Even Dan Rostenkowski got whipped. What a shock! As an inveterate optimist, I always hope for folks to express their views at the ballot box. More often than not I'm disappointed. But not this go-round.

Voters did what I was hoping for - giving our elected officials a message that Washington better straighten itself out - or out they go. Way to go, voters.

This was an amazing election. A political party doesn't make the gains it did except in times of despair, like in a war or a economic depression. It just doesn't happen.

But it did this year. I usually go on past performances when I make predictions, unless something unusual occurs. And that's what

Race for Parmer County District Clerk

Warren defeats Watkins

Sandra Warren was elected Parmer County District Clerk in the only contested race in Parmer County.

Warren, a Republican, defeated incumbent Marjorie Watkins, Democrat, 1,285 to 1,173. This is the first time a Republican has won an office in Parmer County since the 1970's.

A huge 64 percent of the registered voters in Parmer County turned out for the election. A total of 2,588 votes were cast out of a total registration of 4,031.

In Farwell, 462 votes (of 907 registered) were cast; plus 139 (of 220) in Oklahoma Lane and 217 (of 356) in Lazbuddie.

Parmer County officials who were re-elected without opposition were:

- Jack D. Young, a Democrat, District Judge, 287th Judicial District.
- Bonnie Clayton, Democrat, County Judge.
- Bonnie Warren, Democrat, County Clerk.
- Anne G. Norton, Democrat, County Treasurer.
- Raymond McGehee, Democrat, County Commissioner, Precinct No. 4.

In the statewide races, George W. Bush, Republican, beat incumbent Democrat Ann Richards for the Governors' seat. In Parmer County, Bush received 1,726 votes, while Richards received 794 votes.

Kay Bailey Hutchison, Republican incumbent candidate for U.S. Senator, defeated challenger, Richard Fisher, Democrat. She received 2,040 votes from Parmer County. Fisher received 422 votes.

Larry Combest ran unopposed for the U.S. Representative, District 19 seat.

Democrat Bob Bullock defeated Republican challenger for Lieutenant Governor, 1,400 to 1,016 Parmer County votes.

There was a close race between incumbent Attorney General, Dan Morales (D) and Don Wittig, Republican with

Roberts re-elected representative

Earlene Roberts, a Republican, won her second term as the state representative from District 66, including Texico. She defeated Democrat Travis Foster, 4,060 to 2,358.

And Anna Crook, a Republican, won the post of state representative from District 64, including Pleasant Hill. She defeated Democrat Tom Hartley, 4,264 to 2,468. This post had been held by Blake Curtis, a Republican.

Margie Crooks, a Texico resident, won the Curry County assessor's race.

Texico's precinct had 235 voters. The two Pleasant Hill precincts totaled 96 voters.

For his feat, Copeland won the first place cash prize of \$10.

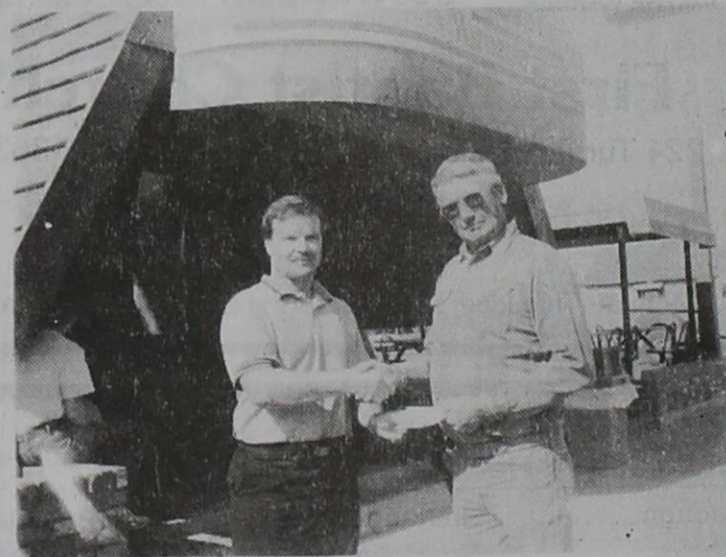

Tharp asks D.A. for investigation

Mayor Butch Tharp said at Tuesday's Texico City Council meeting that a letter will be sent this week to the Curry County District Attorney's office asking for an investigation of threats made against him and animal control officer Dan Walterscheid.

