What may have been a tornado struck 3 miles east of Lazbuddie early this morning, causing damage at Easter Grain.

Mary Friemel, who lives at the house at Easter Grain, said it hit about 2 a.m. and shook their house, causing an electrical outage.

She said a lot of damage was done where the tanks are. Two tanks were lifted off the foundation. One was crumpled up. The other was thrown into another tank.

Two long sprinklers flipped over.

Nobody was injured.

The Lazbuddie, Lariat and Oklahoma Lane areas received some much needed rain Tuesday night.

Sherley-Anderson in Lariat reported 1.10" and Sherley-Anderson Pitman in Farwell reported .30.

The major portion of the rain fell in the northern sections of Lazbuddie. Although Sherley-Anderson Lazbuddie only reported a .10 of rain, there are reports of 2 to 3 inches of rain in the area to the north of the elevator.

Some Oklahoma Lane residents reported high winds and pea to marble size hail.

## Miller sets state record in pole vault

Lazbuddie's Jon Colby Miller has set a record for Class 1A in Texas in the pole vault.

Miller won the state title last Friday with a vault of 16'9.

The Lazbuddie senior will attend the University of Kansas on an athletic scholarship.

This was especially sweet for Miller because he didn't get a chance to compete at state last year. He was disqualified in the regionals after a misunderstanding with officials.

The 16'9 vault toppled the old record of 15'6, set last spring by a Sudan athlete.

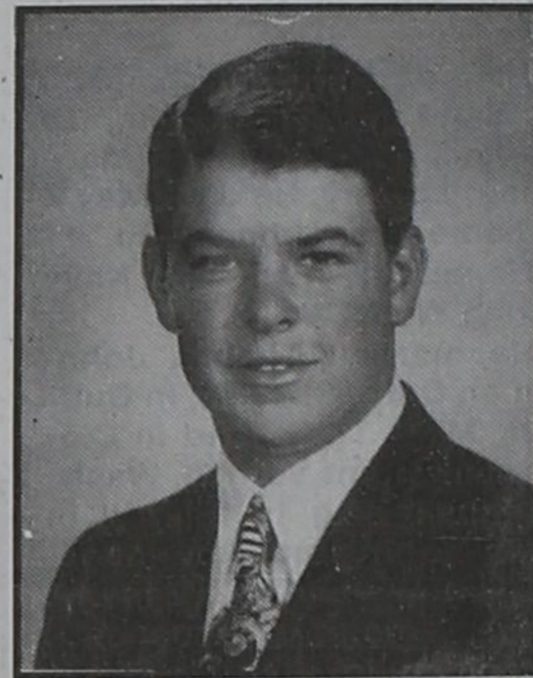

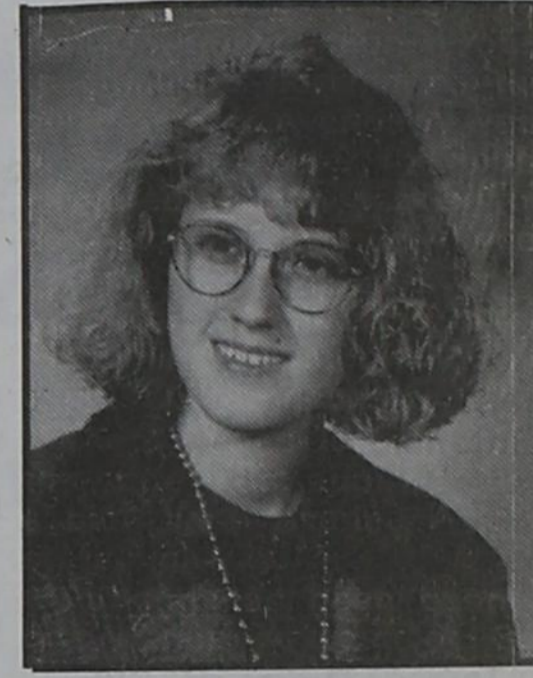

## 'No parking' ordinance tabled

Jimmie Mace was sworn in as mayor at Tuesday's Farwell City Council meeting.

At Mace's recommendation, the council voted 2-1 to table a proposed "no parking" ordinance for Avenue A (1st through 3rd streets) until they check with the state on its future plans for the state highway.

Voting for tabling were Ysleta Kittrell and Martin Kube. Opposed was Jerry Stover. John Carlson was absent when the vote was taken.

During the discussion, Kube said he opposed the proposed ordinance. Stover said he supported it.

Lee Hutchins, who has a warehouse building for his electrical business in the 100 block of Avenue A, spoke in opposition to the ordinance.

"I've read it and it's very vague and not the city's business. It's a state highway and (the proposed ordinance) condemns my property if I ever want to sell it," said Hutchins.

The topic of banning parking on Avenue A arose last winter when the council voted to eliminate parking on the north side of Avenue A west of 3rd Street. Later, the council voted to ban parking on both sides of Avenue A west of 3rd Street.

These actions were taken for what the council said were safety reasons.

Then it was learned that the state must approve such a ban since Avenue A is a state highway.

Parking has been banned on Avenue A east of 3rd Street since 1983.

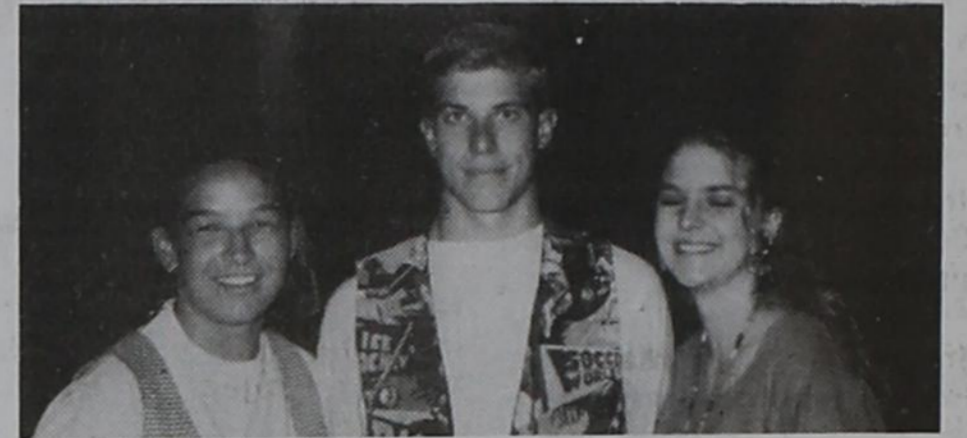

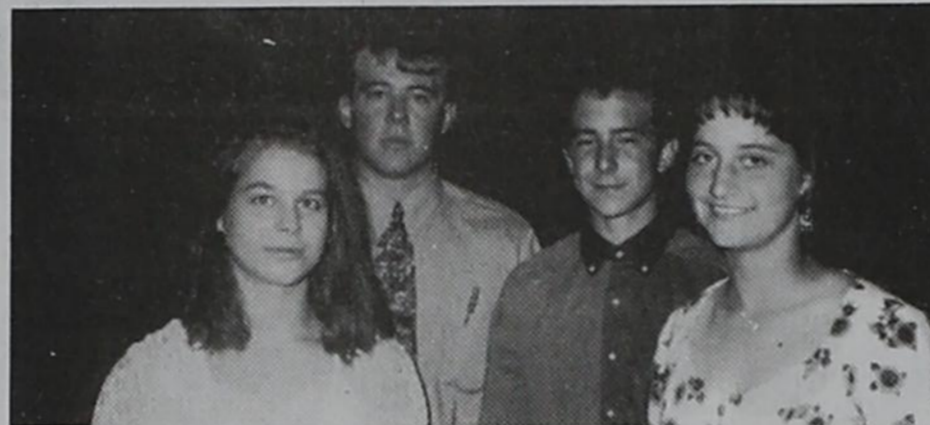
