It's such a wonderful time for families to be together.

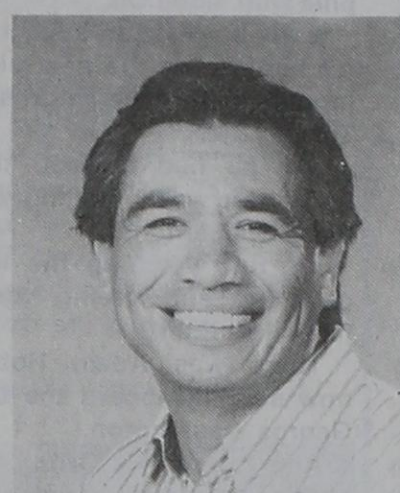

### With filing deadline nearing, still only one candidate

They're not exactly breaking down the doors to run for Farmer County governmental offices in 1996.

With the 6 p.m. Jan. 2 deadline a week away, only one candidate has filed with the Farmer County political chairmen:

-- Lowell Primrose, Oklahoma Lane, has filed on the Democratic ticket for county commissioner - Farwell area precinct.  
County Democrat Chairman

Bert Williams said Tuesday he planned to contact the incumbents who had said they planned to run, but haven't filed yet.

County Republican Chairman Teena Hughs, as of Tuesday, has had no candidates file.

On the ballot will be county sheriff, county attorney, county commissioner - Farwell precinct, county commissioner -- Friona precinct and county tax assessor-collector.

District Attorney Johnny Atkinson, a Democrat, has filed for re-election with state officials.

# Concealed weapons prohibited for courthouse, city park

The Parmer County Commissioners on Dec. 21 approved an order prohibiting concealed weapons from two areas:

- The Parmer County courthouse.
  - The adjacent county-owned park, commonly called the Farwell City Park.
- The order was in response

to the state's new law allowing some folks to carry concealed handguns.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Agreed to keep the CPA firm of Kirkland & Crozier, Farwell, to do the county audit for 1995.

-- Received two bids for a motor grader for Pct. 3, Farwell: West Texas Caterpillar bid \$128,958; Yellowhouse Machinery bid \$110,824. The West Texas bid was accepted.

-- Reviewed the 1995 volunteer fire department reports. Payments by the county are based on the number of calls.

Thus, payments in 1996 will be pro-rated according to the percentages of the 91 fire calls answered by the departments:

Farwell, 18; Bovina, 7; Lazbuddie, 19, and Friona, 47.

For a comparison, here are

the totals for 1994: Lazbuddie, 16 fire calls; Friona, 30; Farwell, 11, and Bovina, 9 -- for a total of 66.

-- Discussed a new lease agreement for the Parmer County Counseling / Central Plains MHMR office in Friona. It had been housed in the

Euler building on Main Street but that is being sold to attorney Byron Boyd.

The agency is looking to lease part of the building at 104 W. 7th St., owned by John Roden. It would cost the county about \$50 more a month.