Some Texico residents haven't been happy with how Walterscheid has been carrying out his duties.

Tharp said two weeks ago that Texico residents had gone to Walterscheid's home in Farwell - 3 at one time and 3 again later - to cuss him and make verbal threats, some in front of his children. And Tharp said he has been called on the phone and threatened.

Tharp immediately contacted the District Attorney's office. He did not want the Texico marshal's office involved due to possible conflict of interest, since he, as mayor, is their boss.

D.A. Randall Harris told the Tribune at that time that he needed a written letter from Tharp before he could proceed with an investigation. Upon receipt of such a letter, Harris said he would assign state investigators.

Walterscheid has been active in picking up dogs running loose, nabbing an estimated 57 dogs in his first 3 months on the job.

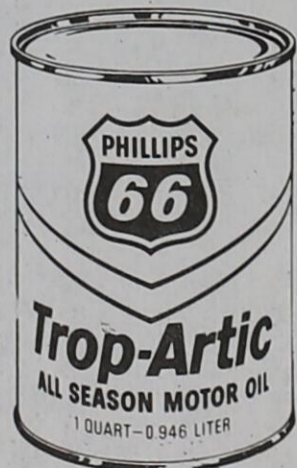

only a 12 vote difference in Parmer County. Morales received 1,152 votes and Wittig received 1,140 votes.

In the race for Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, Democrat John Sharp defeated Republican, Teresa Doggett. In Parmer County, Sharp received 1,184 votes over Doggett's 1,122.

Incumbent State Treasurer, Martha Whitehead, Democrat defeated Republican, David Hartman. Whitehead only received 872 votes in Parmer County. Hartman received more votes with 1,405 within the county. Hartman also received more votes throughout the South Plains region.

Marta Greytok, Republican challenger to Democrat incumbent Gary Mauro lost her bid for the Commissioner of the General Land Office. Mauro won the state's total votes. However, Greytok received more votes in Parmer County - 1,279 to 975.

Rick Perry, Republican incumbent Commissioner of Agriculture, easily won back the office over Democrat challenger Marvin Gregory. Within Parmer County, Perry received 1,880 votes over Gregory's 462 votes.

The race for Railroad Commissioner was turning out to be a close one between Democrat Jim Nugent and Republican Charles Matthews. As of this writing, both had received 49% of the statewide voting. In Parmer County, Matthews won with 1,260 votes over Nugent's 757 votes.

Carole Keeton Rylander, Republican, defeated Democrat, Mary Scott Nabers for the office of Railroad Commissioner, unexpired term. In the county, Rylander received 1,394 votes. Nabers received 807.

Democrat Raul Gonzales defeated Libertarian John Hawley for the Justice, Supreme Court, Place 1 seat with 1,230 votes.

Justice, Supreme Court, Place 2 was won by Republican Nathan Hecht over Democrat challenger, Alice Oliver Parrott. Parmer County votes were 1,554 for Hecht and 679 for Parrott.

Republican Priscilla Owen defeated Democrat Jimmy Carroll for the Justice, Supreme Court, Place 3 seat. Owen received 1,471 votes in the county, while Carroll received 772 votes.

Mike McCormick, Democrat, ran unopposed for the Presiding Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals.

Republican Steve Mansfield won Parmer County's vote for Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 1 with 1,377 votes over Democrat challenger Charles Campbell, who received 722 votes.

Sharon Keller, Republican, received 1,370 Parmer County votes for the Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 2 position. Her challenger, Betty Marshall, Democrat, received 720 votes within the county.

Monte Hasie received 1,626 votes for the State Board of Education, District 15.

Teel Bivins received 1,823 votes within the county for State Senator, District 31. He was unopposed for re-election. State Rep. Pete Laney received 1,506 votes in the county. He was unopposed for re-election.

John T. Boyd received 1,360 votes in Parmer County for Justice, 7th Court of Appeals, District, Place 1.

