time being, the city is keeping the badge.

Farwell gets 'Resusci Anne'

The Farwell Fire Department hopes to train local folks on what to do when a person has a heart attack.

The training program was enhanced Feb. 21 when the National Automobile Charitable Foundation and the Texas Automobile Dealers Association presented a Resusci Anne training unit to Farwell.

In receiving the CPR unit, which is essential for cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, Joe Haseloff, Farwell EMTI and training officer, said, "If the right kind of treatment can be given a heart attack victim within seconds after he or she is stricken, chances are good that the life can be saved. CPR training teaches a person how to keep the heart beating while professional help is coming."

Larry Murphy, regional manager of the Texas Automobile Dealers Association, who made the presentation, said that since the massive involvement of Americans in CPR, there has been an increase in long-term survivors from ventricular fibrillation. There are many cases where the training is given to citizens showing that many heart attack victims who otherwise die have been saved and returned to normal activities. The training takes from three to five hours of intensive practice and lectures.

The CPR unit gives signals telling when the trainee is applying the right pressure in the right spot or breathing correctly into the victim's mouth. With the training, the students learn the "feel" of giving quick, lifesaving emergency treatment.

Local schools gain savings

Farwell and Lazbuddie school districts have been recognized by the North Texas Educational Insurance Association at its annual meeting in Austin.

The association consists of 121 participating school districts in northern and central Texas. It's a member of a partially self-funded workers' compensation program.

Farwell and Lazbuddie were Diamond award recipients with the actual losses from employee accidents equaling less than 10 percent of the fund set aside by the districts for claims expenses.

The actual savings to Lazbuddie was \$13,557. The actual savings to Farwell was \$22,999.

Parmer County picks bank depository

The Parmer County Commissioners Monday picked a bank depository for county funds for the next two years.

For the past several years, the funds had been placed at Friona State Bank.

On Monday, there were three bidders: Friona State Bank, the First State Bank of Muleshoe - Bovina branch, and the Muleshoe State Bank - Farwell branch.

The commissioners unanimously awarded the contract to the Farwell branch of Muleshoe State Bank, which offered what the commissioners considered as the highest interest rate to them.

The term "considered" is used because the banks offered rates based on different dealings.

Also, Friona State Bank objected to language in the proposed contract which would allow funds to be removed from the bank for, as an example, TexPool, the statewide investment service set up by the state government.

In its proposal, Friona State Bank crossed out the paragraph dealing with that language.

In other business, the commissioners:

- Discussed insurance renewals.

- Accepted a rate hike from BFI for trash pickups. The county has three containers that BFI handles - one at Bovina and two at Friona.

Farm Credit Bank reports loan volume growth

Farm Credit Bank of Texas the ag lending co-op that includes 48 Federal Land Bank Associations, reports loan volume for the bank and associations grew by nearly \$37

million in 1994, ending the year at \$3.66 billion.

Although the district experienced a decrease in cattle loans as livestock prices fell through the year, the decline was offset by healthy increases in crop-related loan business and new mortgage rates.

Chief Executive Officer Arnold Henson said:

"The growth in performing loan volume is a tribute to the district's ability to maintain competitive interest rates, in spite of six rate increases by the Federal Reserve during the year ... The most significant impact on loan volume last year, however, was the \$36 million decline in nonaccrual loans. For several years, one of our top priorities has been to reduce high-risk loans because of their adverse impact on the rates we charge other borrowers. Last year, we saw the culmination of several years' work really pay off."

Net income totalled \$66 million for the year, compared to \$84 million a year earlier. The decline primarily was the result of rising interest rates which tightened the gap between the district's cost of debt and its return on loans.

March is National Poison Prevention Month

It's been 34 years since law was enacted designating the third week of March as National Poison Prevention Week.

In 1972, the National Center for Health Statistics noted that the number of deaths reported due to household chemicals in children was 216. In 1990, that number was 49 - a 77 percent decline.

Adults may jokingly comment that children can more easily open "child-resistant" containers than they can. However, the Consumer Product Safety Commission's act requiring child-resistant packaging on aspirin products reduced the number of deaths in children attributed to aspirin from 46 in 1972 to only 1 in 1990.

Child-resistant packaging should always be used properly. Products, such as over the counter and prescription medications, required to be in special packaging should never be transferred to other containers.

If you have trouble opening child-resistant containers, and have no small children in your home, just ask for "easy open" closures from your pharmacist.

On March 10, Mora takes on Eunice at 4:30 p.m. At 7:30 p.m., Texico and Santa Rosa go at it. The two winners will play for the regional title at 6:30 p.m. March 11. Advance tickets go on sale Monday. Ticket prices - set by the state - are \$4.50 for adults and \$3.50 for students. All three games require separate tickets.

Scoring against Eunice were: Pat Chumley, 14; Nathan Ketterling, 20; Tyrone Gooden, 7; Johnny Salinas, 2; and Ruben Escamilla, 13. Ketterling had 11 rebounds and Gooden 9. Escamilla had 5 assists and Chumley 4. Escamilla and Gooden had 3 steals each. Chumley hit 2 of 4 3-pointers. It was Texico all the way, as the Wolverines led by 4 at the end of the first quarter, then 9 at halftime. The Wolverines only had 9 turnovers.



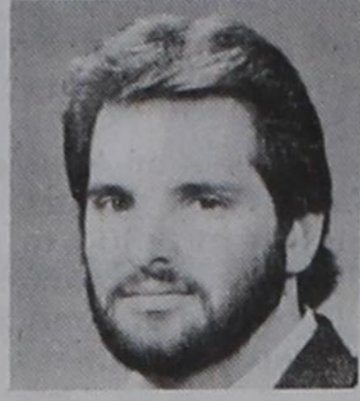
Here's some background on each:
