Pioneer Gas Opens Split Stock Sales
Stockholders of Pioneer Corporation (NYSE) ap-
proved today a two-for-one split of the company's common stock.
The split becomes ef-
fective at the close of fective as the close of
busines today. Pioneer offficials said that certificates representing the in-
creased shares will be creased shares will be
mailed to stockholders amailed to stockholders a-
bout January 20. Pioneer's directors had earlier announced their intention to raise the quarterly divi. dend to 22 cents per split share from 40 cents per share before the split. The amendment to Pioneer's articles of incorporation providing for the tock split increased the authorized shares from 40 million to 80 million.
Shares outstanding will inShares outstanding will in18.6 million to 37.2 million. Approval also was given $t$ the special meeting of stockholders to an amended company stock option plan.

 Identification of the complex chemical that red imported ants lay down for trail identification may enable scientists to devise practical con-trols for this widespread ag. trols for this widespread ag.
ricultural and ubban pest. Scientists at Texas A\&M University first identified the
chemical compound fallofarchemical compound (allofar-
nesene, which is the chemical shorthand way of saying a yard-long name) and then succeeded in duplicating it in the laboratory.
Since its acc since its accidental in 1940, the imported fire ant,
Solenopsis invicta, has spread Solenopsis invicta, has spread
across half of Texas and most across half of Texas and most has become one of our most has become one of our most
serious pest control problems. The large size of the colonies, the aggressiveness of
individual individual ants, and the tendency of nest members to at-
tack and sting en masse makes this species potentially dangerous to humans and