Republican Bryan Quinn received 1,152 votes over his Democrat incumbent H. Bryan Poff, Jr. for the Justice, 7th Court of Appeals, District, Place 2.

Gilbert had a good carry up the middle for 7 yards. Texico was held and punted. Jal moved the ball, scoring on a 19-yard run. The kick made it 7-0.

Barba returned the ensuing kick 46 yards. Runs by Gilbert and Barba brought a first down. Barba kept for 8. A penalty put Texico back, and Jal intercepted a pass. Hamilton, Escamilla and Kip Taylor had tackles. Hamilton had a QB hurry. Texico picked up a roughing penalty, which helped Jal. Gilbert, Barba and Bobby Russell had good tackles, as did Escamilla and Salinas. But Jal scored on a 3 yard run in the second quarter. The kick failed and Jal led 13-0.

On offense, Gilbert returned the kick to the 33. Barba rushed for good yardage but Texico was forced to punt. Josh

Jorde and Salinas had tackles, as did Russell, Jenkins and Luciano. Hutchins had a QB sack. Mel Askew had a good tackle.

Texico got the ball back with 2 minutes left in the first half. Barba hit Drager with a pass. A penalty hurt, and Texico punted. Russell broke up a long Jal pass. The half ended with a good tackle by Jenkins and Barba.

Texico kicked off to open the second half, down only 13-0. Barba and Salinas had big tackles, as did Jenkins and Hutchins. Jal went for it on 4th and 10, completing an 11-yard pass. Taylor and Hamilton combined on an excellent tackle. But Jal moved the ball through the air, culminating in a 2-yard TD run, going up 19-0. Jal scored again, with the third quarter ending at 25-0.

Gilbert returned the kick to the 32. Drager caught a pass at midfield from Barba. Jal intercepted, running the ball back 50 yards for a TD. The run for extra points failed, with Taylor, Jenkins and Russell on the tackle. Jal now was up 31-0.

Texico was stopped on offense and Jal took over at the 42. A good tackle by Gilbert helped stop Jal and Texico took over the ball. Texico was held, and punted, with Gilbert making the tackle.

Salinas caught a long pass from Barba, good for a 40-yard gain. Barba ran for a first down on a QB keeper. Texico continued driving the ball downfield, with Gilbert bulling over from the 1 for the Texico TD. A pass from Barba to Drager brought another 2 points.

Jal was able to score one more time, making the final score 38-8.

But Texico kept punching away. Tobie Askew threw a halfback pass to Jenkins for 12 yards. Drager had a good run.

The final score didn't do justice to how well the Texico players fought. They made several good plays. And several freshmen got playing time, doing a good job.

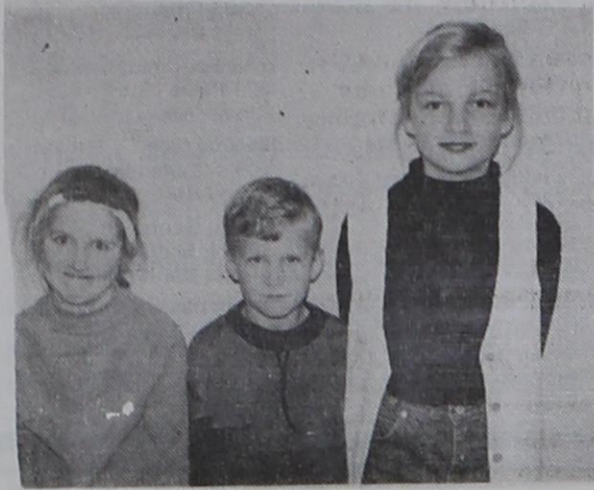

Changes in water policy will be necessary here

Below average precipitation during the past three years has caused some Parmer County residents to wonder if both agricultural and urban water use practices should be re-evaluated in order to maximize efficiency.

"As a result of the drought conditions during the past three years, heavier-than-normal pumpage by agricultural and urban users has increased the rate of decline in the water table. This has caused above-average decreases in well yields during the pumping season in some parts of the county," says A. Wayne Wyatt, General Manager of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 in Lubbock. "It is during times of drought that people stop and wonder if more can be done to achieve maximum water use efficiency."

