

Year in review

Chelsi Woods was crowned Miss Border Town Days. The 29th annual BTB was well-attended, although the Twin Cities were in the midst of a hot spell, with temperatures routinely in the 100s.

August

Texico School Board approved a policy dealing with out-of-district students. Texico got the good news it would receive the \$100,000 from the state for its proposed community center. The funds had been withheld earlier. This gave Texico \$300,000 for the new center.

Farwell School Board hired Weldon Killough as high school counselor and Jon Cullison as ag teacher.

Lazbuddie School Board began work on a state grant of \$500,000 for facility improvements.

Friona officials requested the Parmer County Commissioners place a county annex in Friona. It was denied due to the need for additional funding at a time when the commissioners were making cutbacks.

A controversy began over the federal decision to place county ag offices at one site. Friona had the Soil Conservation Service office. Farwell had the Farmers Home Administration and Agricultural Stabilization & Conservation offices. State officials decided to have the three agencies locate in Farwell.

Farwell City Council began moving on city structures that were eyesores or caused liability problems.

Enrollments at Lazbuddie School were up, but down at Texico and Farwell.

September

Texico council discusses fixing Opal -- Hereford intersection

The Texico City Council on Tuesday met with city engineer Bob Lydick on plan to improve the intersection of Opal and Hereford, where a swale causes a standing water problem.

Lydick will return at a future council meeting with an estimate of the costs involved to fix the situation.

In other business, the council:

-- Heard TCA Cable manager Gordon Smith report on the rate hikes, which go into effect Feb. 1. This was the first rate change in three years, he said. A story is elsewhere in today's Tribune detailing the changes.

-- Was told that Audenago Estrada has not complied with his aesthetic review permit guidelines. The council had given him 10 days to comply after it was stated that he was out of compliance.

Since compliance wasn't made, the permit is revoked. Marshal Gil Holguin will now cite Estrada into municipal court.

-- Met with Raymond Tarango who has not received approval for an aesthetic review permit for his mobile home at State and Kindred although it's been in town for several months.

Tarango had been cited into municipal court.

Tarango told the council that he has put skirting

around the trailer and noted that he doesn't own the property it sits on.

City Attorney Marion Ty Rutter will talk with Tarango's attorney about the permit, then report back at the next meeting.

-- Heard Dave Walker, a representative of the Eastern Plains Council of Government, discuss rental housing.

-- Gave a go-ahead to Fire Chief Lewis Cooper to seek proposals on buying a Jaws of Life (hydraulic rescue equipment) for the Texico fire department.

The cost is estimated at over \$12,000. Cooper asked the council to pay it, and the fire department would reimburse the city at \$2,500 per year.

-- Heard that a member of the family of the lady who donated the piano to the community center would be taking it back. The council wants the piano removed.

-- Decided to have specifications written for possibly seeking bids for roof and ceiling repairs at the swimming pool building. The cost is expected to be about \$4,000.

-- Heard Mayor Butch Sharp recommend that a pager be bought for the public works department. It will be on the next meeting agenda.

-- Approved the 1996 holiday schedule.

-- Appointed the election judge and clerks for the 1996 elections -- Mae Stone, Sandy Autrey and Theodora Rojas.

-- Scheduled a public hearing on the CDBG application for 6 p.m. mst on Jan. 23 at City Hall. A fire substation will be sought and the community is asked to present their suggestions for civic improvements.

-- Agreed to participate in the annual street co-op project, where the state provides matching funds for street re-sealing work. Councilman Oran Jay Autrey will view the streets and recommend which will need repairs.

-- Heard Holguin report that a tree is overhanging the alley behind the 700 block of Lamar street that is causing a sight problem for motorists. He has been unable to locate the property owner so far but will keep working on it.

October

Parmer County Sheriff's Posse has its organizational meeting.

Lindsey Kittrell and Nathan Ketterling are named Texico Homecoming King & Queen.

Farwell Choir is organized by band director Pat Henry.

Guy Nickels and Kimberly Smith are named King and Queen at Lazbuddie Homecoming.

Red Ribbon Week activities are held at local schools.

Parmer County's DARE (drug education) program came into question when the county's DARE officer, Roy Smith, left the county sheriff's office and was hired by Friona police. Later, the county commissioners voted to continue funding the DARE program through the Friona police department.

November

Farwell Chamber of Commerce holds a special ceremony on Veterans Day at the Farwell City Park. This will be an annual affair.

Christmas on Parade is held in the Twin Cities at several businesses. It also features a candy-making contest and arts and crafts booths.

The Texico Lady Spikers won their regionals and finished third at state.

Farwell's football team finished second in district, making the state playoffs for the first time in five years. They lost in the state playoff opener to Shamrock.

Farwell Schools combined their Head Start and pre-kindergarten programs.

Hal Helton won the annual Area Merchants Football Contest by one point over J.R. Ivins.

December

All of Parmer County's incumbent office holders up for election in 1996 announced they would seek re-election.

Several Farwell businesses were hit by break-ins. Arrests were made.

Texico City Council attacked its delinquent water bill problem, adding penalties for late payments.

A site was donated for the Texico ag farm.

Annual Report for 1995

To The Citizens of The Surrounding Area

The Texico Fire and EMS calls for 1995 consisted of 100 ambulance calls and 39 fire calls. 24 men and women from the surrounding area volunteered over 171 hours of fire and EMS calls. Of that total, 140 hours were for ambulance calls and 31 hours were spent on fire calls.

The members of the Texico Volunteer Fire Department donated uncountable numerous hours of training, maintenance, paperwork, etc., toward the insurance ratings of the City of Texico. This department went from a Class 8 to a Class 5. The best rating you could obtain would be a Class 1.

This could help lower insurance premiums for property owners, and individuals could see as much as a 20% decrease in the cost of their premiums, according to Kyle Beckner of General Insurance Agency, 400 Pile, Suite 407, Clovis.

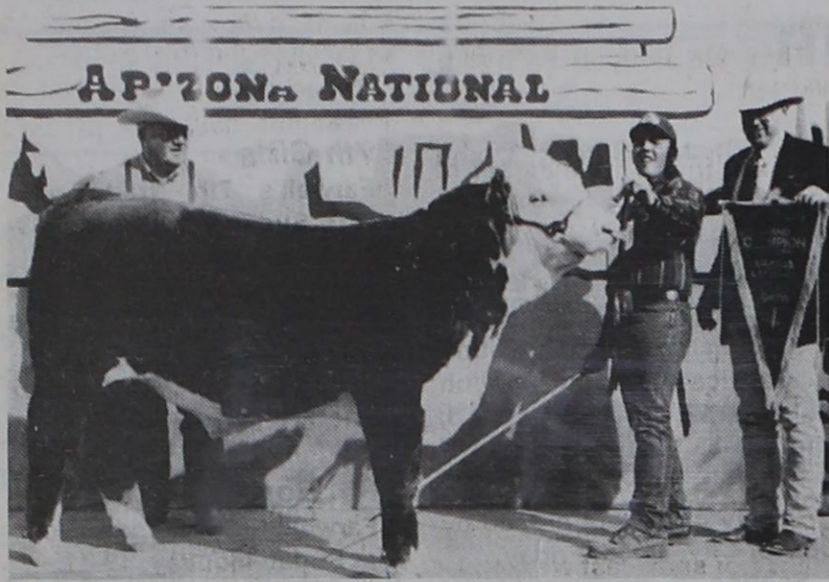
