So, Santa
that routta Fe will add more tracks and more trains because business is literally exploding as is rail line. The rail freight Santa Fe do anything to help with the overpass project? Not! Will Texas Highway Department and/or New Mexico's Highway Department do anything more than lip service? Not likely.
Why has this very serious road hazard and traffic delay problem rated only back burner treatment for 70 or more years?

Mike. it's simply that no crescendo of "squeaky wheels" has been heard in Austin or Santa Fe, respective state capitols. The Santa Fe Railroad corporate offices have heard few "squeaky wheels" from Parmer and Curry counties.