The volume of ground water in storage within the Ogallala Aquifer in Parmer County was calculated at 10.62 million acre-feet in 1990. The net depletion of the ground water in the county from 1990 to 2000 was expected to be about 1.64 million acre-feet, or 164,000 acre-feet per year, based upon previous water use trends.

However, because of the drought, the amount of net depletion may be greater than previously expected due to the extra pumpage and lack of precipitation for aquifer recharge.

At a recent meeting of the Water District's Parmer County Committee, it was concluded that changes in water use practices must be made if residents in the county are going to have enough water to continue to maintain a profitable economy.

- The five member committee concluded that:
- Efforts need to be made to ensure maximum use of every drop of precipitation that falls within the county.
 - Irrigation practices should be re-evaluated to determine if water losses can be further reduced or eliminated. For example, producers can convert their partial dropline center pivot sprinkler to a Low Energy Precision Application (LEPA) pivot and cut water losses by 15 percent.
 - Water losses resulting from irrigation tailwater escaping fields must be eliminated.
 - Producers should consider planting lower water-use crops.
 - Producers should try to achieve the most profitable crop yield per inch of water pump, rather than irrigating for maximum crop yield.

Recent research in precipitation enhancement should be evaluated to determine if such a program could be implemented within the county or region to increase precipitation.

In addition, the County Committee indicated that homeowners, business owners and industries should share in the water conservation effort.

- Industry should reuse water whenever possible.
- Low-flow showerheads, low-flow lavatory faucets, flow restrictors, low-flush toilets and other water conservation bathroom fixtures should be installed in homes, schools and apartment complexes within the county.
- Urban irrigation systems should be designed for maximum efficiency.
- Drought tolerant, native vegetation should be used whenever possible in yards.

Representatives from each of the 15 County Committees of the Water District plan to meet as a group in early January 1995 to determine a plan of action to maximize water use efficiency to counteract the problems brought on by the drought conditions.

"Parmer County residents have made tremendous progress in improving their irrigation efficiency during the past 10 years," says Wyatt. "In 1993, a survey by the Water District found 1,258 center pivot irrigation systems in operation within the county. Based upon the reported irrigated acreage in Parmer County, approximately 73.6 percent of the county was being irrigated with center pivot sprinkler systems."