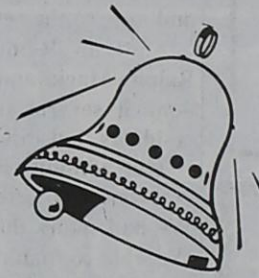

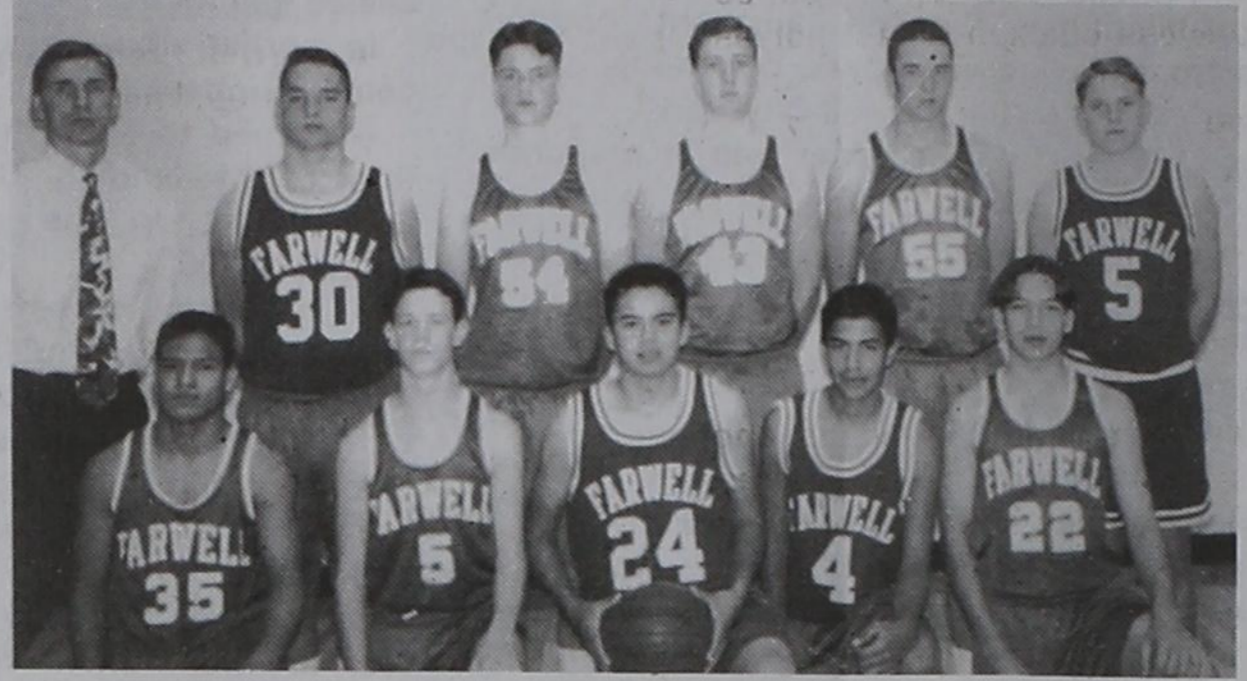

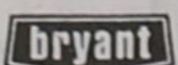

### Recipe of Week

#### Chicken with Cherry Sauce

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves (about 1 pound total)  
 Ground nutmeg  
 Salt and pepper  
 2 teaspoons cornstarch  
 1 teaspoon brown sugar  
 Dash pepper  
 1/2 cup unsweetened pineapple juice  
 1/3 cup chicken broth  
 1/4 cup dried cherries or golden raisins, chopped  
 Preheat on convention broil at 450 degrees for 5 minutes. Or preheat standard broiler. Meanwhile, rinse chicken; pat dry with paper towels. Sprinkle lightly with nutmeg, salt and pepper. Place chicken, boned side up, on the unheated broiler pan.  
 Convention broil for 7 to 10 minutes, or until chicken is tender and no longer pink, turning once. Or, standard broil 4 to 5 inches from the heat for 12 to 15 minutes, turning once.  
 Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, combine cornstarch, brown sugar and pepper; stir in pineapple juice and chicken broth. Cook and stir over medium heat until thickened and bubbly.  
 Stir in cherries. Cook and stir 2 minutes more. Serve sauce over chicken. Makes 4 servings.

He is scheduled to enter active service on Jan. 2 in Lubbock, then will go with his unit to Fort Benning, Ga.

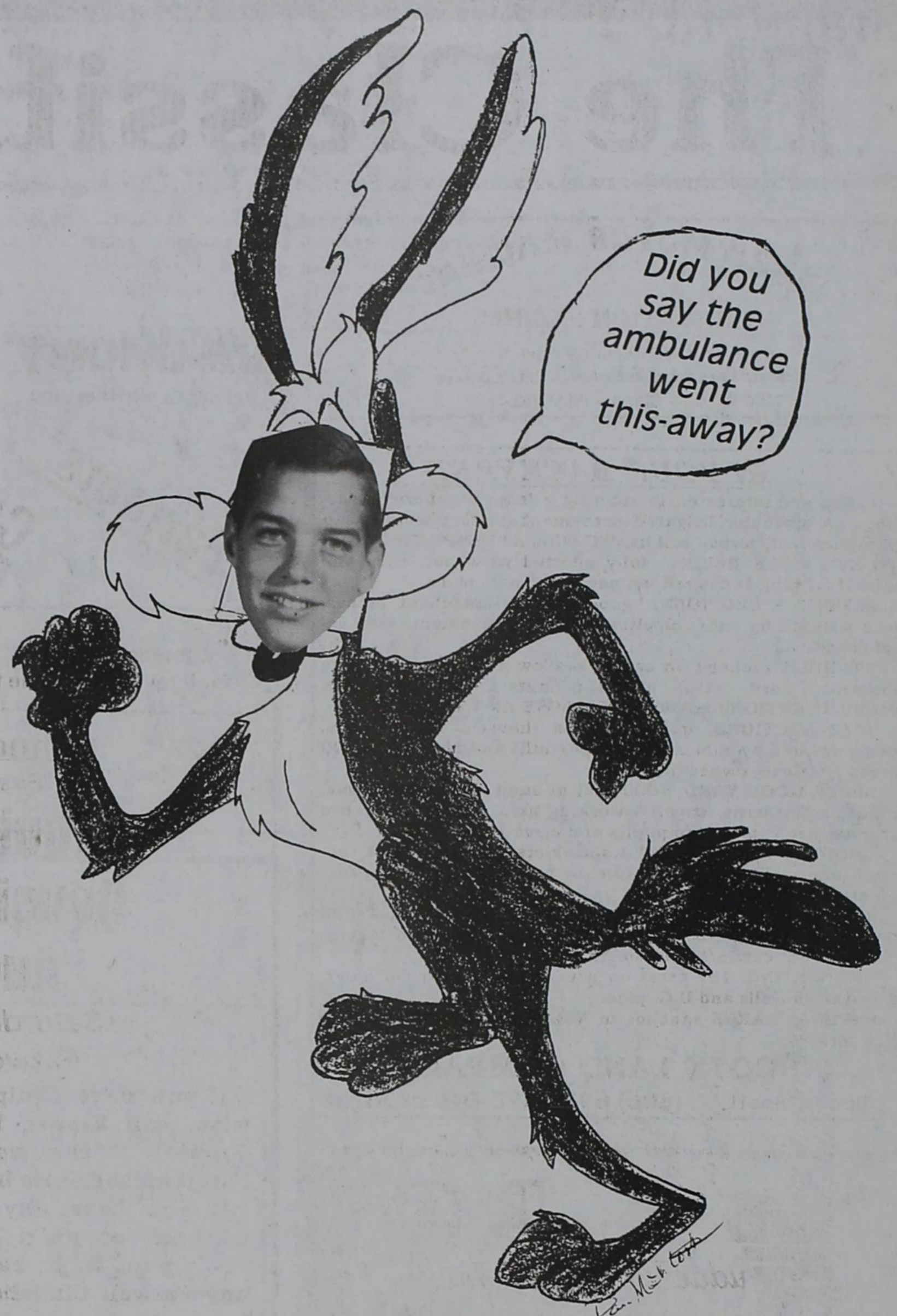
The unit then will be transferred overseas. Salguero doesn't know yet if the unit will be stationed in Germany or Bosnia. He will be on active duty an estimated nine months.