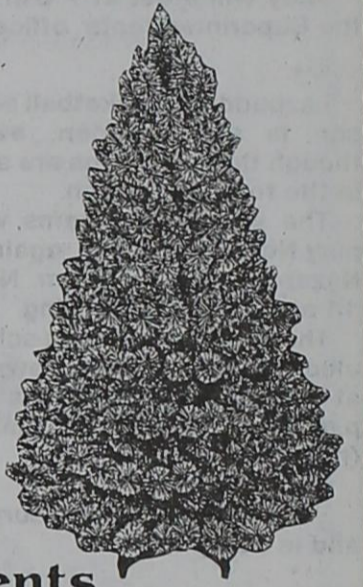

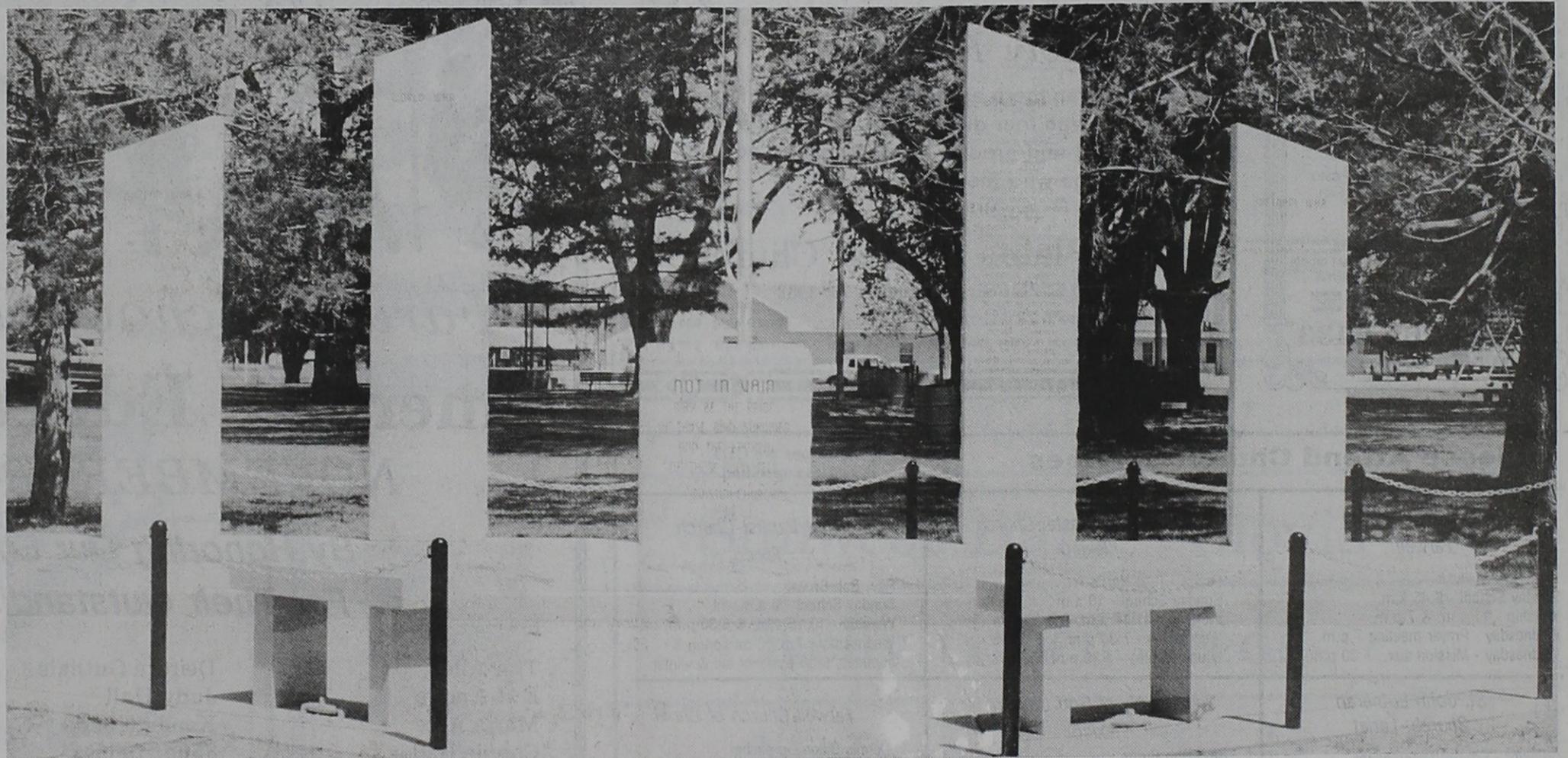

Pre-plant soil moisture survey to be taken

The High Plains Underground Water Conservation District 1 and the Soil Conservation Service will soon begin the 1994 pre-plant soil moisture survey in Parmer County, and they expect to find the soil profiles almost depleted of moisture.

To increase moisture in the soil profile, producers need to capitalize on every drop of precipitation that falls between now and planting time next spring. One way to do this is with furrow dikes, research shows.

The National Weather Service reports that the Friona station recorded 19.50 inches of precipitation in 1993, and 14.96 inches through September 1994. These totals are about 2.71 inches below average for 1993, and about 0.37 of an inch below average for the 9-month period in 1994.

Unfortunately, most of Parmer County didn't receive near these amounts for either year. The 68-year average annual precipitation for the Friona weather reporting station is 16.79 inches.

The 1993 pre-plant soil moisture survey revealed only 4 to 6 inches of soil moisture in storage in the top five feet of the soil in Parmer County. Based on the 1993 survey results, 4 to 6 inches of water was needed to bring the soil to field capacity prior to planting.

The 1994 survey will be conducted before the first of the year, and soil moisture conditions are expected to be similar to the 1993 survey.

Lazbuddie School Board discusses back taxes

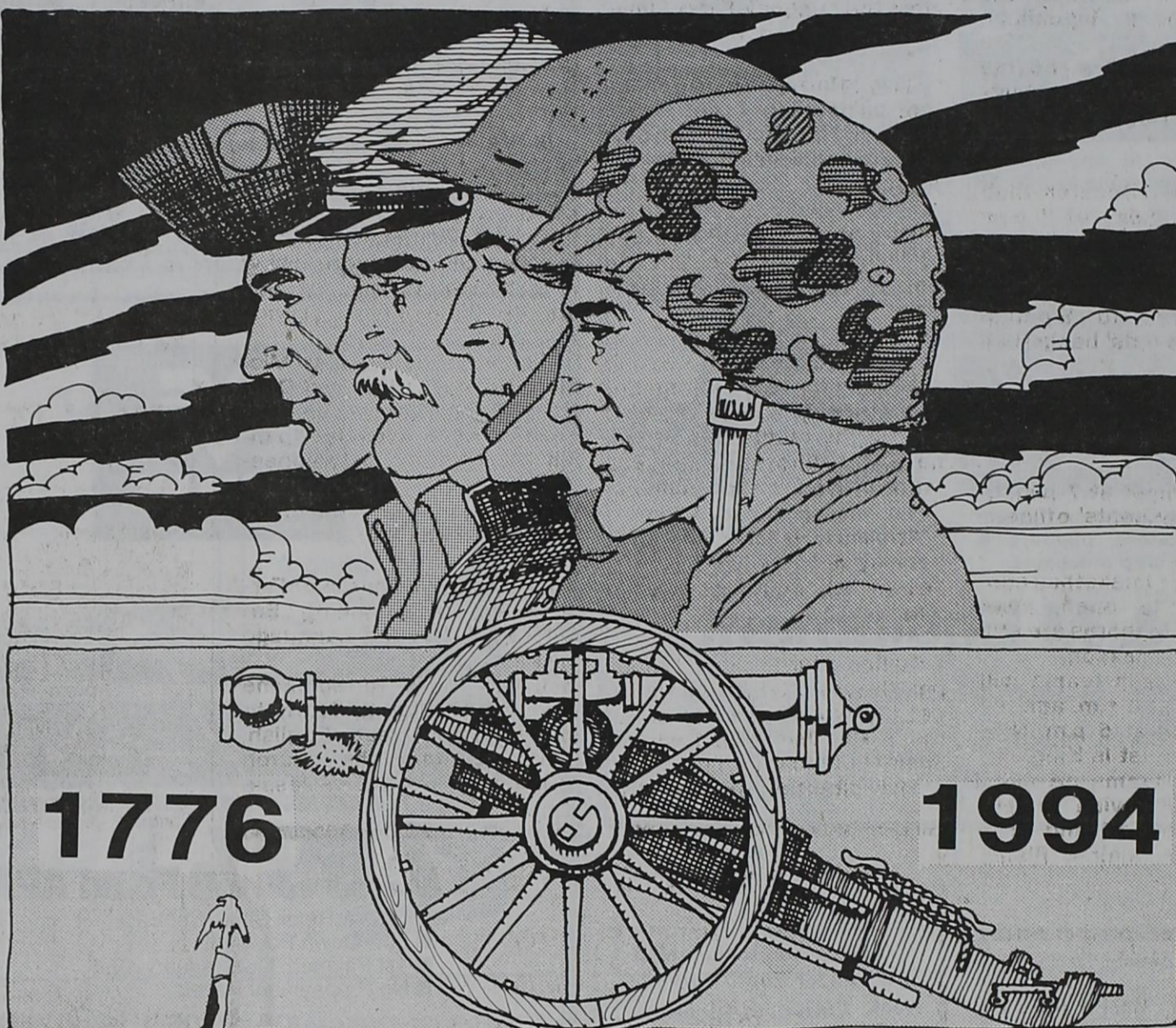
The Lazbuddie School Board Tuesday met with Wiley Bullock, of Lubbock, to discuss back taxes he owes.