# Grain prices hammered cattle feeder prices this year

The outlook for 1996 indicates another challenging year, says Jim Gill, market director for the Texas Cattle Feeders Association.

"Feeder cattle supplies are still increasing, and with continued high grain prices, pressure will continue on feeder cattle prices," he said.

However, for consumers, Gill says 1996 will be another year of beef bargains at the meat counter. "The overall price of retail beef is the lowest it's been in five years. With record beef and poultry production predicted for 1996 and near record pork

production, it's likely that retail prices will continue trending downward in 1996," he said.

Grain prices, in particular, though have hammered feeder cattle prices this year. Due to a 1995 corn crop that was 27 percent less than last year, corn in the Texas Panhandle area started the year at \$4.70 per cwt. and ended the year at \$7.15 -- a 52 percent jump, said Gill. What's more, cattlemen can expect to see high corn prices through at least the first six months of 1996.

That translates to higher feedyard costs of grain and contin-

ued price pressure for feeder cattle. "A 650-lb. feeder steer in 1995 averaged near \$68.50 per cwt., 15 percent below the 1994 average of \$80.05," said Gill. "In 1996, prices will likely average in the low to mid \$60 range."

With feeder cattle supplies still rising, overall beef production will continue to rise, putting continued pressure on the fed cattle market, Gill predicted. "Beef production in 1996 will be near 25.8 billion pounds, 2.5 percent above the record production of 25.1 billion pounds in 1995."

Add the effect of competitive meats, and fed cattle prices will remain under pressure. "Pork production for 1996 is expected to be near 17.9 billion pounds, 1 percent below 1995. Meanwhile, total poultry production in 1996 will be near 32.2 billion pounds on a ready-to-cook basis, 3 percent above 1995 and yet another record."

For 1996, Gill predicts fed cattle prices will range from \$67 to \$70 cwt. in the first quarter; \$63 to \$67 in the second quarter; \$62 to \$65 in the third quarter, and \$66 to \$68 in the fourth quarter.

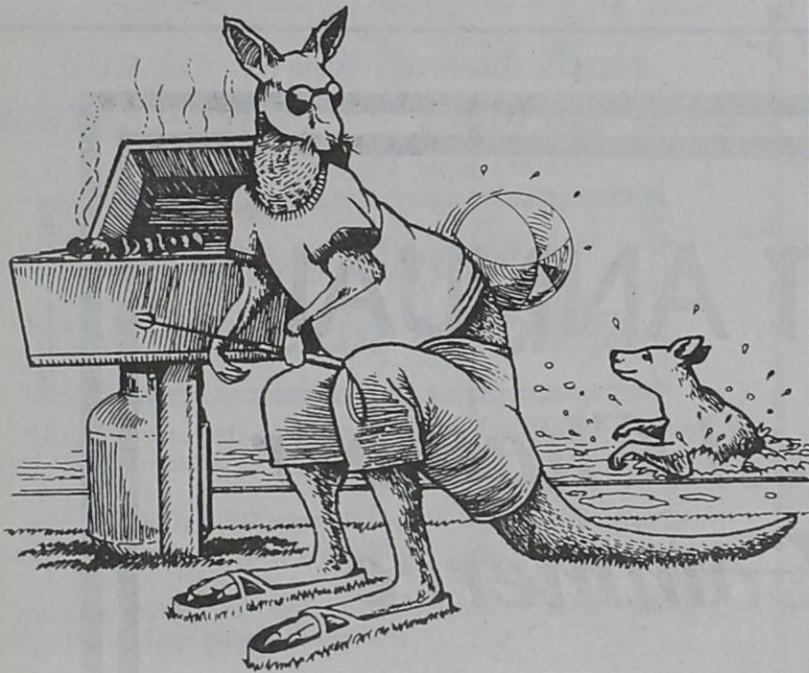
